SIZING GUIDE

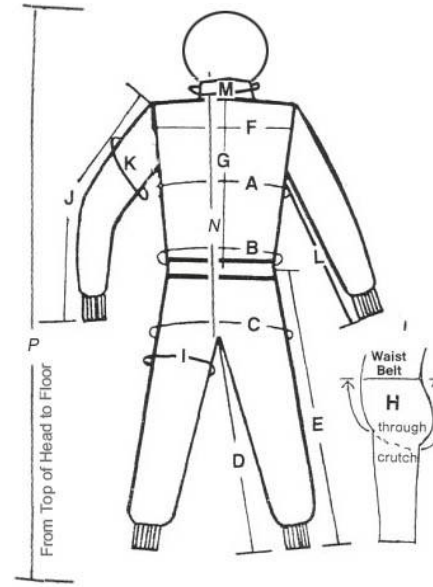
Standard Sizing

All sizes are based on chest size, to measure the chest use a flexible tape under one arm pit and wrap round to the other. The tape should be held below the arm pit at the lowest point where the shirt body meets the sleeve. (Length “A” on the illustration)

Made-to-measure sizing

To order bespoke made-to-measure racewear you must first make the following measurements. It's best to have someone help you make some of these measurements :

- A. Chest. To measure the chest use a flexible tape under one arm pit and wrap round to the other. The tape should be held below the arm pit at the lowest point where the shirt body meets the sleeve.
- B. Waist. Measure around the smallest part of your torso keeping your tape measure comfortable loose. (Should be somewhere below the rib cage and above the belly button).
- C. Hips. Stand with heels together, measure around the fullest part of the hips whilst keeping the tape level.
- D. Inside Leg. Stand up straight with your feet shoulder width apart, measure from top of inside leg at crotch to your ankle bone.
- E. Outside Leg. Stand up straight and measure from the top of the waist band, where you would normally wear your trousers, measure down to your desired length. Do not look down or bend down as this may affect the measurement.



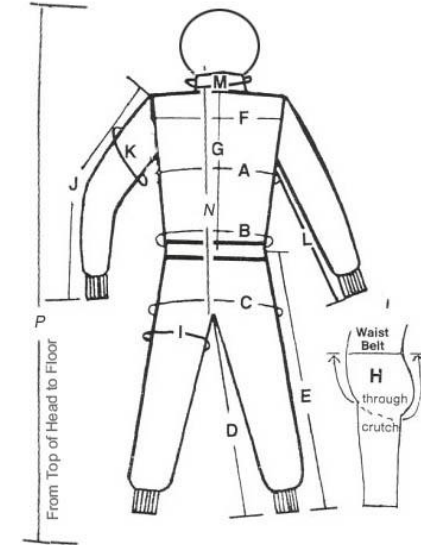
SIZING GUIDE CONTINUED

- F. Across Back. With arms straight down at your side measure horizontally across the back from one tip of the shoulder to the other.
- G. Neck to Waist Back. From the back measure from the base of the neck to waist.
- H. Waist to Waist (through crotch). Stand up straight, place one end of the tape on your back at the top of the waist and measure down and around to the waist at the front. Keep tape loose for comfort.
- J. Outside Arm. Stand up straight, bend arm slightly and measure from the top of your shoulder on the top of your arm, over the elbow and down to the wrist.
- K. Inside Arm. Place the end of the measuring tape high in the arm pit and measure down to the wrist bone.
- M. Shirt Collar Size. Measure around the fullest part of your neck.

- N. Back Of Neck to Crotch. At back measure vertically from nape of neck down to crotch, halfway between legs, bending slightly forwards.
- P. Height (From head to toe). Measure from the top of your head down to the ground.

TIPS ON HOW TO MEASURE YOURSELF

- 1) Get a flexible tape measure, not a steel tape or ruler.
- 2) When measuring wear the clothing that you would normally be wearing under your race suit.
- 3) Allow for movement and flexibility, a race suit should not be a tight fit.
- 4) For the best results take measurements a few times and if you need help ask someone to take the measurements for you.

Marshals attending BARC events earn 'Reward Stamps'. These are redeemable against items from the club's merchandise range, membership shop and more including these overalls.

Marshals can claim back the cost of the ["Official BARC Marshal Suit"](#) to a maximum amount of £99.50 in exchange for **30 stamps**.

Please note that for those who purchase either the ["Made-to-Measure"](#) or ["Two Piece Suit - Made-to-Measure"](#), you can only claim the **first £99.50** of the cost of the overalls.

Marshals Stamps don't cover the cost of the extras such as additional pockets, or the personalised name badge.

Additional Notes

Please note you must purchase your overalls from Lille for their full amount either via the links opposite or by telephone.

An invoice will be provided, after which you can submit the claim via the electronic claim form at the link below (preferred), a hard copy is available upon request from the office.

You must upload a scan or clear picture to the online form or include a copy with your postal claim otherwise the claim will be void.
