# BRILLIANT BRITCAR BACK ON TRACK

## BRITCAR ENDURANCE + PRAGA

The Pragas, whilst running in the Endurance race, are competing for a discrete prize and points, and it's difficult at this point to determine who will come out on top, such is the stellar competition. Pro-driver Abbie Eaton, partnering Geordie Mutch, shone in the opening rounds, as did the formidable partnership of Jack Fabby and Charlie Martin, while "Chippy" Wesesmael showed promise, and You Tube star Jimmy Broadbent enjoyed a massive following, co-driving with reigning champion Jem Hepworth.

But it was an Endurance runner that beat them all - the Lamborghini Huracan of John Seale and Jamie Stanley impressively took pole, two fastest laps and two wins at Silverstone, with a phalanx of Pragas separating the rest of the Endurance contingent, led by the beefy Nissan GT3 of Richard Wheeler and Danny Harris, and the McLaren 650S of Will Powell and Dave Scaramanga.

International sportscar ace Johnny Mowlem partnered Le Mans amateur Bon Grimes to a brace of Class 3 victories at Silverstone in their Ferrari 458, and they will be up against the

similar machine of Chris Goddard and Charlie Hollings, while Mark and Peter Cunningham, and Marcus Fothergill/Dave Benett uphold honours for Porsche, and the BMW contingent is led by the Woodrow Motorsport entries of Nathan Wells/Mark Steward (M3 E46), and Matty Evans/Kevin Clarke's 1M

A packed Class 4 could go anyway-regular front runners Marcus Vivian/Luke Davenport (Ligier JS2-R), and the Cupra TCR of Ash Woodman/Martyn Byford had issues at Silverstone, and the Cupra TCR of Alex Day and Will Foster took a debut class win, but lone driver Peter Erceg, in his Cayman, and the Team BRIT pairing of Bobby Trundle and Aaron Morgan in an Aston Martin Vantage are always well-placed, and hopefully the Newbarn Racing Jaguar F-type will have a trouble-free run this time.

## BRITCAR TROPHY

The Trophy Championship entered its second season with a record entry, and, judging by the opening round at Silverstone, a BMW seems to be the weapon of choice at the front end of the field; the 1-series of Simon Baker and Kevin Clarke dominated at Silverstone, challenged by the E46 of Jas Sapra and Lucky Khera, while Kan-Yan's Andie Stokoe / David McDonald and Team BRIT's Matty Street/Andy

Tucker were well placed in the M249i variants. Breaking them up, though, was lone driver Mark Lee's new Ginetta G56A, and Kester Cook's Ford Fiesta kept in touch too.

In Class 2, Richard Higgins in the County Classics Porsche 996 gets the business done unfussily, as some previous frontrunners get to grips with new cars - there is more to come from Saxon stablemates Alastair Lindsay and Brad Taylor in their SEATs, and Amigo Boxster buddies Richard Higgins and Anthony Hutchins are yet to get their seasons going properly. The trio of JW Bird VW Sciroccos, with Tony Prendergast to the fore, look towards success, and the Ginetta G40s of Peter Spano/ Andrew Bentley and Charlotte Birch could be close.

Steve Griffiths and Jamie Vinnal-Meyer took two wins at Silverstone in the little Ginetta G20, so last year's class champions, Steve and Edward Cook, will be upping their game in their new Honda Civic, and the Golf of Mark Jones and Robert Taylor, or Team BRIT's Luke Pound in BMW 118 could be a good top three bet, while in the Clio Class, expect pro-driver Anton Spiers, sharing with Darren Geeraerts, to make the early running, though James Colburn could well steal the win, partnered for this event by Sarah Franklin.



# JUNIOR JUGGERNAUT SPEEDS INTO SNETTERTON

Fresh off the back of serving up a spectacular curtain-raiser at Cadwell Park two weeks ago, the 2021 Junior Saloon Car Championship continues to gather momentum this weekend as it speeds into Snetterton.

Renowned for producing edge-of-the-seat thrills, all signs point to this being another vintage season for the single-make category as it boasts a bumper entry list made up of experienced and rookie drivers - all of whom are keen to make their mark as they start out on what they hope to be successful motorsport careers.

At Cadwell Park last month, Charlie Hand and Harvey Caton shared the spoils however it is Hand who arrives in Norfolk in control of the points having bagged a podium alongside his race win.

Having narrowly missed out on the title last year, Hand understands what it takes to piece a championship challenge together and the youngster will be keen to strengthen his early advantage during the early rounds.

Hot on Hand's heels are a number of drivers who all competed last year and that are just as hungry to write themselves into the history books. Alfie Jeakins, Aaron Walker, Ruben Hage, Oliver Cottam and Jamie Wallis lead the chase and any one of them could stake their claim to the throne.

Jamie Petters is the lead rookie and he too, along with the likes of Loui Hounsell, Jacob Heap and Ollie Handley will be worth keep a keen eye on.

Alongside the aforementioned contenders, other notable names to look out for over the course of the weekend include former Scholarship



winner Deagan Fairclough and Harry Rice, as well as the most recent Scholar, Chloe Grant.

Two races make up the latest chapter of the JSCC story this weekend and it's all to play for - you'd be mad to miss it.

The pair battled profusely at Oulton Park, and we're expecting another thrilling

tussle between them this weekend.

The Sigma Max Class will certainly be worth a watch. After claiming one win apiece last time out, Harry Senior and Ben Winrow will no doubt restart their epic on track battle, with fellow championship contender and CGRC returnee, Simon Griffiths fully in the mix. With just two points between the three of them, we are set to enjoy more of their skilled racing antics at Snetterton this weekend.

# THE MIGHTY MINIS RETURN

## MINI MIGLIA

With up to eight cars all in with a shout of victory last time out, the top-tier 1.3-litre Mini formula is headed by former BTCC Champion Andrew Jordan no less, thanks to a pair of 2nd places on the Silverstone International circuit. He holds a slender 1 point advantage over both Endaf Owens, the 2011 National Miglia Champion, and also Historic F1 specialist Nick Padmore, who each won a race apiece. Reigning title holder Aaron Smith's pair of 3rds puts him just another point behind, while other previous champions include Rupert Deeth who led for much of the second race at Silverstone before a late engine hiccup, and Kane Astin who also dropped out with a driveshaft problem when in contention.

## MINI LIBRE

The semi-invitational category for up-to-1400cc A-Series-based Miglia-lookalikes produced some excellent racing behind the top class, with Richard Colburn holding the advantage coming to Snetterton. Peters Crewes (7-port) and Hills (16V) were not far behind, while newcomer Les Stanton's 5-port example went well first time out.



## MINI SE7EN

Having missed most of last season, the 2019 National runner-up Joe Thompson returned to the 1.0-litre championship trail a fortnight ago on a mission, and boy did he mean business! Two brilliant drives under pressure from several fierce rivals, not least former BTCC racer and reigning 2019/20 Se7en Champion Jeff Smith, gave him the overall advantage although Smith's tally for twice narrowly finishing 2nd was boosted by extra points for setting both fastest laps. Spencer Wanstall continued his title challenging pace from last season too, although a DNF in the second race means he dropped down the standings behind the likes of Mini

veteran Jonathan Lewis (he won the Se7en title back in 1980!) and series returnee Nick Croydon-Fowler.

## MINI-7 S-CLASS

Entries in the limited-tuning 1275cc feeder category have soared, and newcomer Michael Winkworth set the benchmark at Silverstone with a brace of well fought victories. Reigning Novice Champ' Matt Ayres is next up while former BARC 1.3i Mini frontrunners Greg Daw and Damien Harrington are on leading pace, as is 2020 Graham Hill Trophy Under-17 title winner Ryan Taylor, with archetypal 'old head-on-young-shoulders' performances.

# SUPERKARTS BACK IN ACTION

The Superkarts are back in action this coming weekend for the second round of the British Superkart Racing Club Super Series. All four classes will be competing in a mixed grid of 48 entries over the Snetterton 300 circuit, so we can expect to see some close

racing throughout the field. Heading the twin cylinder Division 1 class is the former European Superkart Champion Lee Harpham. He won the opening race at Oulton Park last month but had to settle for second place in race two when an understeer issue prevented him from challenging for double victory. The win in that second race went to Sam Moss, who

also set a new class lap record. Moss is only 4 points behind Harpham in the series and shares second place in the standings with Carl Hulme, who picked up a second and a third at Oulton. These three drivers should be podium contenders but there are several other drivers that could feature prominently. Jason Dredge is seventh in the standings and had to start from the back of the grid in both races. He pulled through to second place in race 1 before a lack of brakes forced

him out. Tom Rushforth is down in 9th place in the points with only a sixth place to his credit after an engine misfire side-lined him, while Liam Morley the reigning club champion was forced to miss Oulton Park due to a leg injury and is keen to get his season off to a flying start.

Top of the Super Series in the F250 National class is five-time MSA British Superkart Champion Paul Platt. He was back to winning ways at Oulton with a double victory but was pushed all the way by Lee Plain. These two will be battling again this weekend but will have to watch out for some young drivers hoping to make their mark. Curtis Seymour was on the podium at Snetterton two years ago and he could be joined by Rob Stubbs and Luke Clemson. Both the latter drivers have moved up from the F125 Open class and collected good results at Oulton. Add in Tom Hatfield, Ben Davis and Michael Goff and we could have a close contest.



In the F125 Open class Jack Tritton and Clint Bridge share the series lead with a win and a second apiece at Oulton. Tritton was very impressive at his first long circuit Superkart event and will be hoping for more of the same. Both drivers are local to Snetterton but unfortunately won't have any fan support due to the

event being staged behind closed doors.

Kevin Ridley got two wins from two starts at Oulton and leads the F450 four stroke class. He will be looking to extend his lead but may come under pressure from Nick Flint and Kosta Kyrtis.

## COMPETITIVE COUPE CUP SET TO TAKE CENTRE STAGE

Park that will be looking to make their mark however, with a number of notable contenders all aiming to stand on the top step of the podium.

With a slightly longer 30-minute contest scheduled to play out around Snetterton, the Coupe Cup contingent is not to be missed.
