This meeting is organised by the British Automobile Racing Club North Western Centre and will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), the event Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.

FLAG SIGNALS

BLUE - STEADY : Another competitor is close.

BLUE - WAVED : Another competitor is trying to pass.

WHITE : Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW - WAVED : Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

DOUBLE YELLOW - WAVED :

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking.

YELLOW WITH RED STRIPES :

Slippery surface ahead.

RED :

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline and marshals posts).

GREEN - WAVED :

All clear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

BLACK WITH ORANGE DISC DISPLAYED WITH WHITE NUMBER :

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver, call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE WITH WHITE NUMBER :

Warning to driver that his behaviour (ie. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

BLACK DISPLAYED WITH WHITE NUMBER :

Driver must call in immediately to the pits and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK/WHITE CHEQUERED : End of race

Races are started using a system of red/green traffic lights.



SPECTATOR NOTICES

Please do not leave litter about the grounds - take it with you.

Remember to drive with care and caution when leaving the grounds. To safeguard both competitors and public animals are not admitted. This is most important.

Prohibited Area Notices

The public are not permitted in the areas where these notices are displayed. Please forgive the use of the male pronoun, but I am sure had the roman poet been around today he would have been as enlightened and inclusive as the BARC North Western Centre as they host their annual feat of endurance here at Oulton Park. As the sound of Supercars in the Cheshire countryside is for a change not the sound of premier league footballers coming home.

Welcome to the second BARC North Western Centre organised meeting at Oulton Park this year. As mentioned above we are welcoming the glorious Britcar cars to the circuit for their annual visit. Ideally we would have had the Praga and Prototype classes here but unfortunately numbers are struggling somewhat this season and they are re-grouping before re-entering the fray later in the year. This means that the scheduled two day meeting is reduced to a single day, but a full and very competitive day it will be with excellent grids lined up to entertain.

The British Endurance Championship

In 2022 the Britcar became recognised as a national championship by Motorsport UK and changed it's name to reflect it's new status. What has not changed is the mix of fantastic race



cars and competitive racing. Ferrari, Lamborghini, Mercedes cars battle it out at the front of the field and mix it with Seat, BMW and Ginetta. The tightly controlled regulations are designed to keep a level playing field of performance between the competitors. More information on the entrants today and what has happened so far this season can be found elsewhere in the programme. Today's race will be run over 3 hours and feature lots of driver change pit stops – maybe a good place to

watch from will be across from the Pits during these pit stops. The advantage of a long race is that it gives you the opportunity to see the same cars at different locations.

Britcar Trophy Championship

For those who don't have the budget to compete with GT's and TCR cars in the British Endurance Championship there is the Britcar Trophy. The races are shorter and the regulations ensure that each car is as competitive as the next. Today there are two races, each of 50 minutes, again featuring pit stops for driver changes. Along with classes determined by the performance of the cars there are two classes for Ginetta G40's and Renault Clio's. The class structure has resulted in a full grid of competitive cars.





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


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TOP CLASS BRITCAR TROPHY ACTION AT OULTON

We revert to a double-headed 50-minute race format this weekend, after the two-hour enduro last time out, and with three-time winner Axel van Nederveen seemingly absent for this event, his Datum Motorsport colleagues Marco Anastasi and Maurizio Sciglio will be among the Ginetta G56 contingent fighting for overall honours. The Sicilian-born, Edinburgh domiciled gaming gurus have run at the front but not converted




that to total success so far this year, and indeed, it has been mixed fortunes for most of the Class 1 runners up to now – it hasn't been plain sailing for the Ginettas of Julian Wantling/ Jim Edwards, and Robin Grimwood. While a delay in over-exuberant first-lap traffic for Neil Wallace at Brands Hatch meant that old hand Ian Astley had to use every trick in his 30-years of experience to claw something back in the SVG-run G56.

Severe damage for the MacG Racing Mazda RX8 in round 1 meant they missed Brands Hatch, Callum Noble's BMW M3 can mix it with the Ginettas but had DNF last time out, and poor Will Stacey had the capability to win each time out in the Rob Boston Lotus Elise, but has had to adapt to ongoing niggles which culminated in a major engine



lunching at Brands Hatch. Class 2 is headed by current overall points leader Simon Clark, in the FormEvo Clark Racing Porsche 997. The experienced Porsche protagonist has swept the board in the class thus far, though competition comes from lone driver Arthur McMahon's Honda Civic, the ever-improving, all-smiling Paul Fullick /Tee Mathurin in the Team BRIT BMW 240i, and Dave May/Mark Skeats in the Nissan 370Z of the ultra-compact Abbey Motorsport team.



In Class 3, lone driver Will Puttergill tops the points table in his Honda Civic, but it's a closelyrun thing, with Paul Goodlad, driving with handcontrols in the JW Bird-entered VW Scirocco just three points behind, with the TSR #77 VW Golf, piloted this weekend by Rob Ellick and Tony Rodgers one point further adrift, while father-

and-son pairing Steve and Ed Cook will be chasing a podium place in their Civic.

The Clio class is ultra-competitive – don't be surprised to see the young guns worrying the tail-end of the Ginettas at the start! Dragon Sport's Travis Coyne and Jake Hewlett have scored best this season so far, with team boss Rhys Lloyd partnering Academy graduate Jack Meakin also well in contention,

while a rejuvenated Andy Tucker is enjoying a great season with Ollie Meadows in the High Row Motorsport Clio, as are James Harrison and Ben Jenkins, stablemates in the Max Coates run team,

and just one championship point separates Spires Motorsport's Craig Guest, and the experience of Simon Mason and Chris Bialan in the Sim Dynamics car. Brendan Haffner has made a clean sweep of the Ginetta G40



class so far, so perhaps it's time for Alex Turnbull to grace the top step of the podium in Cheshire.



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The points situation is close as the Championship heads to leafy Cheshire for Round 3 for, appropriately, a three-hour race, and stalwarts Ash Woodman and Martin Byford, in the EDF Cupra Leon TCR, retain their early lead of the title chase after another Class E win at Brands Hatch, though



the single points for pole and fastest lap were claimed elsewhere for that event.

At 61 points, they have just two points over new Class D leaders Neville and Chris Jones, assisted by pro-driver Matt George, who took the Venture Innovations GT4-spec Mercedes to class victory last time out, and they have just one point over Peter Montague and Stuart Hall, who's subliminal approach in the MKH Racing Aston Martin has reaped a win and a podium thus far. And while we're on Class D, tied on 46 points apiece are the Team BRIT McLaren 570S of Chris Overend/James Whitley, and the Breakell Racing Mercedes of



Ameerh Naran and reigning BEC champion Tom Jackson - both duos have proven pace, with poles and fastest laps in their performances so far, and the Team BRIT disabled pairing is well-matched, while pro-driver Jackson is coaching his protégé Naran to steady confidence.


At the front end of the race, we can expect Peter Erceg and Marcus Clutton, in the PB Racing / Enduro Audi R8 to contend for overall honours, a well-prepared car driven by an experienced amateur and arguably the country's most on-form GT driver being a formidable

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combination, though we didn't see the best of the stunning Venture Innovations Aston Martin Vulcan at Brands Hatch, eliminated after a first-lap accident, so maybe Gleb Stepanovs and Steve Tomkins can pull something out of the bag here at Oulton Park.



In Class C, erstwhile leaders Chris Goddard, Charlie Hand and Charlie Hollings suffered an early-race retirement at Brands, so will be looking for redemption in the RNR Performance



Cars Ferrari 458, so topping the class points table now is the Team HARD Porsche 991, after an emotional win at the Kentish track, where Brad Thurston, in his second GT race after graduating from Clios, was partnered by Team HARD's rising star Daryl DeLeon, in a squad managed by Matt Cherrington.

Regular partner Adam Hatfield should return this weekend, with DeLeon's role being fluid at the time of writing – he could remain as a threesome, and/or rejoin Maurice Henry in the team's Audi BTCC machine. In Class E, exclusively for TCR machines, while the Woodman/Byford combination have taken the wins, they can be matched for pace by Jonathan Beeson and George Heler in the Sheard Autosport Audi RS3, while EDF stablemates

Nick Hull and Richard Avery are enjoying podium finishes in their Cupra Leon too.

The Newbarn Racing Jaguar F-Type, now powered by a Chevy LS3 V8 mill, is proving successful, with brothers Adam and Callum Thompson collecting the Size L silverware



in Class F, while in the Ginetta Supercup category, current leaders Owen Hizzey and Scott Symons face new competition from long-term protagonists MacG Racing: with the team's Taranis now retired, Jonny MacGregor's side-hustle G55 comes to the fore, share with regular Trophy partner Josh Tomlinson.

Championship Details

After several years of competitive growth, Britcar broke new ground in 2022 as it debuted the Motorsport UKsanctioned British Endurance Championship – immediately making it the go-to place for endurance racing in the country.

Elevating the Britcar Endurance Championship up to National status, the British Endurance Championship retains a number of key features as its predecessor such as a warm-up, 30-minute qualifying and two and three-hour races which include mandatory pit stops.

Open to one and two-driver teams, the championship operates under a multi-class format with six categories creating a competitive environment for an eclectic variety of GT and touring cars – all of which are balanced in performance.

Continuing to grow in stature, the championship enjoys the support of high-profile partners such as Goodyear, Sunoco and Autotel. The British Endurance Championship also benefits from having all of its race meetings streamed live on Facebook and YouTube.


