Following investigations I find that you are guilty of contravening Motorsport UK regulation C1.1.6, namely:

Q12.24.3 - (e) Waved Yellow - overtaking or not slowing down between incident and green flag (Q12.24.5)

Additional Information / Reasons for Decision:

Car 27 set a fast lap with yellow lights displayed between Copse and Maggots.

Driver of Car 27 interviewed and onboard footage viewed. Yellow lights visible on circuit and in-car. TSL timing shows Car 27 set a lap time of 58.239 during the period of time when the yellow lights were displayed.

Accordingly under G5.3.2, I order that you:
