1.2 PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:

Please see the paddock plan in section 5. It is important that teams only park in their designated area. Any competitor/team that parks in an area that is not assigned for them and refuses to move when asked by an official will be reported to the Clerk of the Course for penalty up to disqualification.

Paul Abbott is helping with the paddock management, he can be contacted on 07919 427 458. He will be onsite from Thursday afternoon until Saturday afternoon.

Similar to 2021, all of the Championships have full grids at this event. To ensure that space is used for racing activities, all private cars and non-essential vehicles are to be parked on the Stowe Runway marked on the paddock plan.

For teams testing on Friday, paddock access will be from 19:00 on Thursday. For the avoidance of doubt, testing is not a BARC activity and access to the paddock is controlled exclusively by Silverstone up to 19:00 on Friday.

Teams that are not testing will be allowed access to the circuit from 19:00 on Friday. Competitors arriving before this time will be held in car park 49 (near the main entrance).

If testing and you have track activity on Saturday, where possible, please park in a location that is allocated to your Championship – if you have hired a garage for testing this can be used.

The paddock area should be vacated as soon as possible after the meeting on Sunday.

When travelling to the venue everyone should think of the environmental footprint, especially their carbon footprint. Vehicles should not be left idling and vehicles with lower emissions should be the preference.

Please be aware that several thefts have been reported in race paddocks over the last few months. Make sure that paddock vehicles are securely locked and that all reasonable steps are taken to protect property.

1.3 PASSES:

Passes will be sent to you under separate cover. Please note there are vehicle passes for this meeting – only working vehicles will be allowed access to the paddock.

1.4 SIGNING-ON:

Competitors will not sign-on at the meeting having previously completed signing on electronically using the BARC Rev-Up system.

2022 sees the return of physical upgrade cards. Upgrade cards <u>must</u> be valid bearing a **recent photograph and be signed by the driver**. Drivers who wish to have their upgrade card signed should bring them to race admin on the morning of the event. They can then be collected 30 minutes after the respective race has concluded.

1.5 ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION:

Engines must not be run before 08:45 or after 18:00 on both days. The noise limit at this event is 105dB (static).

Noise checks will take place in the assembly area for all.

1.6 SCRUTINEERING & ELIGIBILITY:

For 2022 there is a return to 100% physical scrutineering. All vehicles and driver equipment will be examined at the times indicated in table below. These are also included on the timetable in section 4.

CTCRC: Scrutineering will be in garage 3.

CGRC/JSCC: Scrutineering will be in garages 1-2.

Mini7 / Kumho BMW: In their paddock.

Video equipment may be fitted to a vehicle if it is not used for commercial purposes. All video equipment must be fitted to the vehicle at scrutineering. Failure to do so may mean that the camera is removed.

Classic Touring Car Championship (BOSS/Thunder, Super Tourers/Pre 03)

Please read the Driver Briefing notes for full details.

Standing Start will assemble in the area marked on the paddock plan (section 5) behind garages 34-41. Countdowns will be from the assembly area. They will leave the assembly area complete a green flag lap to the grid, form up on the grid and then undertake their standing start.

<u>Caterham Graduates Racing Club: Where two classes share the grid they will be gridded by class with the first starting on the lights and the second after a delay (Motorsport UK Yearbook regulation Q12.12.3).</u>

Rolling Start will assemble in the area marked on the paddock plan (section 5) behind garages 34-41. Countdowns will be from the assembly area. They will leave the assembly area complete their rolling lap and then make a rolling start. For the avoidance of doubt, the cars will not form up on the grid.

CTCC: Super Tourers / Pre 03: The Super Tourers will start on the lights with Pre 03 starting after a delay (Motorsport UK Yearbook regulation Q12.12.3).

All classes are encouraged to undertake the green flag lap at an appropriate speed. The Organisers reserve the right to commence the race clock 3 minutes after the start of the green flag lap.

1.11 RESULTS & NOTICE BOARD:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions.

3 GENERAL INFORMATION:

This meeting is organised by the BARC governed by the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK incorporating the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code, additional Supplementary regulations, and any written instructions that the organisers issue for the meeting.

3.1 LIVE SNATCH:

The Clerk of the Course has the option to carry out a "live snatch" under local yellow flags, during the hours of daylight.

3.2 RED FLAGS:

Any category which generates a "red flag" may be placed toward the end of the schedule subject to time being available.

3.3 JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this meeting remain unaltered except that paperwork will be dealt with electronically.

Any protest or appeal needs to be lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting in the administration office or the Clerk of the Course. Judicial hearings will be conducted in the usual way but those attending are recommended to bring face masks/covering to any discussion or interview.

Once a decision has been made it will be announced verbally and passed by email to those concerned. The time limits for any protest or appeal remain unaltered.

3.9 GENERAL HEALTH & SAFETY:

Championship Co-ordinators and representatives are asked to visually check garages and working spaces for the following:

- 1) Fuel is stored in suitable containers with lids away from sources if ignition;
- 2) Each competition car has one suitable fire extinguisher stored in a usable location (i.e., not in race transporter) and is both tested and in-date;
- 3) Floor/ground is kept clean & tidy;
- 4) Waste is disposed of in identified bins & containers provided by the circuit. Waste must not be mixed or waste left around the site. In the event that the BARC is charged for such issues then the charge will be passed on to the championship concerned if the individual cannot be identified;
- Old tyres must be taken away by teams/competitors unless the championship has arrangements with the tyre company (there will be waste disposal charge levied to the championship for any items which are controlled/hazardous that BARC and or Circuit have to dispose of);
- 6) No trailing electrical cables that can cause electric shock or tripping hazard;

- 7) Waste/grey water from motorhomes must be disposed of in line with circuit requirements;
- Work at height without harnesses and fall restraints is not permitted. 8)
















Garages 1 - 2 – Scrutineering/Parc Fermé

Garages 3 - CTCRC Club + Scrutineering

Garages 4 - 5 - CTCRC Super Tourers only

Garages 6 - 19 - Classic Touring Cars (CTCRC)

Garages 20 - 25 - Junior Saloons (JSCC)

Garages 26 - 30 - Kumho BMW (KBMW)

Garages 31 - 40 - Caterham Graduates (CAT GRAD)

Garage 41 - Access from Pitlane to Assembly Area ONLY

Race Support Vehicles: Only Race Support Vehicles with the correct BARC vehicle pass attached to the inside of the windscreen will be accepted into the paddock area.

Private Vehicles & Trailers: Private Vehicles & Trailers need to be parked in the gravel car park next to the Stowe Circuit. You cannot take private cars into the paddock area.

Motorhomes & RVs: Motorhomes and RVs must be parked up in the fenced compound as marked out on the plan above.
