SLATER CLOSES ON TITLE

Freddie Slater has title glory in his sights as the Michelin Ginetta Junior Championship makes a long-awaited return to Cadwell Park this weekend, writes Simon Paice.

The Juniors last competed here in Lincolnshire in 2008, with eventual champion Dino Zamparelli taking

a double win. That was back when the series was running the G20 model, meaning this weekend marks the first time ever a grid of the current G40's will have tackled the 'mini-Nürburgring'.

Slater (R Racing) comes into the meeting with a mathematical

chance of securing the title after a phenomenal season to date. A perfect hat-trick of victories at Snetterton prior to the summer break means he has now sensationally won 14 of the 18 races contested this year.

That extraordinary run of results means Slater has now recorded more Junior victories than any other driver in the illustrious 15-year history of the championship, having also impressively led at least two laps in every single race so far this season.

To win the title this weekend with six races to spare, Slater will need to heavily outscore the chasing pack. They are led by Hugo Schwarze (Elite Motorsport), who is hugely impressive in his first-ever

season of car-racing with an overall victory at Donington Park and eight further podium finishes.

Mikey Porter (R Racing) lies third in the standings following a great recent run of results. He has been firmly knocking on the door of a maiden race victory, having remarkably finished second to his team-mate Slater in five of the last ten races.

Joining them in fighting at the front for R Racing, who are closing in on a third consecutive drivers' title this season, have been Reza Seewooruthun and Luca Hopkinson. A double rostrum last time out at Snetterton has moved Seewooruthun to three podiums for the year, one more than Hopkinson.

One of the in-form drivers coming into this weekend is Ginetta Junior scholar Chase Fernandez, who scored two wins during the G Fest event at Silverstone last month.



Finn Harrison, who has switched to Elite Motorsport, has also been mixing it at the front of the field with four podium finishes.

Alisha Palmowski (Elite Motorsport) is determined to put a tough recent run of races behind her and fight for race wins again, having scored a trio of second place finishes in the early rounds of the season. Team-mate Charlie Hart is another victory contender, with a couple of second places to his name too.

Mckenzie Douglass (Fox Motorsport) will be aiming to

return to the podium this weekend, while there is a group of drivers targeting their first piece of silverware. They are led by Henry Joslyn (Preptech UK), who has been a regular presence in the top six battles.

Edu Robinson (R Racing) comes to Cadwell Park in high spirits following a seasons' best fifth place finish last time out. Felix Livesey (Xentek Motorsport) has shown some great speed recently, while Fox Motorsport duo Harry Moss and Holly Miall are targeting breakthrough top ten finishes.





TITLE DUEL CONTINUES



Nick White and Ravi Ramyeed will continue their thrilling Ginetta GT Academy title battle this weekend as the championship races at Cadwell Park for the first time, writes Simon Paice.

White (Raceway Motorsport) and Ramyeed (Century Motorsport) have been the class of the field through the 2023 season so far, sharing 16 of the 17 race wins on offer and collecting 31 podium finishes between them.

Ramyeed has had the edge on his title rival in terms of race wins and pole positions, with nine of each compared to seven and five respectively for White. Unfortunately the second-year racer has had some misfortune through the year though, missing

out on the podium three times.

White meanwhile has used all of his racing experience and produced a remarkably consistent campaign, finishing in the top three in every single race so far. He's the in-form driver of the two also, having won four of the last five races to build a 13-point lead in the standings.

Mackenzie Walker (Assetto Racing) has been hot on the heels of the leading duo across recent events and after finishing in second place in three of the last four races he's contested, he's determined to break through and take to the top step of the podium for the first time this season.

Marc Elman (SVG Motorsport) is in good form having taken home GTA silverware in three of the last four races, while Thomas Shelley (Century Motorsport) is ready to bounce back from a tough recent run of results and add to his two podium visits to date.



The GT Academy features a rookie class too, where racing newcomers take their first steps in motorsport with an all-inclusive package from want2race. While this weekend is a non-points scoring round for the rookies, there's still bragging rights and winners trophies up for grabs.

Matt Shaw is the runaway class leader at this stage, winning 11 races so far. As well as aiming to add more trophies to his collection,

he'll also be trying to take the fight to White, Ramyeed and co at the front of the field, having taken best qualifying and race results of third overall this year.

Amy Tomlinson has secured nine rookie podium finishes across the season so far and is pushing for her maiden class victory, while Michael Orant is one to watch after picking up a trophy during an impressive debut at Snetterton last time out.





READE CHARGES ON

Luke Reade is closing in on becoming the inaugural champion in the Protire Motorsport Ginetta GT Championship heading into the final nine races of the season, writes Simon Paice.

Reade stamped his authority on the new championship from the off by taking the opening six wins of the season in his Ginetta G56 GTP, before adding another treble victory last time out at Snetterton

to further cement his place at the top of the standings.

The Wolf Motorsport ace now holds a 118-point championship lead, meaning it's a case of now or never for the chasing pack if they're to stop him joining an elite club of two-time Ginetta champions, having won the G55 Pro title in the GT4 SuperCup last season.

Reade's closest challenger in the points is Callum Davies (SVG Motorsport), who has put in some hugely impressive performances so far in his first-ever season of car-racing. A double podium at Snetterton moved him into double figures for the year, with a maiden win a clear target.



Carl Garnett (Breakell Racing) has enjoyed some great results on his return to Ginetta racing this season, taking to the podium on five occasions, while Ginetta veteran Colin White (CWS 4x4) has shown remarkable resilience on his comeback this year and secured four podiums of his own.

Ruben Hage (Breakell Racing) will be one to watch this weekend, as the only driver on the grid other than Reade to have won races this season. His success came with a glorious hat-trick of victories during the prestigious G Fest event at Silverstone last month.

Liona Theobald (SVG Motorsport) and Bal Sidhu (Xentek Motorsport) will also feature in the GT Pro class. Theobald has been a consistent presence in the top six this year, while Sidhu is set for his second event in a G56 after provisionally securing the GT5 Am class title over the first half of the season.

The GT5 Pro crown is still firmly up for grabs with three meetings remaining though, with Luke Garlick currently holding a 47-point lead over his Xentek Motorsport team-mate Ella Lloyd – those two having been part at the forefront of some sensational racing from the GT5 Challenge runners this year.

While Lloyd has outscored her adversary six to five in terms of race wins, some tough races for her means the more consistent Garlick

holds the points advantage with two more podium finishes and two less retirements to his name.

Sam Harvey has regularly been battling with his Xentek team-mates at the front of the class and has his sights set on securing a maiden win before the end of the year, while Karim Sekkat (Breakell Racing) has made big strides forward and picked up four podiums since stepping up from GT5 Am.





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

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

BLUE

(Steady)
Another competitor is close.
(Waved)
Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved)
Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.
(Double Waved)
Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.



YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.


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
