Circuit Access & Egress

Please listen for tannoy announcements for each session.

Pit Lane

When entering the pits drivers must keep to the right of the line at all times. No part of any car entering the pits may cross the white line. The speed limit in the pit lane is 60 kph.

The exit traffic lights are on the left side of the Pit Lane Exit. When leaving the pits drivers must keep to the right of the line at all times. No part of any car leaving the pits may cross the white line.

Qualifying sessions

<u>All categories (except Britcar)</u> - Cars must go to the Assembly Area at least 15 minutes before the start of their session. Cars in garages will be shown the best route to the Assembly Area by the pit lane marshals.

Competitors will be released from the assembly area onto the circuit via the Pit Exit at the start of their session.

<u>Britcar only</u> - Cars will be released by the marshals from their garages into the pit lane for all their sessions

Races with Standing Starts

Carbon8 Hyundai Coupe Cup, Caterham (all classes), Junior Saloons and Mini (all classes) must all go to the Assembly Area at least 15 minutes before the start of their race.

Competitors will be put into grid order by the Assembly Area marshals. Cars will be released onto the track, straight to the grid. Once all cars are on the grid in their correct positions, the countdown will begin with the 1-minute board being shown. Drivers will undertake one Formation Lap and return to the grid. Once all cars are on the grid the 5 seconds board will be shown, then the start lights will be illuminated and then extinguished to start the race.

<u>For Mini Se7en & S races</u>, the Mini Se7en cars will start when the red lights go out, whilst the Mini S cars will start 10 seconds later on the fall of the Union Flag.

Similarly, for the <u>Caterham Sigmax and Sigma 135 races</u>, the Sigmax cars will start when the red lights go out, whilst the Sigma 135 cars will start 10 seconds later on the fall of the Union Flag.



Races with Rolling Starts

<u>Superkarts</u>

All karts must go to the Assembly Area at least 15 minutes before the start of their race.

Please refer to your own championship briefing notes for the start procedure.

Britcar Dunlop Endurance & Trophy

Competitors will line up in the pitlane to be released onto the circuit to come around to the grid. Once all cars are on the grid, the "Race Countdown" boards will be shown and the grid of cars will move off behind the Lead Car (Safety Car) for their Formation Lap (green flag lap). When the Lead Car approaches the pit lane entry, it will extinguish its flashing lights and the pole position holder will be in charge of the pace of the field. As the grid of cars start to come around the last corner, the start lights will be illuminated and then extinguished to start the race.

Red Flag

In the event of a Red Flag in Qualifying, slow down and return to the Pit Lane. Should a Red Flag be shown during a Race, return to the Grid, stopping short of the rear of the Grid and await marshal's instructions

Safety Car

The Safety Car will be deployed as per Championship Regulations, please ensure you have read and understand the procedure.

The Safety Car will join the circuit from the Pit Lane Exit. The Safety Car will leave the circuit by the Pit Lane Entrance. Please remember that once a race is resumed after a Safety Car period, you are not allowed to overtake another car until you have passed the Control (Timing) Line.

Parc Fermé

At the end of all qualifying sessions and races, competitors will take the chequered flag, slow down and leave the circuit at turn 3, back into the paddock. Cars required for Parc Fermé will be guided to the Scrutineering Bay.



Remember that until you are released from Parc Fermé, no work on the car may take place of any kind, including reviewing camera footage and no team personnel, except the driver, may enter the area.



Timing

There will be no grid sheets or results produced on paper at the event. You are advised that these can be found on the TSL website at https://www.tsl-timing.com/event/211821. You should make sure that you are aware of your grid position before going to the assembly area.

All timing is done automatically; you must have a working transponder fitted or you will not be timed.

Track Limits and Judges of Fact

Instances of drivers exceeding track limits may be reported by appointed Judges of Fact.

Start Lights

The start lights are positioned on the main gantry above the track. Each race will start when the Red Lights go out.

Control / Timing Line

The Timing Line is in front of Race Control.

Pole Position

Pole position is on the right for standing starts and rolling starts.

Judicial Process

The judicial rules and regulations are described within the Motorsport UK Yearbook; however no physical paperwork will be issued, with all decisions being issued electronically and sent by email to your registered email address.

If you are called to Race Control, for a judicial hearing, you should bring any additional camera footage you wish to present on a **USB 'memory stick'**.

If you want to query if an incident is being investigated, you can contact me through the e-mail address, or through the designated point of contact. The point of contact will be bulletined on the BARC virtual notice board.

It is not permitted to come to Race Control unless requested to do so.

Stop/Go Penalty Area Location

This area is located in the Pit lane outside of Race Control.

Track Behaviour

Track Limit Cameras are installed at various turns around the circuit. Instances of drivers exceeding track limits may also be reported by appointed Judges of Fact.


Motorsport UK guidance concerning track limits is detailed here:

- a) In qualifying, running beyond track limits is likely to result in the loss of that particular lap time (note that a black & white flag signal need not be shown). This will occur on each and every occasion.
- b) In racing, running beyond track limits is likely to result in the following penalties:
 - Second occurrence: Black & white warning flag shown to competitor;
 - Third occurrence: 5 second time penalty;
 - Fourth occurrence: 10 second time penalty:
 - Fifth occurrence: Drive-through penalty;
 - Sixth occurrence: Black flag, and exclusion from race.

Any driver entering a gravel trap and then re-joining must avoid bringing gravel onto the racing line. Any driver ignoring this instruction may be penalised. In Qualifying, any car that drives through and out of a gravel trap must go directly to the pits to be checked before continuing the session. In the Races, any car that drives through and out of a gravel trap must re-enter the track offline and avoid depositing gravel on the racing line.

Should any driver use the escape road at the end of the Bentley Straight, the driver should not turn round, but instead should, continue along the escape road, turn left into another section of road and then re-join the track between Nelson and Bomb Hole, when safe to do so (see diagram below).





Timetable

We will endeavour to run the race meeting to the timetable, but we reserve the right to run up to 20 minutes ahead of schedule. Please keep an eye on the programme and listen out for paddock announcements.

A 6:30 pm track curfew exists at Snetterton. Please ensure that you are in the right place at the right time for your sessions to help us maintain the timetable.

Health & Safety

You should follow the BARC Health & Safety Guidelines and BARC Competitor Guidance in line with the revised Motorsport UK regulations. These can be found on the BARC website on the Silverstone event page.

I would however like to remind you of the following:

- The wearing of a face mask or covering which covers both the nose and mouth, (not a visor), is mandatory for everyone at all times while within the venue assembly area, pit lane, pit garages, pit wall and grid plus in any enclosed space unless alone or while eating or drinking within a designated area. Masks or face coverings are required in Parc Fermé and the paddock where it is not possible to maintain 2m social distancing. There are no exceptions for health considerations as may have previously been the case and if anyone is unable to comply then they should not attend the event.
- Symptoms of coronavirus are persistent cough, high temperature, feeling unwell, breathlessness and a loss of taste or smell.
- Participants who feel unwell with any of the symptoms of coronavirus, however mild or who feel
 they may have been exposed to a risk of infection must not attend the event. If someone is
 already at the event and exhibits any symptoms should leave the venue, advise the Secretary of
 the Meeting and call NHS 111.
- Please always remember that you must take responsibility for your own and others safety, protecting yourself from the virus by following the competitors and government guidelines.
