2021 BRITISH TRUCK RACING CHAMPIONSHIP BRIEFING NOTES

Welcome

On behalf of the BARC and myself welcome to Pembrey and the penultimate event of the 2021 British Truck Racing Championship.

Briefing

There will be no championship driver briefing at this event, reading these notes together with the season briefing notes/guidance, issued for the first event at Brands Hatch and Final Instructions should cover all points. I will also be available to answer questions on Saturday morning between 0800 and 0815 prior to the start of the meeting outside Race Control.

As at previous events, where possible/appropriate questions and answers will be shared with all competitors via email or bulletin.

Circuit Information

Circuit	National
Circuit Length	1.46 miles
Start/Finish Line Located	Opposite Race Control
Pole Position	On the right
Pit Lane Speed Limit	60 KPH
Start Lights	On gantry, above the track approx. at the end of the Pit Wall.
Warning/Chequered Flag Location	Pit Wall outside Race Control

Flag Signals

The marshals will flag from behind the marshal's posts, in the spectator enclosures where possible. Please ensure that you sight the flag points at the start of each session (1st lap in qualifying and the pace/formational for each of the race starts).

Pembrey does not have any circuit lights.

Driving Standards

These are covered in the 2021 Season Championship Briefing document issued at Brands Hatch. If you require a copy, please contact David Wheadon or me via e-mail.

Timing

There will be no grid sheets or results produced on paper at the event and you are advised that these can be found on the TSL website at <http://www.tsl-timing.com>. You should make sure that you are aware of your grid position before going to the assembly area.

Because all of the timing is done automatically you must have a working transponder fitted or you will not be timed.

Track Limit Judges of Fact

Judges of Fact will report track limits violations where appropriate. You are reminded about the rules regarding track limits (Section Q12.21.2 in the Motorsport UK Year Book).

Access and Egress from the Track

All trucks will assemble at in the Assembly Area on the outside of the circuit.

- For **qualifying** you will follow a course car around the circuit and enter the Pit Lane. When all trucks are in and the circuit is clear, qualifying will commence from the Pit Lane.
- For the **aces** you will follow the Pace Truck from the Outer Assembly Area to the Start Line. A 1-minute countdown will commence to the Green Flag/Pace Lap once everyone is in place.

At the end of all sessions, including races, having taken the chequered flag, you will complete a lap of the circuit and enter the Pit Lane. Once all the trucks are in the Pit Lane you will follow a course car/Pace Truck to Parc Ferme in the outer Paddock.

Any truck leaving the Pit Lane must be driven by the signed-on driver to Parc Ferme all belts and helmet must be worn and fastened. **NO passengers are permitted** to ride back to the paddock either in or on any Race Truck.

Grid

The grid is formed as per the championship regulations and the 2021 Season Championship Briefing notes.

Race Start

The start procedure is a rolling start in a single group with a 3-row gap between the two classes.

The truck in pole position for each class is responsible for setting the pace (50 to 70kph) and all trucks should be formed up into a 2 x 2 formation, not more than 2 to 3 lengths apart with the gap between the classes maintained. I am looking for the start formation to be in place **before** the trucks enter Honda Curve.

The Pace Truck will pull off into the Pit Lane. As the trucks approach the grid, the red lights will be on. When the starter is happy with the formation the lights will be extinguished to indicate the start for Class 1, the Welsh National Flag will indicate the start for Class 2.

Judicial Process

The judicial rules and regulations are exactly as described within the Motorsport UK Yearbook, however no physical paperwork will be issued, with all decisions being issued electronically and sent by email to your registered email address.

If you are called to Race Control, for a judicial hearing, you should bring any additional camera footage you wish to present on a **USB 'memory stick'**, in a Windows Media Player format.

If you want to query if an incident is being investigated, you can contact either myself through the e-mail address, or through the designated point of contact. The point of contact will be bulletined on the BARC virtual notice board.

It is not permitted/acceptable to come to Race Control unless requested to do so.

If you are called to Race Control an appropriate face covering must be worn as per the Covid-19 rules for Wales, which require face coverings indoors.

Health & Safety

You should follow the BARC Health & Safety Guidelines and BARC Competitor Guidance in line with the current Covid-19 Motorsport UK regulations. (Note the rules for Wales differ slightly than those in England). These are available on the BARC and Motorsport UK website and the following links:
