FLAGSIGNALS

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close. (Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.

YELLOW

(Waved)

Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop. (Double Waved) Great danger ahead; no overtaking. slow down, be prepared to stop.

WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.

GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline & individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.

BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged

TAKING CENTRE STAGE

It's a familiar feature; Snetterton and the Classic 2CV Racing Club's annual 24-hour race. Billed as one of the standout events on the national motorsport calendar every year, the spectacle is back once again in 2021 and it has all the makings of being one to remember.

Marking the penultimate round of the season for the popular one-make series, the 31st running of the event looks set to follow the trend of years gone by - producing blockbuster entertainment from start-to-finish.

With a new title sponsor in the shape of Citroen, this year's edition of the great race around the Norfolk venue could play a pivotal role in deciding who walks away with the title once the curtain falls on the season.

As it stands, former multiple champion Pete Sparrow sits on the verge of regaining the crown he lost to Alec Graham last year. No stranger to being at the top of the championship,



Sparrow has been perfection personified this year to take six wins from six races.

Raising his game once again, the series veteran has been the benchmark but he, more than anyone, will know that the job isn't done yet and that he can't afford to rest on his laurels; especially as there are a host of contenders chasing him.

Just five points separate Sandro Proietti, Kris Tovey and Luca Proietti and each one of them will be eager to eat into Sparrow's advantage. Throw into the mix the likes of Nick Crispin, David O'Keeffe, Matthew Hollis, Martin Roman, Aubrey Brocklebank and Marc Grasby and you begin to understand why not only Sparrow has had to reach a new level but also why anyone could charge to victory.

When casting an eye down the expected bumper grid for this weekend, it's not just the championship regulars that you need to focus on when it comes to the battle for supremacy.

A number of competitors from mainland Europe set to make the journey to race, and they won't be here to just make up the numbers.

Racing day and night around the shorter 200 layout of Snetterton, the UK's longest running 24-hour race simply isn't to be missed.

As well as sponsoring the race, Citroen's presence at the event will see it stretch to a 'Citroen Classics Gathering' that will take place on the infield of the circuit.



LET THE BATTLE OF THE COUNTIES COMMENCE!

New for 2021, the Snetterton Saloons, sponsored by Uncle Luke's Sign & Sticker Shop, is an ex-citing and competitive series focussing on local

talent competing for class wins and team tactics to secure the East Anglian County Cup

Competitors are split into classes, based on car performance; all races include a mandatory pit stop; cars can have one or two drivers.

Saturdays entry for this inaugural round, supported by Bruha Brewing in Eye, Suffolk; ranges from the mighty BMW E92 GT4 of Edward Leigh (Essex), to the super handling VW Golf GTi Mk2 of Mark Periam (Out of Region).

Look out for the giant-slaying classics of Martin Reynolds (Ford Escort Mk2, Norfolk) & Colin Claxton (Ford Escort Mk1, Norfolk), battling head to head with the M3's.

The Suffolk entry is also represented by the Class A entry of Karl Cattliff in his BMW E90 M3; Ste-phen Pearson in his Class B, S54 powered BMW E36 M3 and the "Course Car" BMW E90 of Frank Rodber in Class C.

Norfolk dominates Class C, with a range of Honda Civic's from Luke Allen, Michael Williamson, Oliver Elmer, Chris Earle and Shaun Green; joined by the Clio of Ray Honeybone and the Peugeot 306 Rallye of Miles Moseley & Carl Chambers.

Class A should provide a fascinating battle between the BMW's ranging from ex-BTCC driver Rick Kerry's (Suffolk) V8 powered 1 series BMW to Mark Havers (Suffolk) TCR spec



Seat Cupra; with Stephen Scott-Dunwoodie's (Bedfordshire) E46 M3 bridging the generation gap; plus Catliff's E90 M3.

Mandatory Pit-Stops will provide a challenge to both drivers and spectators; with a 2 minute 'en-try-to-exit' minimum time and heavy penalties for 'short-stopping'. Egg-Timers at the ready!!

Single drivers can remain strapped into their car; whilst the double driving pairings frantically swap out & in as seamlessly as possible.

Future Rounds in 2021 will be held on 19th September (British Truck Racing Championship weekend) and 2nd October (MSVR Club Car Championship weekend)

Let the battle of the Counties commence!

MAX5 MAESTROS REVVED UP FOR SNETTERTON

Whilst the Classic 2CV Racing Club headlines this weekend's British Automobile Racing Club event at Snetterton, the Max5 Racing Championship makes for the perfect warm-up act.

Making the second consecutive visit to the Norfolk venue, albeit this time on the shorter 200 layout, the single-make series will undoubtedly look to steal the show with two 20-minute contests scheduled for Saturday.

Like the 2CV Racing contingent, the weekend marks the penultimate event of the 2021 season and its set to be crucial in deciding who will be crowned champion.

Paul Roddison currently heads the championship standings having produced a near-perfect display. Double wins at Cadwell Park and



Silverstone saw the experienced racer on course for a clean sweep before Jon Halliwell ended his winning last time out.

Holding a healthy lead over his nearest challenger, Roddison will want to chalk up a further two wins to strengthen his stranglehold on proceedings and he looks to be a tough opponent to better.

Jeremy Shipley is the lead challenger to Roddison's top spot and he, like Ben Taylor and Kimberley Nolan, will be keen to score a first win of the campaign.

Former champion Halliwell is the only other driver to have stood on the top step of the podium and if he ends up taking his place on the grid, you can guarantee he'll be in the running to add another triumph.

Other notable names to look out for over the course of both races include Joe Jacob, Benjamin Greenhill, Andrew Pretorius, Sam Hicks and Lee Hollin.
