In accordance with Motorsport UK NCR Ch.2, App.10, Art.1.14 I am satisfied that there is a significant and relevant new element which was unavailable to the parties seeking the review at the time of the decision concerned and upon further investigation I find:

On board video shows the breach of track limits was on lap 19. This was just before the race was stopped using the red flag on lap 20

The results of the race was declared at the end of lap 18, the track limit infringement was after the race had ended, so wasn't during the race.

Right to review upheld, fee returned. 5 second time penalty imposed for a third track limit round 3 rescinded.
