

2021 BRITISH TRUCK RACING CHAMPIONSHIP BRIEFING NOTES

Start/Finish Line Located	Opposite Race Control	
Pole Position	On the right	
Pit Lane Speed Limit	60 kph	
Start Lights	On gantry at the end of the pit wall above track.	
Warning/Chequered Flag Location	End of the Pit Wall, at the Finish Line with gantry repeater.	

Flag Signals

The marshals will flag from behind the marshal's posts, in the spectator enclosures. Please ensure that you sight the flag points at the start of each session (1st lap in qualifying and the pace/formational for each of the race starts). In addition to these flag signals, Brands Hatch also has lights and these have the same meaning as the flag signals.

Driving Standards

These are covered in the 2021 Season Championship Briefing document. A copy is on the BARC event notice board.

Timing;

There will be no grid sheets or results produced on paper at the event and you are advised that these can be found on the TSL website at <u>http://www.tsl-timing.com</u>. You should make sure that you are aware of your grid position before going to the assembly area.

Because all of the timing is done automatically you must have a working transponder fitted or you will not be timed.

Track Limit Sensors and Judges of Fact

Track Limit cameras and sensors are installed at the exit of Turn 1 (Paddock Hill Bend), exit of Turn 2 (Druids) and Turn 5 (Clearways).

At other locations instances of drivers exceeding track limits may also be reported by appointed Judges of Fact.

Access and Egress from the Track

All trucks will assemble at in the truck assembly area adjacent to the ambulance gate at Turn 1. You will then be convoyed across to the Pit Lane.

- For qualifying you will be released from the Pit Lane to start the session.
- For the races you will follow the Pace Truck from the Assembly Area to the Start Line. A 1minute countdown will commence to the Green Flag/Pace Lap once everyone is in place.

At the end of all sessions, including races, having taken the chequered flag you will complete a lap of the circuit at enter the Pit Lane.

All trucks will then be convoyed across to the Truck Park Ferme. Only the driver or a mechanic may drive the truck from the Pit Lane to Parc Ferme. If a mechanic drives the truck the mechanic must possess a full UK HGV driving license. No passengers are permitted.

<u>Grid</u>

The grid is formed as per the championship regulations and the 2021 season briefing notes.

Race Start

The start procedure is a rolling start in a single group with a 3-row gap between the two classes.

The truck in pole position for each class is responsible for setting the pace (50 to 70kph) and all trucks should be formed up into a 2×2 formation, not more than 2 to 3 lengths apart with the gap between the classes maintained. I am looking for the start formation to be in place as the trucks exit Mclaren into Clark Curve.

The Pace Truck will pull off into the Pit Lane. As the trucks approach the grid, the red lights will go on. When the starter is happy with the formation the lights will be extinguished to indicate the start for Class 1, the Unio Flag will indicate the start for Class 2.

Judicial Process

The judicial rules and regulations are exactly as described within the Motorsport UK Yearbook, however no physical paperwork will be issued, with all decisions being issued electronically and sent by email to your registered email address. If you are called to Race Control, for a judicial hearing, you should bring any additional camera footage you wish to present on a **<u>USB 'memory stick'</u>**, in a Windows Media Player format.

If you want to query if an incident is being investigated, you can contact either myself through the email address, or through the designated point of contact. The point of contact will be bulletined on the BARC virtual notice board.

It is not permitted/acceptable to come to Race Control unless requested to do so.

If you are called to Race Control an appropriate face covering must be worn as per the Covid-19 guidelines.

Health & Safety

You should follow the BARC Health & Safety Guidelines and BARC Competitor Guidance in line with the current Covid-19 Motorsport UK regulations. These are available on the BARC and Motorsport UK website and the following links:
