Additional Information / Reasons for Decision
On Lap 26 of Race 2 after an attempted overtaking manouvre on Car 99 Car 57 ran wide on the exit of turn 1 , in an attempt to rejoin the circuit before Turn 2 and thus avoiding cutting the Corner Car 57 joined side by side with Car 99 , on running over the kerbs on re-joining Car 57 slid towards car 99, in taking avoiding action Car 99 ran slightly wide on the exit of Turn 3 causing it to spin, narrowly avoiding the barriers at Turn 3. At no point prior to Car 99 running wide was there less than one cars width of track.
I do not deem the manner in which Car 57 re-joined as dangerous, I also deem that Car 57 left enough room on the exit of turn 2 for Car 99.
Onboard footage reviewed from Cars 57, 99 and from the car behind, Car 14. Also considered was the ITV footage of the race.
Therefore I consider it a racing incident and take no further action.
