TCR UK CHAMPIONSHIP

SHEPHERD LEADS THE PACK AS TCR UK SPEEDS INTO CROFT

We welcome you to Croft in North Yorkshire for rounds 9, 10 & 11 of the 2025 TCR UK Touring Car Championship. It's a pleasure to have you join us as we reach the halfway point of the 2025 season.

Adam Shepherd leads the way in the points, however, his rivals have closed in after a challenging weekend at Silverstone, where he salvaged a podium from the three races, whilst switching to the latest version of the CUPRA Leon VZ TCR.

Pole position, two wins and a second place from the Silverstone Triple Header now puts Steve Laidlaw in second place in the standings, just nine points behind Shepherd after dropped scores are accounted for.

Callum Newsham also reaped the benefits of a successful weekend at the home of British motorsport, as his two second places and race three victory put him a further three points behind Laidlaw Senior.

Croft provides the final triple-header event of the season, so three good scores for any of these drivers, or others further down the championship, could change everything in the title chase.

Open Paddock Access across the weekend also adds to the fantastic atmosphere that many enjoy at a TCR UK weekend, allowing the fans to get up close and personal with the drivers, teams and cars.

With over 30 championships around the globe, the TCR concept has revolutionised Touring Car Racing since it was first launched in 2014. Built by manufacturer-approved constructors to comply with carefully controlled technical regulations and FIA homologation, TCR Touring Cars are governed by a Global Balance of Performance to keep all cars equal.

Prepare to witness the thrilling on-track touring car action that is the TCR UK Touring Car Championship as Croft provides the next exciting chapter in the 2025 season.

MILLTEK CIVIC CUP

CIVIC CUP READY TO HIT THE HALFWAY MARKER IN NORTH YORKSHIRE

Croft in Yorkshire plays host to the halfway point of the 2025 Milltek Civic Cup season. The June event will see rounds 9, 10 & 11 in the year's final triple header.

The opening eight races have seen five winners so far, with championship leader Alistair Camp taking two wins, Lewis Kent has three wins to his name, whilst Jack Ruddell, Liam McGill and Dave Marshall have one each.

As we reach the halfway stage, championship points now include dropped scores, so every point counts between now and the end of the season. Camp leads the way with a cushion of 13 points over Kent, with McGill in third, a further 12 points back.

Area Motorsport drivers hold the top six places in the Drivers' Championship, with Harvey Caton, Wesley Swain, and Jake Hewlett completing the positions.

Marshall is the first non-Area Motorsport driver in seventh place, ahead of Jack Ruddell and Motion Motorsports Matt Wilkins, who also leads the way in the Goodyear Diamond Award points.

Josh Bromley has taken three Paul Winfield Trophy wins this year, for drivers who are less experienced in the Milltek Civic Cup, and with this improvement in form, claims the tenth spot in the Drivers' Championship ahead of this weekend.

An Open Paddock Access across both days means that the fans can have a look around the teams and the cars, getting the chance to take a further look at the EP3 and FN2 models, which will go head-to-head using a Balance of Performance to keep all cars equal.

Set for three more thrilling chapters of the 2025 season, we look forward to three exciting races across the Croft weekend, as the Milltek Civic Cup provides an amazing spectacle of what is the toughest one-make, tin-top championship in the UK.

BATTLE FOR SUPREMACY SET TO HEAT UP IN JSCC

The Junior Saloon Car Championship reaches the halfway mark of the 2025 season at Croft this weekend and at the top of the standings, the battle for supremacy is start to ramp up.

Providing the first step on the motorsport for talented teenagers, the one-make series has underlined its status as one of the UK's premier categories for junior racing this year with plenty of captivating wheel-to-wheel moments.

Arriving in North Yorkshire sitting atop the standings is Wilf Butler who has recently ignited his championship challenge with three wins in the last four races - and he'll be hoping to maintain that sort of form as the chasing pack is hot on his heels.

The trio of Luca Masarati, Josh Salvadorai and Oliver Kerr have all also stood on the top step of the podium this year and they, along with Butler, are blanketed by just 36 points heading into this weekend's triple-

header.

Completing the top five - and aiming to make in-roads into the quartet ahead of him - is Lewis Standard while leading rookie Ollie Smith and Kyle Wells can't be discounted either after both enjoying their strongest showings of the year last time out at Silverstone.

It will come as no surprise that the depth of JSCC talent doesn't stop there with the likes of Max Scharfegger, Louis Austin, Matthew Swattom, Scholarship winner Martin Wright and Tom Algar also ones that are well worth keeping an eye on.

Rounding out the ultra-competitive entry list is Joe Wood, Lexie Powell, Leon Holly, SherrieAnn Powell, Timothy Leonard and Bailey Roberts.

Full-throttle thrills are never far away when the Junior Saloon Car Championship is in town so buckle up and enjoy the show.

The Track Action Racing Club speeds into North Yorkshire this weekend for the latest chapter of what is proving to be an action-packed 2025 campaign.

Following trips to Brands Hatch, Thruxton and Silverstone, the budget-conscious tin top series rolls into Croft with another ultra-competitive grid poised to go wheel-to-wheel for the bragging rights that are on offer.

The Deutsche Marques Cup is the first of several multi-marques categories that make up the grid, with this one being for those that have an interest in driving cars that have been manufactured in Germany.

Former BARC President's Cup winner Paul Roddison has been one of the headline names in his Skoda Octavia this year however others to have made their mark include Adam Croft in a VW Scirocco, Trevor Algar in a BMW Compact and Grant Hatfield in a MINI Cooper.

Both the Tricolore Trophy and the Peugeot 206 GTi Cup has good representation this weekend and it will come as no surprise that this is where those wanting to hustle French-built machines will be competing

over the course of the weekend.

William Di Claudio has been one of the standout talents of the grid so far this season so expect to see his Peugeot 106 GTI in the battle right towards the front of the field. Andrew Mitchell, Mervyn Beckett, Jacob Baldry and Noah Checkley will fight in their Peugeot 206 GTI.

Completing the Track Action field is the Nippon Challenge, the race series for modified and production spec Japanese and Asian cars.

Gary Prebble swept aside the opposition at Thruxton in his Honda Civic last month and if he decides to partake in proceedings this weekend then you can expect him to be one to watch. Anthony Allitt is another to watch in his Honda Civic too.

CATERHAM GRADUATES POISED FOR CROFT TRIPLE-HEADER

Croft sets the stage for an epic triple-header event, the summer midpoint of the P4 Emergency Lighting CGRC Championship season and a chance to review the current standings.

One of the largest single-make championships in the UK, the CGRC Championship is a series that has proven to be a smash-hit with the emphasis firmly on cost-effective racing.

Tom McEwing had a perfect weekend last time out at Silverstone with class wins and fastest laps in both races, continuing to be the man to beat in the Sigma 135 championship this year.

Thomas Gunter and Giles Derry may well be up to the challenge both having taken a 2nd and a 3rd a piece themselves; likewise Neil Warnock and Paul Armitage who also picked up a haul of points and were right in the mix throughout.

Meanwhile in the Sigma 150's it was

Stephen Clark and Paul Goldstein (last year's 135 champion) who took two very hard-fought wins (one each) with Harry Cramer, Rob Warner and Andy Whitton close on their heels; those precious points will be all-important as the top of the leaderboard is very tight indeed.

Croft will also see a strong showing in the CGRC Trophy (the 3 driver-selected round option for drivers looking for a more flexible/budget-friendly season) - 20 drivers have nominated Croft as one of their scoring entries, among them Jamie Elwood (last year's Sigma 150 champion) who currently tops the trophy points scoreboard for 150; Sigma 135 is starting to hot up with both Luke Weightman and James Hapgood making their second points-scoring outing of the year, both looking to chip away at Steve Merritt's lead (he heads the table having completed all his scoring rounds).

With everything still to play for, the 2025 season continues to deliver the best in fair, close and competitive Caterham racing with more smiles per mile than ever before.

FLAG SIGNALS



BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close.

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(Double Waved) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.



YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
