So far, it's all been Silverstone, and it's all been Steve Gambrell and Dan Lloyd for the overall wins, the first-season novice and his BTCC-winning co-driver having starred in the Toro Verde Porsche 991 up to now, though seasoned campaigners Bon Grimes and Johnny Mowlem's attempt at victory last time out in the Ferrari 488 was thwarted by a penalty and the Safety Car.

They are ones to watch in the Challenge class, as are John Seale/Jamie Stanley's 488, Mark and Peter Cunningham's Porsche, and the similar Amspeed machines of Dom Malone and Ash Muldoon. There are three contenders sharing the top points as we come into the third round at Snetterton – the aforementioned Gambrell and Lloyd, GT class leaders Chris Bingham/Michael Lyons, and – no strangers to the top step of the podium – Maurizio Sciglio and Marco Anastasi, heading the Ginetta class, all

sharing 90 points. The Team BRIT McLarens of Noah Cosby/Caleb McDuff and Aaron Morgan/Paul Fullick are strong contenders in the GT class, as is lone driver Martin Addison's Aston Martin, while David Fielder took the class win last time out in his BMW GTR, and we shouldn't forget guest entry Harry Barton's BMW. Datum Motorsport are filling the Ginetta class – as well as the class leaders, newcomer Nick Casey and Adriano Medeiros were the fastest in class in the last round and are joined this weekend by Dave May and Mark Skeats.

There is no clear leader in the Trophy class – the Mazda of Jonny MacGregor/Josh Tomlinson tops the points, but the Ginetta of Ian and Elliott Wilson, and the Woodrow BMWs of Ione drivers Calum Bates and Chris Murphy are all front runners in a strong class, but it could all be thrown out by BTCC champion Colin Turkington turning up, partnering Mark Smith in an Amspeed BMW. In the Cup Class, the BMW 240i of Asha Silva and Bobby Trundley has a slender lead over the BMW 130 of Dennis Storey/ Alan McCullough, and in the TCR class, Ash Woodman will be aware of Rob Ellick/Fynn Jones now finding their feet.

CHASE IS ON AS WILLIAMS LOOKS TO ASSERT COUPE CUP DOMINANCE

The OT Coupe Cup with Toyo Tires arrives at Snetterton for the third event of the 2025 season.

After a thrilling pair of races at Thruxton, Nathan Williams has every reason to feel confident coming into rounds five and six. The youngster put his Cursley Motorsport Coupe on pole position, and monstered to both race wins – but the results did not show the whole story!

Race One saw Nathan run away at the front, while huge battle packs broke out behind him. A strong return from Don Gillies saw him battling at the front, alongside Wayne Rockett, Neale Hurren and Harvey Cursley. Adam Jones fell back at the start and had to work his way back through the field, while an incident between Max Papworth and Matthew Watson left Papworth with plenty of work to do. Sean Jones visited the barriers at the final chicane, which left his Coupe with some war wounds.

A tangle at the rear of the field between Spencer Hirons and Gary Hobbs left both facing the wrong way, but both lived to fight another day. Williams leapt to his second win of the season, with Wayne Rockett returning to the Series and the podium with second, and Adam Jones climbing back to third.

Race Two was a different scenario entirely: Williams didn't get his own way at the start and dropped to third, allowing Wayne Rockett and Dan Fletcher into the top two spots. Adam Jones staved in touch in a close fourth, while battling ensued in the mid pack. Jones and Williams managed to muscle their way into first and second heading into the final lap of the race, with Rockett and Fletcher close behind - contact through the final chicane gave way to a photo finish; Jones got the win on the road but was demoted due to a penalty after the race, handing Williams win number three in the Coupe Cup. But the biggest smiles were in the Fletcher camp. Dan had finally achieved his ambition, a podium finish, and where better than his home circuit?

All drivers will be eager to jump back into their racing machines at Snetterton, but none more than Adam Jones. Can he bring the fight to Nathan Williams? Will Dan achieve another podium, or can he aim a step higher? Who will come out on top when the OT Coupe Cup with Toyo Tires arrives at Snetterton?"

FLAG SIGNALS





BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(**Double Waved**) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit



YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
