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#### 1.3 PASSES:

For those without permanent passes, electronic tickets will be sent to you directly by Knockhill, those aged 12 and under are admitted free of charge and those between the age of 13-16 will need a teen ticket.

Please note, there are no vehicle passes for marshals at this event. Under no circumstances will marshals cars be permitted in the paddock at any time.

## 1.4 SIGNING-ON:

- a) Officials will not sign-on at the meeting having previously completed signing on electronically using the <a href="mailto:BARC RevUp">BARC RevUp</a> system
- b) There will be race day programmes produced for the event however entry lists will also be available on the BARC website TOCA Race Meeting: Knockhill
- c) All marshals must see the chief marshal between the times below to confirm their attendance. Check in will take place as in the Marshals building next to Race Control at the times shown below;

d) The Post Chiefs Briefing will take place in the check in the Marshals building at the times shown above.

#### 1.5 ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION:

Engines must not be run before 08:35 or after 18:30 on both days.

Noise checks will take place at the entrance to the assembly area for all support categories.

#### 1.6 CIRCUIT ACCESS/PRACTICE AND QUALIFYING PROCEDURE

**BTCC** – These competitors are to follow the instructions within the Championship Regulations.

Support Races – For cars based in the main paddock area, please assemble in the designated assembly area. For practice, you will be released in to the Pit Lane prior to being signalled to go out onto the circuit. For race, you will be signalled to go out onto the circuit, behind an official vehicle, to complete one lap of the circuit prior to forming on the grid.

At the end of qualifying and races support competitors will take the chequered flag and complete a full "slowing down" lap pulling into the pit lane and proceeding direct to Parc Fermé without stopping, except those required for ITV interviews. Parc Fermé is accessed by turning left after Race Control and then left again.

There is a one-way system in operation within the paddock and you are asked to follow the signage when going to the assembly area and returning from Parc Fermé to your paddock space.

#### 1.7 LIVE SNATCH:

There is provision for "live snatch" at this meeting but only under the Safety Car.

## 1.8 RED FLAGS:

Any category which generates a "red flag" may be placed toward the end of the schedule subject to time being available.

## 1.9 JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this meeting remain unaltered except that paperwork will be dealt with electronically.

Any protest or appeal needs to be lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting or the Clerk of the Course using the email addresses provided.

Once a decision has been made it will be announced verbally and passed by email to those concerned. The time limits for any protest or appeal remain unaltered.











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#### 1.10 RESULTS & NOTICE BOARD:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions.

#### 1.12 SOCIAL MEDIA

#### 1.13 SAFEGUARDING:

A number of officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention. Issues can be raised by contacting the senior clerk of the course at the event or contacting a safeguarding officer whose details can be found within the <u>BARC Safeguarding Guidelines</u> and the contact details below.

#### 1.14 MARSHALS MATTERS:

Marshals parking will be on the rallycross circuit for both days. Access the circuit through paddock brae and park either side of the start-line leaving a clear space in the middle of the track, then proceed to the rallycross track to park up after signing on. A packed lunch will be provided to all trackside marshals on both Saturday and Sunday.

Marshals Camping will behind the kart centre. The area is suitable for both tents and caravans with both toilets and showers available but without any power hook-ups. There will not be any campsite wristbands issued. We would ask that there is no noise after mid-night each night, that there are no open fires and no animals.

Post allocations will be advised at check in and please remember you should not use mobile phones or cameras while on duty unless it is necessary to send a report to Race Control.

No private cars are allowed in the paddock under any circumstances. Any private cars found in the paddock will be towed away.

If you are unable to attend, please contact the Competitions Department and return any passes to BARC (See below), if after 17:00 Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> August, please also contact the Chief Marshal.

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#### **Special Note A:**

Because the race cars are fitted with an in-car signalling system at this meeting, we will operate the circuit light panels as the primary route of signalling to competitors. The role of marshals is still critical in displaying signals via the light control panel in order to both provide protection to their fellow marshals working trackside as well as the delivery of signals to the competitors.

In all cases the light panel should be the default signalling option followed by flags if required. A set of flags will be available on all posts and these are to be used in the following situations:

- a) when there is a system failure,
- b) when the light panels are displaying an alternative signal,
- c) when the marshals post does not have a light control panel

The display of the red lights and safety car signals around the circuit will be undertaken by race control and in certain circumstances marshals may find that race control has adjusted the lights being displayed. Marshals will remain responsible for the display of the Hazard Board.

This change of procedure is in accordance with Motorsport UK regulations and is being employed to enable more visible signals to be given to competitors.

#### **Special Note B:**

The BTCC & Support Races are part of the Motorsport UK Future of Scrutineering Trial which means that a minimum of 25% of the competitors in each championship will be selected for full physical scrutineering with the remaining competitors completing a self-declaration form.



# **2023 SAFETY BULLETIN**

This safety bulletin supports TOCA and BARC 2023 Health and Safety Guidance, Supplementary Regulations and Final Instructions

## 1. VEHICLES, SCOOTERS, BUGGIES & QUADS

- The use of quad bikes and buggies must be covered by 3<sup>rd</sup> party insurance when driven within the confines of the venue.
- · No mini-bikes, scooters or 2-wheeled transport allowed.
- · Observe venue speed limit at all times.
- · Absolutely NO electric stand-on scooters.







## 2. SAFE BUGGY AND QUAD USE

- · Only drive if you hold a valid licence
- Do not leave keys in ignition
- Observe maximum speed limits at all times
- Observe one-way systems at all times
- · No carrying of unsecured loads
- · No riding on equipment trolleys
- · All passengers must be seated



## 3. WORKING AT HEIGHT

## **NEVER STAND ON A ROOF WITHOUT PROTECTION FROM FALLING**

- Put up secure side barriers
- Use clipped on full safety harness
- Use a secured ladder / steps
- · All ladders must be "footed"
- Only use ladders and steps to EN 131
- Ensure equipment is not damaged





#### 4. SPECTATING

- Do not spectate from tail lifts / trailer roofs
- · Only spectate from truck roofs if appropriate safe access and barriers are in place.
- . Do not climb on / spectate from venue infrastructure e.g. waste bins, fencing or generators



## 5. HOT WORKS AND FUEL

- · Keep fuel storage to a minimum and in a safe location
- · Keep extinguisher suitable for fuel fire close by
- Comply with all refuelling regulations
- Refuel when engine is turned off and cooled
- Keep fuel away from ignition sources





## 6. CABLES AND TAIL-LIFTS

- · Securely cover hoses and cables .
- · Tail lifts should not be left unattended at halfway point.
- · Consider using "Tensabarriers" to avoid pedestrians walking under lifts
- · Use harnesses or guardrails where possible or appropriate
