The Clerk of the Course has instigated a "Right of Review"

for him to review, in accordance with C.14.1.1 of the General Regulations, the following decision(s) made by him (The Clerk of the Course) at the above Competition:

The Clerk of the Course, having examined the race log, TSL timing data and his own records summoned and heard from Mr Craig Storey to determine the following:

That the Clerk of the Course gave a Verbal Warning to Mr Storey stating that he was in breach of Regulation Q12.24.3 by setting a faster lap whilst yellow signals were being displayed

Decision: there is significant and relevant new element which was unavailable to the parties seeking the review at the time of the decision concerned.

Reason:

The Clerk of the Course made an error in interpreting the data provided by TSL and subsequently summoned Mr Storey to a Judicial hearing, along with several other drivers who were being investigated for the same offence.

Competitors are reminded that, in accordance with C14.3.1 of the General Regulations, this decision is not subject to appeal.

In accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C14.3.2 I am satisfied that there is a significant and relevant new element which was unavailable to the parties seeking the review at the time of the decision concerned and upon investigation I find:

Mr Storey was not actively competing at the time when the yellow signal was being displayed, and had retired from the race on Lap 7 and classed as DNF
I, the Clerk of the Course, made an error when looking at the race log and the timing data.

I therefore rule that Mr Storey has the Verbal Warning rescinded
In addition, Caterham Motorsport gave Mr Storey 1 Behavioral Warning Point as per Championship regulations for receiving the Verbal Warning.
I therefore rule that Mr Storey has the Behavioral Warning Point rescinded.

I have apologised to Mr Storey for the error and any upset this may have caused

This Right of Review was conducted in private by the Clerk of the Course and the Competitor only, via telephone.
