BRITISH ENDURANCE CHAMPIONSHIP

SUPERB SUPERCARS REVVED UP FOR SNETTERTON

Two weeks on from a pulsating season-opener at Donington Park, the British Endurance Championship in association with Motorsport UK continues its 2024 season this weekend with a two-hour contest around Snetterton.

Based on the performances of a fortnight ago, the front-end of Saturday's headline attraction should feature the points-topping Audi R8 GT3 of Peter Erceg, who is sharing driving duties with regular co-driver Marcus Clutton, and the Lamborghini GT3 of John Seale and Jamie Stanley.

Nick Hull and Richard Avery certainly had the pace to take the fight to them however in their new Class B Porsche 992, while Class C's Bonamy Grimes and Johnny Mowlem could well grace the overall podium in their FF Corse Ferrari 458.

Class D, which is for GT4 machines, looks set to be as competitive as ever and the Xentek Motorsport Porsche Cayman of Bal Sidhu and Josh Steed will be eager to maintain their perfect start with back-to-back victories.

The contenders are lining up though with Mike McCollum and Sean Cooper will be looking to re-establish their top position in the category in their Track Focused KTM X-Bow, while the Team BRIT pairing of Aaron Morgan and Paul Fullick in a McLaren 570S and championship newcomers Carl Garnett and Harley Haughton, in a Breakell Racing Mercedes, have showed early promise.

Another name to throw into the hat is the SVG Motorsport BMW GT4 of Neil Wallace and Ian Astley. They've not been seen in race conditions yet but are tipped as being a potential front runner.

In Class E, Chris Bialan and Simon Mason were nursing damage issues in the Jabbasport Cupra last time out, and the class win went to the vastly improved Paul Curran and Jamie Callender in their Mercedes BTCC.

Chris Murphy took a stealthy class win in his BMW GTR, though the Newbarn Jaguar F-Type of Callum and Adam Thompson is now a competitive threat, while Ray Harris made a stunning lone effort in a self-run Ginetta G55 in Class G, with the win going to the similar MacG Racing machine of Jonny MacGregor and French-Texan Arthur Simondet.

The Britcar Trophy Championship blasted into life at Donington Park two weeks ago and delivered an Easter extravaganza - which included two action-packed races that has set up a captivating prospect here at Snetterton.

When it comes to the lay of the land in the series, the Ginetta stronghold has seemingly been breached, thanks no less to Chris Bialan and Simon Mason who took a famous race two victory in their Jabbasport Cupra.

The duo beat the erstwhile-dominant trio of Datum Motorsport Ginetta G56As of Marco Anastasi, Maurizio Sciglio and Axel Van Nederveen, as well as Century Motorsport's Stephen Fresle and Ben Green. Seb Dubois did manage to take a Ginetta win.

The BMW M3s of Bryan Bransom and Jas Sapra, and lone driver Lee Goldsmith, could have been in contention too if it wasn't for poor fortune.

The TSR team may have their Audi A3 ready, but if not, the Rob Ellick and Mark Jones partnership will run their Audi TT in Class 2, where international ace Nigel Greensall can set the track alight in the BMW E36 he shares with David Gooding. EDF's Dave Farrow and Martin Byford share another BMW, while Tony Whitney campaigns his Porsche 911.

Look out, too, for the Team BRIT BMW 240i, brimful of talent with Asha Silva and Noah Cosby. The squad also field a BMW 1-Series in Class 3 for Dom Shore and Caleb McDuff, and they compete against Alex Turnbull in the little Ginetta G40, but the sensation thus far has been Irish teenager Daire Flock in the Westbourne Gen 5 Renault Clio.

In the dedicated, and very competitive Clio class, it's too close to call, and name names, it could go any number of ways. Friendly rivals Dragon Sport (the reigning champions) and High Row Motorsport mix young prodigious talent with experienced maturity in their driver line-ups - while smaller squads such as Spires Motorsport and MacG Racing are always in the podium mix.

The Mission Motorsport Caterham Seven 270R Championship will crown a new champion this year and the battle for the coveted 2024 prize begins this weekend with a triple-header around the Snetterton 300 circuit.

Firmly established as the 'coming of age' category on the Caterham Motorsport ladder, the championship has seen a host of names pass through its door and this year's crop - which boasts more than 40 names - is revved up and ready to go.

Last year's title winner Freddie Chiddicks has graduated to the 310R ranks and that has left the door wide open for a driver to stake their claim as the next 270R champion.

Ben Timmons - who clinched the Roadsport crown in 2023 - is someone that's not to be overlooked as he's expected to be in contention alongside Lyonel Tollemache, Rob Kennerley, Zach Lower, Nick Bryant and James McCullough.

The Weightman name features heavily this weekend with Luke, Adam and Mike all getting behind the wheel whilst Toby Ballard, Simon Sabin, Ryan Wilby and former Academy champion Daniel Neale will also have their sights set on the front of the field.

Contenders keep on coming as you glance down the entry list too with Oliver Kibbelwhite, Harvey Lawrence, Andrew Bailey, Gareth Lucas, Tony Jenner, Giles Perry and Benja Hedley all featuring.

Throw into the mix Solomon Rogers, Ian Summers, David Rooke, Neil Warnock, Mikey Clark, Craig Boyle and Darren Butler and the enormity of how stacked the weekend's Norfolk curtain-raiser becomes apparent.

Three blockbuster encounters are scheduled for this weekend and with an abundance of points up for grabs, gaining an early advantage will be key in laying down a marker for the remainder of the campaign in the Mission Motorsport Caterham Seven 270R Championship.

Returning contenders and a host of front-running graduates make up the entry list for the opening rounds of the Motul Caterham Seven 310R Championship at Snetterton this weekend; and it promises to be an unmissable spectacle.

Providing the perfect proving ground for those drivers that one day want to progress to the Seven UK Championship, the 310R category has become a must-see attraction on the Caterham Motorsport ladder and this year it boasts another stacked line-up.

The battle for overall honours looks set to be fiercely fought over and one driver that is expected to be in the hunt is Lars Alexander Hoffman, who was a multiple race winner during the 2023 campaign.

Hoffman will be up against some stiff opposition for the coveted crown with both Taylor O'Flanagan and Hugo Bush - who enjoyed their own successes last year -

taking their place on the starting grid for another eagerly-anticipated season.

Another returning podium contender is David Jones while the likes of Ben Lopez Appleton, Ryan Lovett, Geoff Price, Harry Cook and Steven Lancaster will be looking to build on the experience they gained in the series last time out.

Freddie Chiddicks has proven himself to be quick in pretty much any series and after triumphing in the 270R Championship last year, he makes the step up to the 310R ranks; he's guaranteed to be one to watch.

Elsewhere, the trio of Philip Bianchi, Rob Bullen and Tom Wyllys have undeniable speed that could see them become forces at the front of the field while Marc Jones and William Wood are also out to make an impression on their rivals.

Completing the grid for this weekend's opening three bouts around the near three-mile Norfolk circuit is Graham MacDonald, Steve Metcalfe, Duncan Mallett, Alex Vincent and Christopher Welch.

Throw into the mix the formidable Neville Sykes, Giles Hanson, Robert Cowin, Dean Pollen, Stephen Trinder and Adam Kene and you begin to see why the fight to be crowned champion this year is set to be wide open.

Also featuring on the entry list and hoping to stake their claim includes Lee James, Myles Eynon, Istvan Demes, Neil Bell, Paul Goldstein, Norman Jeeves, Ann Hall and Monty Hinde.

Two races are slated on the timetable for the Bilstein Caterham Roadsport Championship and both are not worth missing out on - especially if the evidence of previous years is anything to go on.

As always, the battle for supremacy is set to be fierce with Thompson set to come up against a host of capable contenders including Paul Donkin, Chris Fraser, Jake Swann and Mike Evans.

The trio of Oliver Smith, Ben Simonds

and Matt Dyer showcased their quality on occasions in 2023 and all three are back and looking to build upon the experience that they built up previously.

One driver that will be well worth keeping an eye on is the rapid Harry Senior. A two-time champion in Caterham Graduates, Senior jumps across the Seven UK grid this weekend and will undoubtedly be out to make his mark.

Other names that can't be discounted from being in the mix towards the sharp end of the grid either include Carl Jones, Finlay Cooper, Gary Curtis, Justin Armstrong and Ian Payne.

Rounding out the entry list for what promises to be a pulsating season-opener is the quintet of Richard Amos, Tim Dickens, Wesley Payne, Angus Maclaine and Tom Eden.

With three races scheduled to take place around the challenging Snetterton 300 layout this weekend, expect full-throttle thrills from the get-go when it comes to the Caterham Seven UK Championship.

The new Vertu MINI CHALLENGE Trophy season bursts into life this weekend at Snetterton, with a total of 25 cars set to hit the track for the opening three races of the new campaign.

As usual, the entry features a blend of raw rookies and experienced racers all chasing championship honours, and if recent years are anything to go by, then a hard-fought battle for the crown lies ahead.

Having taken the title with Tom Ovenden in 2023, local outfit EXCELR8 returns with no fewer than seven cars led by podium finisher Gabe Fairbrother, who showed encouraging progress across his rookie season.

Luca Marinoni Osborne was also a top-three finisher last year and is back for another crack at the series, with Harvey Riby, Katia Loggie and Ben Taylor all returning for a second season. Newcomers Tommy Watson and John Castle - both of whom are eligible for the Directors Cup - round out the line-up.

Graves Motorsport has five cars on the entry for the opening weekend, with Alex Solley the highest-placed returning driver

and arguably the man to beat in the title race. Solley is once again joined by fellow race winner Alex Keens as well as James Black and Frankie Taylor, with Leo Purches rounding out the line-up as the youngest driver on the grid.

On the back of an impressive debut season, Chandler Motorsport expands to run five cars, with rookie champion Rhys Hurd now setting his sights firmly on overall honours. Hurd is again joined by Reece Lycett whilst team boss Steven Chandler will line up alongside the pair on track after a toe-in-the-water outing at the end of 2023. Rookies Cameron Wood and Ronnie Smith will both make their series debuts this weekend.

Westbourne Motorsport were race winners at Snetterton last season with Max Hall, and whilst he has moved on to the JCW category, both Harry Hickton and Sam Gornall are back in a two-car line-up.

Former champions PerformanceTek will run a pair of cars for Jamie Keates and Callum Eason, with Team Avago also running two cars for Joshua Wilby and Louis Fleet. Two single-car entries round out the grid, with Paul Manning returning with Mannpower Motorsport and Ashley Gregory chasing silverware with her family-run team.

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close.

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(Double Waved) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.



YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
