3. PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:

Paddock access is restricted to McLaren employees, Series Staff and guests. All garages are for the use of McLaren.

4. PASSES:

Passes will be sent to you under separate cover, however this is a "closed" meeting and guests are by the invitation of McLaren with no admission to members of the general public.

5. SIGNING-ON:

Competitors will sign-on in Race Administration which is on the first floor of race control, accessed via stairway 4, between 16:00 and 16:30 on 12th October. All competitors must provide a valid International Competition licence.

Marshals will sign on in the double garage under race control in the national pits.

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6. NOTICE BOARD:

The official noticeboard is located at the foot of the Race Control building by stairway 4.

7. BRIEFINGS:

The Series briefing will take place at 16:30 on Friday 12th October on the Wing Auditorium.

8. NOISE POLLUTION:

Engines must not be run before 08:45 or after 18:30 on either day.

9. CIRCUIT ACCESS & EGRESS:

For practice and qualifying competitors will be released onto the circuit via the Pit Exit at the start of each session and similarly at the start of races where they will be released to go directly to stop on the grid. At the end of all practice, qualifying and races vehicles will take the flag, complete one slowing down lap, enter the pit lane making their way to the designated Parc Fermé.

10. LIVE SNATCH:

In the event that a vehicle needs to be moved trackside the Clerk of the Course has the option to carry out a "live snatch" under local yellow flags.

11: RESULTS:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions.

12. CIRCUIT & MEETING NOTES:

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track. Competitors, who experience mechanical problems, particularly if that problem is likely to be a hazard to others, must be stopped immediately in a place of safety. The competitor may also be liable for any excessive clean-up costs involved.

There are signal lights around the circuit and these lights have the same meaning as the flag signals.

Any person who is injured or feels unwell should seek help from the circuit medical services. Please contact an official or member of the venue management team.

13. MARSHALS MATTERS:

Marshals camping will be at Winterhills which is located behind the old marshals' campsite at Copse Outside. Access is through the main gate then drive round towards Copse past the new college building then through Gate 5 into the field. There is limited power hook up available on a first come first served basis. The campsite will open from 12pm on Friday and close 9am Monday.

Marshals will be given a breakfast roll at sign-on along with lunch each day and may use the café during all break periods. Cars may be taken to post via the perimeter road if then parked in a safe position.

Post allocations will be advised at sign-on but please remember you should not use mobile phones or cameras while on duty. If you are unable to attend please contact Paula Brown and return your passes to the BARC.



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14. SOCIAL MEDIA
