## Additional Information / Reasons for Decision:

Car 17 ran through the gravel trap at Turn 7 (McLeans) whilst a live snatch was in progress.

Onboard footage from Car 17 viewed and driver interviewed. The driver of Car 17 acknowledged this situation.

In addition 4 championship and 4 category points are deducted for this infringement.
Accordingly under G5.3.2, I order that you:


Be given a verbal warning [0 points]
Have the following lap times disallowed (Q12.27)
Be given this formal written reprimand [2 points]
Be fined the sum of $£ \quad(M a x £ 1,095)$ [3 points]
Be given a place grid penalty effective on your next race [3 points]
Be penalised by the addition of to your elapsed race time [3 points]
Be penalised by the addition of position(s) to your race finishing position [3 points]
Be disqualified from practice and your practice times are disallowed* [4 points]
Be disqualified from the results of the race [4 points]
Be disqualified from the results of the meeting [6 points]
Additional Championship Penalty:

4 Penalty points are recorded on your licence as a result of above
