In accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C14.3.2 I am satisfied that there is a significant and relevant new element which was unavailable to the parties seeking the review at the time of the decision concerned and upon investigation I find:

Cars 95 was issued with 10 second in race penalty for track limit violations. Team Manager (Baz Horne) requested a right of review and the issuing of the in race penalty.

No clear footage can be seen from onboard footage that Car 95 saw the Black/White Flag, and the race log does not confirm that the flag was shown, the driver admitted to seeing the 5 Second Penalty Board and continued to exceed track limits and was subsequently awarded a further 10 second penalty.

In light of the fact that the penalty was incorrectly applied I hereby rescind the 10 second penalty to car 95.

You are advised of your right of appeal.
