In accordance with Motorsport UK NCR Ch.2, App.10, Art.1.14 I am satisfied that there is a significant and relevant new element which was unavailable to the parties seeking the review at the time of the decision concerned and upon further investigation I find:

On board video shows car 21 loosing control and triggering the track limit sensor and then he goes through the gravel trap.

Therefore the issuing of a track limit penalty for the incident was incorrect.

The time penalty of 5 seconds issued for track limits is therefore also incorrect.

5 second time penalty for car 21 to be rescinded.

You are advised of your right of appeal under NCR Ch.2, App.4.
