CATERHAM ACADEMY CHAMPIONSHIP

ALL-ACTION ACADEMY SPEEDS INTO NORTH YORKSHIRE

Anglesey marked the halfway point for the moobob Caterham Academy and an epic race for the title is emerging between pre-season favourite and championship leader, Max Richardson, and Matt Fox.

Richardson won Academy's traditional Curborough Sprint opening event convincingly and followed it up with victory at Brands Hatch, but hasn't been back on the top step since. George Hawkins took the honours at Thruxton, and then Fox utterly dominated the season's only double-header round at Anglesey. The yellow car of 46 year-old Fox took pole, both fastest laps and the race wins in a peerless weekend.

Fox has closed the gap to Richardson, some 21 years his junior, to six points on the table, but with Academy dropping their poorest score from the season, the gap closes to just a single point advantage for Richardson.

Whilst Richardson and Fox are starting to look unassailable for the title-fight, the

battle for the final championship podium is tighter still, with four drivers separated by just two points. Welshman Richard Davies couldn't quite make the podium in either Anglesey race, but the #25 car has the slightest advantage on points over his rivals. George Hawkins and Kyle Townend are tied, one point behind Davis, whilst Nick Tomadakis is a point behind them. Townend was the only driver outside of the top two to put in a sub 1:47" lap at Anglesey, whilst Hawkins and Tomadakis both took home a third-place finish; they are all bona fide contenders.

Perhaps predictably, these six drivers shared the front three rows after Anglesey qualifying and we don't expect much different this weekend unless Ben Oliver can have a better weekend than his previous three races. A podium finisher at Brands and lap record setter at Thruxton, it should only be a matter of time, and luck, before he is in the fight for the lead.

CATERHAM ROADSPORT CHAMPIONSHIP

ROADSPORT RACERS POISED TO TAKE ON UNMISSABLE CROFT CHALLENGE

The Bilstein Caterham Roadsport Championship is effectively year two of the Academy with nearly every driver on the grid having competed in the Academy last year.

The Roadsport car is a simple development of the previous year's Academy car, with track-focussed Toyo R888R tyres and a rear anti-roll bar, giving drivers progression in the machine as well as in the double-header race format.

Croft is a return to where it all started in last year's Academy and incredibly, the first circuit this season that will be familiar to grid.

Pre-season favourite Scott Helme added yet another win to his season's tally in the double-header weekend at Anglesey, but he remains a single point behind championship leader #14 Will Harris. The younger of the two Harris brothers has been frustrated in the last three outings, finishing runner up each time, failing to repeat the win he took at Snetterton's opening round, and with Helme now on form, his lead is being eroded with each weekend. It's a little too early to consider the two drop-scores ahead of this

weekend, but in this respect, Helme has the upper hand.

Anglesey also welcomed a new driver to the top step, Craig Evans celebrating his first ever win. A great weekend from the 38 year-old now sees him putting pressure on the older of the two Harris brothers, Charles, in what is presently the battle for third overall. Evans has now established himself as one of the top four and they are starting to edge away from the cars behind, led my Alastair Morton, whose consistency is excellent, but a few places short of the podium.

Meanwhile, if there is a wild card for the weekend (wild being the operative word), could the car of Brian Thornton finally find the podium? The Irishman has the speed, he just needs to convert that into results. And finally, we have not previously mentioned #10 Aaron Oliver. He is a little way down the table due to a DNF at Snetterton, but in reality, the two-time podium finisher this year is quietly in contention for the overall podium and his performances are improving.



CATERHAM SEVEN 270R CHAMPIONSHIP

WONDERFUL WHEATLEY THE DRIVER TO BEAT

The EDGE Caterham Seven 270R Championship marks the third rung on the ladder for drivers moving up from Academy and Roadsport.

And for the first time, they will be joined by experienced drivers coming in from other series or staying in Seven 270R for a second, third or even more years. The Seven 270R progresses the Roadsport race car by changing from road to track suspension, plus the removal of the screen and lights to make it look at feel like the racing machine that it is. A third race each weekend adds to the challenge and for the first time, professional team support is permitted.

At Anglesey, Caterham Graduates champion Ben Wheatley put a frustrating weekend of racing at the previous round behind him and delivered a peerless display, with pole, a trio of wins and the fastest lap point from each race. A 44-point lead is unheard of going into the halfway point of the year and it would be a brave person that would bet against him extending it further.

But do they come any braver than Louis Darling? The youngest driver on the grid has aged quickly this year, delivering solid, mature performances from the last few rounds, amassing six podiums from nine races. On the face of it, he would appear the sole challenger to Wheatley and maybe with the familiarity of Croft, the first circuit this season Darling has raced on previously, this could be a much closer affair than that of North Wales; but he's not the only other winner this year.

Paul Oggelsby picked up the sole remining available win at Snetterton, and currently sits ninth in the table, due to three DNFs so far this season; but he is essentially the next closest driver to Wheatly and Darling. There are three drop-scores to be taken into consideration at the end of the year, so he is not out of the running yet, but he will need every result to count and a decent, if not stellar, weekend at Anglesey showed the reigning Academy Champion has the pace to do it. Like Darling, Oggelsby returns to a circuit with which he is familiar and finished runner-up after putting his car on pole last year, so confidence will be high.

CATERHAM SEVEN 310R CHAMPIONSHIP

ALL TO PLAY FOR AS 310R CONTENDERS BLAST INTO CROFT CIRCUIT

The final evolution of the Academy car, the Seven 310R looks identical to the Seven 270R, but the change in name reflects the increase in power to weight ratio, as the power is pushed up to >150bhp and a limited-slip differential is added to allow it to be exploited to the full.

It may be a small grid, but it is a case of quality over quantity in the Vertex Caterham Seven 310R Championship and it has fast become a pure battle for supremacy between two of the finest drivers in Caterham Motorsport in recent years; both multiple champions, both having shared all this season's wins between them.

The calendar has not been kind to Lars Hoffmann, with the journey from his base at the Nürburgring to Croft almost as long as it was last month to Anglesey. However, the double-champion remains at the top of the table, albeit with a reduced margin between himself and yellow car of second-placed Taylor O'Flanagan.

O'Flanagan took two wins from Anglesey

compared to Hoffmann's one, but neither driver was quickest on the day. The extra points for fastest lap went the way of Charlie Lower, currently laying in third place and twice to Phil Bianchi, a few points behind. The pair took turns to share the podium with the lead two and are still in the running, but they'll need to start winning rather than following home very soon if they still have eyes on the title trophy.

Meanwhile, Harvey Lawrence is dominating the Am class and recent strong drives could see him on the overall podium. If he does that three times this year, he'll promote himself to Pro Am...

This season has seen the introduction of a new challenge for these experienced drivers. The grids for the first two races are set by the first and second fastest times in qualifying. For race 3, the result of the previous race is taken, but with up to the first 10 places, chosen at random, reversed. As the race two winner at all three weekend's so far, Hoffmann has had the dubious honour of drawing the numbered ball out of the bag to find out how many places he will be back on the grid. It was ten at Snetterton, only to spectacularly fight through to a win and fastest lap demonstrating that this initiative lets the cream rise to the top.



CATERHAM SEVEN CHAMPIONSHIP UK

ARMSTRONG AND SENIOR SET TO RENEW CATERHAM FIGHT

The Dutch Barn Vodka Caterham Seven Championship UK is the pinnacle of both Caterham racing and club racing in the UK.

The fearsome Seven 420R race car may only wield 180bhp; but coupled with its feather weight, legendary handling and bespoke slick tyres, it is a match for the lap times of GT cars several times its price. And as with GT, drivers are categorised as Pro-Am and Am, based on race performance.

After nine races, including three in front of a capacity crowd, supporting the BTCC at Brands Hatch in May; former Porsche racer, Matt Armstrong and Harry Senior are separated by a single point at the top of the table. #19 Armstrong has the advantage after taking two wins from Anglesey, though when drop scores are considered (albeit a little early for that), the gap starts to grow.

#28 Senior, a triple Caterham Graduates champion, promoted himself from Am to Pro Am last year and is equal with Armstrong on wins this year, four a piece. Only Paul Donkin has been able to overhaul the pair so far, taking a single win at Snetterton. Donkin was championship runner-up last year, finishing well ahead of the current leaders, so there is no doubt the recently-turned-forty driver has the speed to win more races and Croft is his joker circuit. Expect red #24 to put in an impressive performance this weekend.

Reigning 310R champion Harry Cook has been staggeringly consistent, with four third-place finishes at the start of the year and now five fourth-place finishes in a row. It's enough to keep him in contention, just a couple of points behind Donkin, but he will need to return to the podium if he wants to keep the prospect of collecting another championship trophy at the end of the year.

Justin Armstrong has a commanding lead of the Am championship. Some superb drives from the 53 year-old father of leader Matt, have seen him only narrowly miss the overall podium. This is a result another Am driver, Craig Storey, achieved at Anglesey and whilst the 38 year-old is some way behind Armstrong in the table, more results like that could give us a nail-biting finish to the Am Championship later this year.



Following two high-profile events alongside the BTCC, the Vertu MINI CHALLENGE Trophy heads for Croft this weekend as the 2025 season reaches the half-way stage.

Although he has only scored two podium finishes so far, Alex Keens leads the way for Graves Motorsport thanks to his impressive consistency having only finished outside the top four twice in the opening nine races - no mean feat in such a competitive series.

It has allowed him to open up a slender lead in the points ahead of EXCELR8 racer Gabe Fairbrother, who went into 2025 as the man to beat in the title race having been the highest-placed returning driver in the field.

Fairbrother has five podiums so far but has also logged two no-scores to sit 16 points behind Keens and is just one point clear of Joshua Wilby, who has been one of the surprise packages of the campaign so far.

The top three have a small gap over a trio of drivers currently scrapping for fourth, headed by Leo Purches who is two points clear of top rookie Alfie Garford, who has two podium finishes and is one of only

five to have scored points in every race so far. Just behind the Wera Alliance Racing Academy driver sits Ashley Gregory for her family run team, with Ashley having also scored two podium finishes so far in 2025.

After another small gap sit three further drivers covered by a handful of points in the shape of James Sherrington, Rhys Hurd and Luca Marinoni Osborne. The trio are all representing Westbourne Motorsport this season, with rookie Sherrington currently heading the team's challenge from his more experienced team-mates.

The fourth Westbourne Motorsport driver, Olivier Algieri, then completes the top ten having been one of the quickest, but unluckiest, drivers so far this season - scoring two wins but also picking up four no-scores.

In such a competitive field, it isn't just the top ten who will go into the weekend confident of fighting towards the front, with the likes or Race Car Consultants driver Ronnie Smith and his namesake Harry at Chandler Motorsport having shown flashes of pace so far, as has Monroe Rennard at Graves Motorsport and Paul Manning - the oldest driver on the grid for Mannpower Motorsport.

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(**Double Waved**) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit



YELLOW/RED STRIPES Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
