THE FINAL DAYS FOR THE BRITCAR ENDURANCE CHAMPIONSHIP

It's finals day for the Britcar Endurance Championship here at Donington Park, and both categories see the title race go down to the wire.

The inaugural championship for the Praga category reaches an exciting conclusion, and based on the results so far, could be a three-way fight for the crown. Currently topping the table is the pairing of "Chippy" Wesemael and Richard Morris, with 176 points on the board and three wins, while second- placed Richard Wells and Alex Kapadia have accrued 168 points, but have yet to grace the top step of the podium, despite pro-driver Kapadia frequently being the fastest driver on the track. Still in contention though. are well-matched Jack Fabby and Charlie Martin, lying third with 151 points; they lost their last win on a technicality, so will be out to prove a point at Donington, while action man Jay Morton has two wins to his name, and though not in contention for the title, is now paired with former "Stig" Ben Collins, so could affect the title aspirants.

It's even closer in the Endurance category, with three teams from three



different classes in contention for the crown, and with full points available for all of those classes, it will go down to the last race. The Class 1 pairing of Dave Scaramanga and Will Powell, in the Motus One McLaren GT3 top the table with 169 points and have three overall wins, while Class 3 leaders Marcus Fothergill and Dave Benett have accrued 166 points in their Porsche 991, ahead of Hugo Cook and Sacha Kakad, who have 162 points in their Class 4 Audi TCR. It's not just about those class leaders though - a good performance, a class win, for any number of Class 3 and 4 runners could upset the top order, with the Ferraris of Goddard/Hollings and Grimes/ Mowlem, the EDF Cupra, the Team BRIT Aston Martin, and Peter Erceg's Cayman all well-placed for a last-minute steal. We shouldn't rule out rule out some that aren't in the title hunt to queer the pitch with a good result either. The Fox Transport Nissan, the MacG Racing Taranis and the SG Racing Porsche have top-points potential.

GOING DOWN TO THE WIRE

The battle for the overall Britcar Endurance Trophy Championship will go down to the wire at Donington Park, with just 10 points separating the top three contenders. Topping the table with 293 points is Simon Baker's Class 1 BMW 1M, and with regular co-driver Kevin Clarke away, super-sub Andy Schulz stands a good chance to maintain the car's winning streak, while second-placed Richard Higgins, with 285 points in his Class 2 Porsche 996, needs to bag a pair of wins to stay in contention, being just two points ahead of Clio Class leaders Steve and Aaron Thompson. The status of these three is made fragile, though, by the need to drop a score, and by a number of runners not figuring in the title hunt, but with class-winning credentials; the Ginetta G56s of Mark Lee and Axel van Nederveen, the Peugeot 308s of Steve Rothery and Terry Stephens, and James Black in the Colburnrun Clio could all prevent the title protagonists from scoring top class points.

This final round promises to feature regulars, returnees and Invitation entries to form a record grid, and ones to watch could be the Johnny MacGregor / Josh Tomlinson Mazda RX8, the Team BRIT BMW 240 of Andy Tucker and Matty Steeet, the BMW E36 of Jas Sapra / Lucky Khera, and Kester Cook's Fiesta, while in Class 2 Adriano Medeiros subbing in Peter Spano's Ginetta G40 is a threat to win, and the Clio of Andy Mollison / Ryan Firth has potential. Whilst no Class 3 runners are in line for the overall title, class honours are at stake, with the Alfa Giulietta of Barry McMahon/ Paul Plant, the Ginetta G20 of Steve Griffiths/ Jamie Vinall-Mever, the Steve and Edward Cook Honda Civic, and the VW Golf of Mark Jones and Robert Taylor all in with a shot. The Clio class, too, will be competitive. the Westbourne Motors team will be fending off Darren Geeraerts, who has upped his game in the Spires Motorsport entry, and the Motus One car of Steve O'Brien and Matt Cherrington.



ONE HAND ON THE TITLE FOR CHARLIE

Charlie Hand sits on the cusp of title glory in the Junior Saloon Car Championship and all eyes will be on the series leader to see if he can wrap things up here at Donington Park this weekend.

On what has been a record-breaking year for one of the UK's premier junior categories, the Westbourne Motorsport driver will be eager to convert his 57-point advantage into an unassailable lead ahead of the season finale at Brands Hatch next month.

Having at times been in a league of his own during the course of the season, Hand - who is now in his third year competing in the JSCC - will undoubtedly be the driver to beat during the weekend's two scheduled contests.

Carrying a wave of momentum after clinching a sensational hat-trick of wins at Pembrey to take his victory tally for the year to 11 last time out, claiming even more silverware should be enough however he will need to be wary of the chasing pack. Harvey Caton remains the closest challenger to Hand and having chalked up a number of race wins throughout the year, the youngster is more than capable of making his mark at the front of the field.

Alfie Jeakins, Ruben Hage, Oliver Cottam and Aaron Walker round out the top six in the championship standings and any one of them could also stake their claim to standing on the top step of the podium.

Other notable names to look out for during this penultimate event of the year also includes the likes of Loui Hounsell, Ashley Gregory, Jamie Petters, Matthew Cripps, Harry Hickton and Tommy Gilham, amongst many others.



CLASSIC 2CV RACING CLUB POISED TO CLOSE OUT SEASON IN STYLE

The Classic 2CV Racing Club takes centre stage at Donington Park this weekend to bring the curtain down on what has been another captivating season.

Closing out the year - albeit somewhat later than it has done in the past - the much-loved series boasts a bumper entry list for the weekend's scheduled two contests and champions are set to be crowned.

Back in action after serving up an action-packed 24-hour race at Snetterton in late August, the one-make category arrives at the Leicestershire venue with much of the focus on former champion Pete Sparrow.

Holding a commanding lead at the summit of the standings, the multiple title winner sits on the cusp of regaining



the crown he lost last year having been perfection personified from the get-go.

Charging to a brace of victories at Cadwell Park, Brands Hatch and Mallory Park, Sparrow continued his sensational winning streak at Snetterton as he claimed 24-hour spoils and you wouldn't bet against him from taking a season-long clean sweep.

Nick Crispin and Kris Tovey round out

the top three and sit as the nearest challengers to Sparrow, both waiting in the wings if bad luck were to strike the series stalwart.

Elsewhere, the likes of David O'Keefe - who leads the way in the Seniors Cup - Sandro Proietti, Luca Proietti, Matthew Hollis, Martin Riman, Aubrey Brocklebank and Nick Roads will all be in the mix towards the sharp end of the grid too.

SONS OF F1 WORLD CHAMPIONS GO HEAD TO HEAD

Joining the Sports Prototype Cup grid at Donington will be Freddie Hunt and Mathias Lauda. The two sons of world champions will go head to head in 510hp/tonne Revolution A-Ones at the Leicestershire circuit on October 23rd.

The Sports Prototype Cup is the only race series in the world with an exclusive class for the innovative carbon-fibre 510hp/tonne Revolution A-One. Mathias and Freddie will drive cars that were recently used in the Cup's Italian Grand Prix support race at Monza, the scene of Niki Lauda's heroic comeback drive 45 years ago in James Hunt's championship-winning year. The two drivers have raced head to head before in championships such as the MRF Challenge in India and the NASCAR Whelen Euro series.



Their battle for glory in the two 30 minute races will be filmed for an upcoming documentary. More details on the international release of this film will be revealed later this year.

Other drivers to watch out for will be Road to Le Mans podium finisher, Marcello Marateotto, driving for his fellow Swiss-based Race Performance Team, and Chris Short, who took a podium finish at Silverstone earlier this year. The Cup is open to other similar prototypes and 750MC Bikesports race winners North Motorsport will make their Cup debut with Dave Watson piloting a Radical SR3.

The unique CTR-01 Honda from the father and son team of Richard and Matthew Chamberlain showed great speed at Silverstone in May and will be a podium challenger at Donington.

FASCINATING FINALE

While a couple of 2021 Champions may have been decided already there are still plenty of twists and turns expected as other class titles go down to the wire.

MINI MIGLIA

With two races still to go in the 14-round National Challenge, former BTCC champion Andrew Jordan can afford to tackle Donington with no pressure on his shoulders, having secured (on paper) the Miglia crown last time out at Pembrev in his first full season in the formula. Chasing him all the way has been Aaron Smith, overall winner for the past three seasons, with another double champion Rupert Deeth not far behind, and both will be aiming to secure the runner-up spot. Ben Colburn lies 4th in the standings and will be looking for his first win in the category having previously triumphed in Renault Clios and Historics, while other former champs who can be relied upon to run up front include Kane Astin and Endaf Owens, the latter having won five times this season despite missing two double-header meetings. Others who could well be in the mix for overall top-10 honours include Sam Summerhayes, Colin Peacock and Martin Wager who won on his Miglia debut more than three decades ago, and he is still considered a youngster!

MINI LIBRE

There is a 4-way contest for top honours in the semi-invitational class, although having taken the lead in the overall points standings with his 4th win on the trot last time out at Pembrey in his 7-port machine, Peter Crewes may not be present at Donington due to a prior engagement. If the 2017 title winner doesn't make the grid, then 2018/19 champion Phil Harvey may well take his third title as he sits just 2 points



shy of the leader in his 1380 5-port having scored a pair of victories this seasonj, although newcomer Les Stanton in a 1293 5-porter will be hoping his early season consistency returns to him close the gap after a run of DNFs dropped him to 3rd. Richard Colburn set the early season pace with three wins but has missed a few rounds in the same car he used to race as a 1293 Miglia 30 years ago, so realistically needs to win both remaining races with his main rivals falling by the wayside. Stranger things have happened!

MINI SE7EN

The UK's longest-running saloon car formula continues to hold back the ageing process, and now well into its 6th decade has produced one of the most compelling finishes to any championship. No less than six drivers are still in with a shout, and heading that list is Nick Croydon-Fowler who on his return to the category has found a strong vein of consistency with high finishes and a first win at Cadwell in July. He does though have to drop the highest number of scores from his final tally (only the best 11 results from 14 rounds can count) so may well fall short, Reigning S-Class champion Connor O'Brien moved up a class for 2021 and secured his maiden win in Se7ens last time out at Pembrey, but also has to shed lots of points, while reigning back-to-back Se7en champ Jeff Smith has probably the best

odds with a minimal drop tote having otherwise chalked up three victories and four 2nds, further boosted by half-a-dozen fastest lap-bonus points. A recent return to form has elevated 5th-placed Spencer Wanstall back into the reckoning, also picking up his first win of the season at Pembrey, and along with four-time winner Joe Thompson in 6th overall will only have to discard a minimally low total aswell. Although he missed the Pembrey event last month to prepare for the Goodwood Revival. veteran Jonathan Lewis could still snatch it if his rivals falter, and only has to drop a single point too, but a repeat of his 1980 title is probably a longshot. Another former champ Andrew Deviny sits 4th overall and if the maths won't allow him another title this time around he still has the racecraft to effect the final outcome.

MINI-7 S-CLASS

Whitewash is a rarely coined phrase in Mini racing circles, especially for a category that is aimed at the budget end of the series, but newcomer Michael Winkworth has done exactly that with 10 victories from 11 starts (plus 10 fastest lap points too) to comfortably secure the title. In his wake, teenager Ryan Taylor along with ex-karter Matthew Ayres and former 1.3i Mini frontrunner Damien Harrington are all vying for the runner-up position, only the latter and Neil Slark breaking Winkworth's run of maximum scores.



THE SUPERKART SEASON FINALE

Scene of the recent Motorsport UK British Superkart Grand Prix, the Superkarts are back in action this coming weekend at Donington Park for their season finale. They will be competing in the fourth round of the British Superkart Racing Club Super Series with all four classes lining up on a mixed grid of 60 entries. We should see some close racing throughout the field.

Heading the twin cylinder Division 1 class is multiple Superkart Champion and recent Grand Prix winner Lee Harpham. He won the opening race at Oulton Park in April and has had a string of second places in the Super Series, one at Oulton and three at Snetterton in May. At Silverstone in August, Lee struggled with the set up and could only bag a 5th and 6th which has reduced his series lead to 14 points. Four weeks ago, it all came good here at Donington. In a thrilling last corner move, he out braked Liam Morley and secured the GP plate which he is using this weekend. Can he add to that success and win the Super Series?

Liam Morley holds second place in the points table and is out for revenge after his defeat at the Grand Prix. He missed the opening rounds of the Super Series at Oulton Park in April as he was recovering from leg surgery. But he has bounced back with three



wins at Snetterton and two more at Silverstone, where he also set a new lap record and picked up the'0' plate. With dropped scores coming into play, Liam doesn't have to finish in front of Lee to win the series. It will be an intriguing contest.

Tied on points for third place in the series are Sam Moss and Carl Hulme. Sam picked up a win at Oulton Park in April and then rescued a bad day at Snetterton with a third place in the final race. At Silverstone he made the wrong tyre choice for the wet conditions and strugaled on to finish eighth. But in the next race he pushed Morley all the way to collect second spot. A week after Silverstone he set a new outright lap record for the Cadwell Park circuit and finished second in the recent Grand Prix. Top step of the podium this weekend is not impossible. Carl's best result in the Super Series is a second place at Oulton Park, with a pair of fourths at Snetterton in May. His season improved at the Dutch Superkart GP where he finished second overall and at the British Superkart GP he collected third, just behind Moss. Both Sam and Carl have a mathematical chance of winning the Super Series.

Two other drivers with an outside chance of overall victory are Matt Robinson and Carl Kinsey. This is Matt's first season in the Division 1 category, and it's been a steep learning curve for



the ex-F125 Open driver. But the pace and results have been improving as the season has progressed. A second at Silverstone being his best. Carl has raced in the twin-cylinder class for the past 21 years. He has had mixed results this year with a new lap record at Mallory Park in May. Four weeks ago at the Grand Prix he had two nonfinishes in the heats due to a blown gearbox and then an overheating engine. A great drive from the back of the grid netted him 6th place. Let's hope that he starts near the front this weekend and can challenge the leaders.

Top of the Super Series in the F250 National class is Lee Plain. He bagged a pair of second places at the opening Oulton Park round and then went one better with two wins at Snetterton and two more at Silverstone. Lee became the MSUK British Superkart Champion at Cadwell Park at the end of August and finished second at the Grand Prix recently. Another series championship victory is beckoning which would cap a brilliant season.

Lee's biggest challenge will come from five-time MSA British Superkart Champion Paul Platt. He was back to winning ways at Oulton at the start of the season with a double victory but had a torrid time at Snetterton with two retirements caused by water hose clips breaking. At Silverstone he picked up a pair of third places in the Super Series, before winning the '0' plate race. Cadwell Park a week later saw him take a win in the opening race, but a rare mistake while chasing Plain put him into the barriers and scuppered his chance of British title number six. However, he did secure Grand Prix win number six at Donington recently and will be looking to extend his winning streak this weekend.

Michael Goff and F250 National class rookie Rob Stubbs are tied on points for third place in the series. Goff has had a best finish of third at Snetterton and has also picked up three fourths. His Grand Prix weekend is best forgotten, so he will be looking to get some decent results this time around. Ex-F125 Open competitor Stubbs has made a great return to Superkart racing after a gap of six years. He has consistently been finishing in the top six, with a best of fourth at Snetterton. Can he get on the podium at the final meeting of the year?

The only other driver with a mathematical chance of winning the F250 National Super Series is Tom Hatfield. He scored a win at Snetterton but then struggled at Silverstone with a couple of spins. At the Donington Grand Prix he was back to form and secured third place. It's a tall order to beat Plain and Platt, but he is only 13 points behind Goff and Stubbs, so a third place overall is a possibility.

In the F125 Open class only four of the seven registered drivers are competing. Clint Bridge holds the series lead with three wins and three seconds. In the '0' plate at Silverstone he had a big off at Copse Corner when caught out by the changing track conditions and leading the class. Keeping it on the black stuff will be imperative this weekend. Jack Tritton has been mighty impressive in his first season of long circuit Superkart racing. He picked up a win at Oulton Park at the start of the year and won the F125 Open King of Cadwell in July. Then at Silverstone he picked up another win and also lifted the '0' plate at his first attempt. He missed the GP meeting so will be on the back foot when it comes to circuit knowledge at Donington. Hot on the heels of Clint and Jack will be Michael Parr who has a slim chance of winning the Super Series if they falter.

Kevin Ridley has picked up six wins from seven starts and leads the F450 four stroke class by 22 points. He will be looking to wrap up the Super Series and add to the '0' plate he won at Silverstone and the GP title at Donington four weeks ago. Kosta Kyritsis and John Busby will be hoping that Ridley's reliability fails and hands them a chance of overall victory. Nick Kirk could be challenging for a class win, while Simon Gilbert swaps three wheels for four when the ex-sidecar racer makes his Superkart debut.
