1.3 <u>PASSES:</u>

Passes will be sent to you under separate cover if you do not hold permanent TOCA passes; those under the age of 13 are admitted free of charge. Please note there are no vehicle passes for marshals at this Event.

1.4 SIGNING-ON & BRIEFINGS:

- a) Officials will not sign-on at the Event having previously completed signing on electronically using the <u>BARC Alpha</u> <u>Timing system</u>
- b) All marshals must see the chief marshal between the times below to confirm their attendance. Check in will take place as shown below.

c) The Post Chiefs Briefing will take place in the Pit Lane at the times shown above.

1.5 ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION

Engines must not be run before 08:15 (Sat) or 12:00 (Sun) or after 18:30 on both days.

Noise checks will take place at the entrance to the assembly area for all support races.

1.6 <u>CIRCUIT ACCESS/PRACTICE AND QUALIFYING PROCEDURE</u>

All Competitors should follow the instructions within the Championship Regulations and Bulletins.

For cars based in the main paddock area, please assemble in the designated assembly area. For practice, you will be signalled to go directly out onto the circuit. For races, you will be signalled to go out onto the circuit, behind an official vehicle, to complete one lap of the circuit prior to forming on the grid.

At the end of qualifying and races Competitors will take the chequered flag and complete a full "slowing down" lap and proceed directly to Parc Fermé located on the right prior to the start of the pit lane, following marshals instructions.

1.7 LIVE SNATCH:

There is no "live snatch" at this event, however the Clerk of the Course may use vehicles to move stranded race cars while the safety car is in operation.

1.8 <u>RED SIGNALS:</u>

Any category which generates a "red" may be placed toward the end of the schedule subject to time being available.

1.9 JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this Event are as found in the NCR with all paperwork being dealt with electronically. Any protest or appeal needs to be lodged with the Event Secretary or the Clerk of the Course using the email addresses provided. Once a decision has been made it will be announced verbally and passed by email to those concerned.

1.10 RESULTS & NOTICE BOARD:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions. Results will be available on the TSL website: <u>British Touring Car Championship</u>

1.11 CIRCUIT & EVENT NOTES:

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track.













1.12 SOCIAL MEDIA

1.13 SAFEGUARDING:

A number of officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention. Issues can be raised by contacting the senior clerk of the course at the event or contacting a safeguarding officer whose details can be found within the <u>BARC Safeguarding Guidelines</u>.

1.14 MARSHALS MATTERS:

Marshals should enter the circuit via the East Gate and park on the outside of the circuit opposite the Pit Lane.

There will be race day programmes produced for the event however entry lists will also be available on the BARC website

No private cars are allowed in the paddock under any circumstances. Any private cars found in these areas will be towed away. Please remember you should not use mobile phones or cameras while on duty unless it is necessary to send a report to Race Control.

If you are unable to attend, please contact the Competitions Department and return any passes to BARC (See below).

Special Notes:

- a) For 2025 Motorsport UK has introduced the National Competition Rules to replace the General Regulations.
- b) You are reminded that Light Signals are installed at Oulton and they must be the priority signal used at all marshals' posts rather than flags. It is imperative that the circuit light panels are operated quickly to signal to competitors as this will also trigger the in-car display to each driver. There will be set of flags on each post and these can be used in the case of a system failure or to supplement the light signals or to display additional signals should the panel be displaying a higher-grade signal. Signals for the Safety Car and for Stopping a session will be initiated and controlled by Race Control.
- c) Scrutineering will be in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 12.4.4 which means that a minimum of 25% of the competitors in each championship will be selected for full physical scrutineering and all competitors will also completing a self-declaration form.
