Bonjour and welcome to BARC North Western Centre's Autos de France race meeting. The Gallic (yes, that is the correct spelling) themed event, is the centre's last event of the year.

Starting with the first of two races for the Centre's own CNC Heads Sports and Saloon Car Championship. Not so much French content on the grid, but certainly a definite "Jous de Vivre" around the paddock. The title will be decided today. So watch for plenty of action throughout the classes to see who comes out on top.

Following on is a grid of Citroen Saxos from the Junior Saloon Car Championship. The last Saxo rolled off the production line in 2008, before the drivers (aged 14 – 17) were born. But the easy handling "fusée de poche" (it's French for pocket rocket) has served for 11 years, providing entertaining racing and a "parfait" platform for the aspiring young guns. It will be "déjà vu" in the afternoon as the youngsters have a second race.

If you thought the Saxos were a throwback, the appearance of a phalanx (Greek not French) of the same company's iconic Deux Chevaux model looks positively prehistoric. For over 30 years the Classic 2CV Racing Club have been proving that some designs never go out of fashion and racing doesn't need speed to be competitive and entertaining. They also have two races today.

The Grand Prix D'Endurance of the day, is the one and a half times around the clock for the exotic cars of the Britcar Endurance Championship. Classes ranging from GT to TCR cars and all things similar make a spectacular 90 minutes of racing.

Last but not least on today's bill are two races for the cars of the Track Action Racing Club. The French are well represented with a class for Peugeot 206s and a mix of marques de Francais in the Tricolore Trophy. They are joined by the Britannia and Deutsche Marques Cup classes and the Nippon Challenge.

As this is the last BARC NW Centre event of the year, it would be remiss not to say "merci beaucoup" and pay hommage to all the Marshals, Medics, Officials, Recovery Operatives, Circuit Staff and anyone else I have missed, who despite the challenging circumstances this year has thrown up, have made it an outstanding success for the centre.





BRITCAR ENDURANCE CHAMPIONSHIP

BUSINESS END OF THE SEASON BECKONS FOR BRTICAR

We go into the penultimate round of the Championship on the glorious Cheshire parkland circuit with no clear favourite to take the coveted overall title

True, Asha Slva and Bobby Trundley have had a run lengthy run at the top of the points table, but their Cup class Team BRIT BMW M240i only sits seven points ahead of TCR leaders Rob Elllick and Fynn Jones in the TSR Performance Cupra, though they are possibly more vulnerable for having points taken away by a resurgent Ash Woodman in the EDF-run Gen 2 Cupra, while sitting third overall is the Challenge class Amspeed Porsche 991 of Dom Malone and Adam Smalley, 11 points off the overall lead, and a reasonable bet for an overall and class victory in this round; with a 97-point buffer over the nearest class contender, they are favourites to lift the class trophy at season's end, but that could depend on Amspeed stablemates Ash Muldoon and James Kellett, who have winning credentials. playing the team game.

There are no such large points gaps in other classes - early Ginetta class leader Nick Casey has had a run of ill fortune and been usurped by Datum team mates Marco Anastasi and Maurizio Sciglio, while in Trophy Chris Murphy's metronomic reliability in his Woodrow-run BMW E36 sees him 30 points ahead of stablemate Calum Bates' E46, with the unique Mazda RX8 of Jonny MacGregor / Josh Tomlinson close behind. The Raceworks Ginetta G56 of Chris Bingham and Michael Lyons has been a consistent frontrunner in the GT class, but only holds a slender lead over Martin Addison, who now boasts a new Aston Martin GT4, and Team BRIT youngsters Noah Cosby and Caleb McDuff's McLaren. With the hard-working family squad of Chris and Jamie Hayes in their Seat Supercopa now doing well too, the Cup class isn't guaranteed for Team BRIT, so, through most of the classes, it's all to play for.



After a full and exciting season we have finally arrived at the final two rounds of the Championship.

After our first meeting Chris Roberts in his BMW led the Championship, after Anglesey Paul Rotheroe had moved to the front, but reliability woes for Paul started at Donington and Simon Allaway in his Lotus Esprit took over and that has remained the situation until today.

Simon's nearest challenger is now Carl Bennett in his BMW M3. Carl has had impressive reliability throughout the season, which has put him in a position to clinch the title if Simon slips up. With third place Gary Wardle having to drop points if he scores today although he can catch Simon with dropped points he will fall back.

Cars from the top two classes will undoubtedly be challenging for the overall wins today. Favourite has to be Simon in the V8 Lotus Esprit with sponsor Ric Wood his main opposition in the class. Ric is currently entered in his Ford Capri GAA though what comes out from the trailer may be something quite different and maybe not even in Class A.

Simon's main challenge may then come from Class B which Bod Buckby leads in his Caterham 7. Others in the picture for class honours are Alek Modro in his Westfield Aero and past champion Jamie Cryer in his Ginetta G20.

Watch also for Paul Masters in his Westfield Widebody and the Darrian T90 of Welshman Deri Davies. Remember that in the final round double points are awarded so someone can accumulate a lot of points with a successful day (especially if they play their joker in the first race).

For the first time this season John Edwards-Parton has competition in Class C, Gary Warburton in his Mini Miglia will be taking the challenge to John in his Ford Fiesta.

Finally it is worth noting that the first CNC Heads race today is the 500th round of the Championship, the first being at Oulton Park on the 31st March 1984 when Bob Trotter won in his Ford Escort. You can find some more information regarding this elsewhere in this programme.

The BARC North Western Centre is currently planning next season, though this is at an early stage, the intention is to have a series of races much as this year visiting similar circuits.

500 NOT OUT FOR CNC HEADS SPORTS/SALOON CAR CHAMPIONSHIP

At the first round of the CNC Heads Sports and Saloon Championship today we in The BARC (North Western Centre) will be celebrating the 500th round of the Championship. Where did all the years go....

It was back in 1983 that the North Western Centre of the BARC was looking for something to take on to support its organisation of race meetings at Oulton Park. Previously the Centre had organised sprints, kart meetings, an annual autotest at New Brighton on Boxing Day and even sand racing at Formby/Southport (now that is an idea for a round of the Championship!). We identified that there were a significant number of modified sports and saloon cars sitting in garages across the North West as they had become surplus to the various championships of the day.

We started slowly with a series consisting of six rounds all at Oulton Park. At the end of the initial season the interest from the driver community had increased and we were granted full championship status and within four years we were running 12 rounds with full grids across the North of the country.

Over the first decade we worked with the drivers to fine tune the regulations both the technical and sporting aspects. The regulations soon became fairly fixed and have remained much the same to this day, the only changes have been to keep the regulations relevant to the type of car available to compete.

Over the years the support across the Championship has peaked and troughed, often for reasons unknown, but the organisers have kept a close eye on the situation and tweaked where necessary. The result of this close co-operation across all aspects of the Championship is that we have, and have had for many seasons, a friendly championship providing competitive racing for a wide range of cars (as long as they resemble those cars you see on the public road).

As the Championship got stronger we attracted sponsors and have had many over the years with our current sponsor being CNC Heads owned by regular competitor Ric Wood. He has, since 1988 started 179 races, not including the two rounds today. CNC Heads have been our sponsor for the last 18 seasons and with our current additional partner, CSP Car Service Packs we hope to continue well into the future.

JUNIOR SALOON CAR CHAMPIONSHIP

ONE POINT IN IT AS JSCC ARRIVES AT OULTON PARK

Oulton Park provides the setting for the penultimate round of the Junior Saloon Car Championship season and things couldn't be closer in the standings with the top two being separated by a single point.

Billed as one of the UK's leading one-make junior categories, the JSCC has been a proving ground for the next generation of teenager racers for more than a decade - and this year's field has underlined just how competitive the action can be.

Just one point is the difference between Josh Selvadorai and Wilf Butler at the summit of the leaderboard; with the talented duo having been the class of the field for a large portion of the campaign.

With the gloves expected to come off in the battle for supremacy, Selvadorai and Butler will both need to be mindful of Oliver Kerr, who sits in third. Sitting 16 points off the top of the standings, the second-year racer is very much in the title race and cannot be

discounted.

While the top three will be gunning for glory, each of them must take into consideration that a number of other drivers will be going all-out for silverware - and that could prove pivotal when it comes to totting up the points.

Ollie Smith is the series' leading rookie as it stands but Max Scharfeggar, Matthew Swatton and Louis Austin are all breathing down his neck. It sets up a captivating home stretch for Rookie Cup honours.

Elsewhere, Leon Holly and Sherrie-Ann Powell have punched in a number of impressive performances; as has the trio of Scholarship winner Martin Wright, 333 Motorsport's Lexie Powell and Tom Algar.

After making their debuts last time out at Snetterton, both Ben Ward and Jake Wardle will also be looking to make a step forward across Saturday's two contests.

TRACK ACTION REVVED UP FOR OULTON PARK ODYSSEY

After a two-month break, the Track Action Racing Club makes a welcome return to the grid this weekend with an ultracompetitive field that is primed for battle around the challenging International layout of Oulton Park.

The Deutsche Marques Cup is the first of several multi-marques categories that make up the grid, with this one being for those that have an interest in driving cars that have been manufactured in Germany.

Paul Roddison, a former winner of the coveted BARC President's Cup, has been one of the standout names in the category this season with his striking Skoda Octavia proving to be the perfect machine to ensure he is consistently in race-winning contention.

Both the Tricolore Trophy and the Peugeot 206 GTi Cup has had good representation this season and it will come as no surprise that this is where those wanting to hustle French-built machines will be competing over the course of Saturday's action.

Shaun Deacon and Lee Currie were some

of the lead protagonists last time out at Donington Park and both of them are expected to be in contention for honours if they choose to compete at the Cheshire venue.

Elsewhere, the Peugeot 206 GTi contingent of Andrew Mitchell, Noah Checkley, Jake Richardson, Matt Anderson and Martin Cayzer are always good value with a number of wheel-to-wheel battles perching fans on the edge of their seats.

Completing the Track Action field is the Nippon Challenge, the race series for modified and production spec Japanese and Asian cars.

The Honda Civic is usually the car of choice for this category and last time out it was the trio of Andy Wheatley, Lee Bull and Anthony Allitt that whipped the crowds into a frenzy as they diced for honours amongst themselves.

In what has been another vintage campaign for the one-make series, two races around the 2.69-mile International circuit are all that remains in deciding an exciting five-way shootout for championship honours.

Sitting in the box seat going into the finale is the experienced Nick Crispin. Despite boasting a resume that includes multiple wins and podiums, Crispin is yet to clinch the big prize however this is arguably his greatest opportunity to do just that.

Sebastian Jones-White is another driver gunning for a maiden title and after ending 2024 on a high, the fledgling star has had momentum on his side throughout this season. He arrives at Oulton Park trailing Crispin by 16 points.

Ethan Sparrow is another contender that can't be discounted either as he looks to follow in the footsteps of his multiple champion Uncle, Pete. The fifth driver to hold a mathematical chance at walking away as champion is the experienced Brian Heerey - who isn't to be overlooked.

Of course, while all eyes are expected to be on the lead quintet as they go wheel-to-wheel for supremacy, a number of other leading lights from the Classic 2CV Racing Club will be gunning to sign off their seasons on a high.

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(**Double Waved**) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit



YELLOW/RED STRIPES Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.


