In the event that any race has to be stopped then the Clerk of the Course reserves the right to send the race back to the paddock and only undertake a further restart at the end of the day if time permits.

1.2 **PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:**

Please see the paddock plan in Section 5. It is important that teams only park in their designated area. Any competitor/team that parks in an area that is not assigned for them and refuses to move when asked by an official will be reported to the Clerk of the Course for penalty up to disqualification.

A BARC vehicle pass will be required for each vehicle entering the circuit paddocks. Or the Championships own Annual Pass.

Caterham Motorsport will have the use of Paddock 1/2 and the Garages.

CGRC / F4 / Ginetta will have the use of Paddock 2.

The Paddock 1 area should be vacated by 6pm at the latest after the meeting on Sunday. There is the facility to stay overnight on site on Sunday, but the site needs to be vacated by 6am on Monday Morning.

1.3 **PASSES:**

There are no personnel passes for this meeting.

2025 BARC Vehicle Passes will be used for this meeting, or the Annual Passes of the Championships attending. Please ensure your pass is stuck in your vehicle's windscreen. Without this pass, your vehicle will not be given access to the paddocks.

To keep the Paddocks Clear, All Motorhomes/Private/hire vehicles must be parked in the area marked on the Plan in Paddock 2.



1.4 **SIGNING-ON:**

Caterham Competitors will sign-on electronically, using the BARC Alpha system. F4 will Sign On via their Online Form. Ginetta Will Sign On via their coordinator.

1.5 **ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION:**

The noise limit for all Closed Wheel grids is 92dBa

The noise limit for all Open Wheel grids is 92dBa

1.6 **SCRUTINEERING & ELIGIBILITY:**

All vehicles and driver equipment will be examined at the times indicated in table below. These are also included on the timetable in Section 4.

Video equipment may be fitted to a vehicle if it is not used for commercial purposes. All video equipment must be fitted to the vehicle at scrutineering. Failure to do so may mean that the camera is removed.

1.8 **CIRCUIT ACCESS/PRACTICE AND QUALIFYING PROCEDURE**

All Championships: All vehicles will need to go to the assembly area marked on the paddock plan (section 5).

At the end of all practice, qualifying and races, vehicles will take the flag, slow down and leave the circuit via the Gate between Turn 12 and Turn 13, and into Parc Fermé.

1.9 **MAXIMUM STARTERS:**

The maximum starters for events without a class structure for this meeting are as follows:

All Closed Wheel Grids: **47**

All Open Wheel Grids: **38**

1.10 **START PROCEDURE:**

All Championships will have a **Standing Start**: Pole Position on Left.

All Grids except CGRC will assemble in the assembly area as marked on the paddock plan (section 5). They will leave the assembly area and stop on the grid. Countdowns will be from the grid. They will then complete a green flag lap, form up on the grid again, and then undertake their standing start.



Caterham Graduates Racing Club will assemble in the assembly area as marked on the paddock plan (section 5). They will leave the assembly area and stop on the grid. The grid will be in two parts with a two-row gap between the front grid (Sigma 150) and the rear grid (Sigma 135). Countdowns will be from the grid. They will then complete a green flag lap, form up on the grid again, and then undertake their standing start. The front grid will start on the lights and then the second grid will start 15 seconds again on the lights.

1.11 RESULTS & NOTICE BOARD:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions. The official notice board is online [HERE](#).

1.12 PODIUM PRESENTATIONS:

All cars will return to Parc Fermé. Officials will direct cars as necessary for presentations.

1.13 CIRCUIT & MEETING NOTES:

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track.
The circuit fuel station at the new circuit entrance will be open during the meeting.

1.14 LIGHT PANELS AND FLAG SIGNALS

This venue uses light panels; these light signals will take priority and may be supplemented with flags. For reasons of safety, in case of conflicting signals between the light panels and any flags displayed by marshals, drivers must comply with the requirements of the signal with the highest level of safety.

In order of precedence: Red Signal, Double Yellow Signal, Single Yellow Signal, Safety Car Signal, Green Signal.

Please see the light panel guide and light panel location map in Section 5 of these final instructions for a diagram of the different light panels that will be used and their location on the circuit.

1.15 TRACK LIMITS

Track limits at this event will be monitored under the FIA Regulations, with special attention focussed on Turn 12. These will be gone through in greater detail in the respective Drivers Briefings.

1.16 TIMING OF DECISIONS

For Caterham Grids: If the Stewards of the meeting hold a formal inquiry into an incident and subsequently issues a formal decision to a competitor, a verbal decision will be issued followed by a document sent to the competitor by email. The timing of the decision will be when it is given verbally, and this will be the time recorded on the decisions. This will also be the time that the appeal period, where applicable, begins.

3 GENERAL INFORMATION:

This meeting is organised by Circuit Park Zandvoort BV and will be run in accordance with the requirements of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, and the requirements and regulations of KNAF and the applicable Sporting & Technical regulations of the applicable championships.

These Final Instructions should be read in conjunction with any further instructions or bulletins issued by the organisers.

3.1 RED SIGNAL:

Any category which generates a “Red Signal” may be placed toward the end of the schedule subject to time being available.

3.2 JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this meeting remain unaltered except that paperwork will be dealt with electronically.

Any protest or appeal needs to be lodged with the Secretary of the Event in the administration office, or the appropriate Meeting Stewards. Judicial hearings will be conducted in the usual manner.

Once a decision has been made it will be announced verbally and passed by email to those concerned. The time limits for any protest or appeal remain unaltered.

3.3 RACE-DAY INFORMATION:

The organisers will try to run the programme as published however they reserve the right to bring forward, delay or abandon sessions to suit the conditions.

3.4 SOCIAL MEDIA

Both officials and competitors are reminded that they should not make comments on social media sites which may in any way be deemed derogatory, defamatory, obscene, or libellous. 3.5 SAFEGUARDING:

Several officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention. Issues can be raised by contacting the senior clerk of the course at an event or contacting a safeguarding officer whose details can be found within the [BARC Safeguarding Guidelines](#). Or you can use the [BARC Safeguarding Incident Report Form](#) to report any problems that have arisen.



3.6 **GENERAL HEALTH & SAFETY:**

Championship Co-ordinators and representatives are asked to visually check garages and working spaces for the following:

- 1) Fuel is stored in suitable containers with lids away from sources of ignition;
All fuel must also be stored in drip trays when not in use.
- 2) Each competition car has one suitable fire extinguisher stored in a usable location (i.e., not in race transporter) and is both tested and in-date;
- 3) Floor/ground is kept clean & tidy;
- 4) Waste is disposed of in identified bins & containers provided by the circuit. Waste must not be mixed or waste left around the site. In the event that the BARC is charged for such issues then the charge will be passed on to the championship concerned if the individual cannot be identified;
- 5) Old tyres must be taken away by teams/competitors unless the championship has arrangements with the tyre company (there will be a waste disposal charge levied to the championship for any items which are controlled/hazardous that BARC and/or Circuit have to dispose of);
- 6) No trailing electrical cables that can cause electric shock or tripping hazard;
- 7) Waste/grey water from motorhomes must be disposed of in line with circuit requirements;
- 8) Work at height without harnesses and fall restraints is not permitted.
- 9) The use of BBQs in the Pit Garages is strictly forbidden.

3.7 **NON-COMPETITION VEHICLE SAFETY**

Entrants, Teams, and Competitors must ensure that all vehicles are used in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and under no circumstances should anyone be allowed to ride or hang on to buggies, tyre trolleys, roll bars, side pods and the like.

3.9.1 A maximum 5 mph speed limit will be in force in areas.

3.9.2 The use of pedal cycles and the like are strongly discouraged, particularly when ridden by children. All children should be always under the supervision of a responsible adult to try to ensure their safety.

3.9.3 The use of e-scooters is strictly forbidden.

10. Any other item specific to the championship

Protocol for storage of fuel and other hazardous fluids for all championships

- During event days, only a working stock of fuel for one day may be present in the garage, awning or trailer. All other stock should remain in the fuel compound.
- The fuel should be stored in sealed containers, drums or cans.
- The working stock may not be located in the route of forklift trucks or other means of transport.
- The working stock may not exceed 400 liters and must be placed on a drip tray with a capacity of +10%.
- Two fire extinguishers with a minimum capacity of 6 liters and suitable for class B fires (liquid) must be present in direct surrounding of the storage.
- Presence of sufficient absorbents which can be used in case of spillage.
- Each team is responsible for the drip trays, extinguishers, grit and absorbents.
- A daily check will take place to ensure that each team meets all requirements.

11. Any other item specific to the event

- The following regulations will be used. All entrants undertake to respect these regulations by participating in the event:
 - 2025 FIA International Sporting Code and Appendices (ISC).
 - KNAF Reglementen Boek 2025.
 - Reglement Autoresport Nationaal 2025.
 - All class regulations and bulletins of the classes mentioned in article 1.
 - These Supplementary Regulations.
- In addition to Appendix H of the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code and the KNAF Reglementen Boek 2025 it is possible that at post 0.5 and 1, post 7 and 7.4, post 8 and 8.2, post 10.7 and 11 and post 14 and 14.3 the same flags will be shown as a pre-warning (yellow flags).
- Starting time (and location) of the Licence checks, Scrutineering, Drivers Briefings, Free Practices, Qualifications, and Races, can all be found in the official Time Schedule of the event.
- Going on and off the track will be explained in the drivers briefing or Team Information document.
- In deviation to art. 13.5 of the FIA International Sporting Code, protests have to be addressed to the Stewards and delivered to the Secretary of the Event instead of the Clerk of the Course.
 - Protest Deposit: according the regulations of the KNAF
 - Technical Protests according the regulations of the KNAF
 - Appeal deposit: according the regulations of the KNAF
- All pit garages must be kept locked from the inside to avoid unauthorised persons passing through to pit lane, fines maybe imposed by the Stewards on offenders.
- Refuelling is only allowed in the pit lane or on the paddock.
- All fuel must be stored in drip trays.
- Access to the pit: minimum age is 16 years (except holders of a racing Licence).
- It is not allowed to smoke or use open fire in the pit boxes, in the pit lane and on the roof of the pitlane building.
- The pit lane has been divided into two lanes. The lane closest to the pit wall/track is designated the 'fast lane' and the lane closest to the pit boxes is designated the 'inner lane' or 'working lane' and is the only area where any work can be carried out on a car. Exceptions can be made by the Race Director at a red flag situation.



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- Competitors may not paint lines on any part of the pit lane.
- No equipment may be left in the fast lane of the pit lane. A car may enter or remain in the fast lane only with the driver sitting in the car behind the steering wheel in his normal position, even when the car is being pushed.
- Team personnel are only allowed in the pit lane immediately before they are required to work on a car and must withdraw as soon as the work is complete.
- Pit lane entry- and exit- timing loops are indicated by a stopwatch sign.
- The driver must sign the 'responsibility clause' (according to the General regulations concerning racing contests).
- For minor competitors a "Parental Consent Authorisation" should be presented at Administrative Control, in case the parent will not be present at the meeting.
- For entrants, other than the driver concerned, not present at this meeting a written authorisation should be presented at Administrative Control.
- Every person (drivers, team members, officials, press etc.) who enters the pit area must at all times wear his ticket/pass visible, in a way that the controlling officials can at any time without problem see whether this person has the right ticket/pass. If a person is not wearing his ticket/pass visible, he may not enter the pit area.
- Every car shall be timed at the start/finish line after completion of the first and subsequent laps with a transponder. All cars have to be equipped with a permanent transponder, which must be mounted in the car at the right place. Malversation or obstruction of the rules mentioned in this article may lead to exclusion and shall be reported to the Stewards.
- Every competitor, team owner, driver team-member who wishes to use an apparatus with radio communication must submit an application at least 1 month before the event – the application form can be obtained on the internet at: <https://www.rdi.nl/documenten/formulieren/2017/april/4/application-form-for-the-use-of-frequencies-during-events-in-the-netherlands>
- Tobacco advertisements is totally banned by Dutch law and must therefore be neutralized, even if they are part of the car's original decoration.

2025 SAFETY BULLETIN

This safety bulletin supports the BARC 2025 Health and Safety Guidance, Supplementary Regulations and Final Instructions

1. VEHICLES, SCOOTERS, BUGGIES & QUADS

- The use of quad bikes and buggies must be covered by 3rd party insurance when driven within the confines of the venue.
- No mini-bikes, scooters or 2-wheeled transport allowed.
- Observe venue speed limit at all times.
- Absolutely NO electric stand-on scooters.



2. SAFE BUGGY & QUAD USE

- Only drive if you hold a valid licence
- Do not leave keys in ignition
- Observe maximum speed limits at all times
- Observe one-way systems at all times
- No carrying of unsecured loads
- No riding on equipment trolleys
- All passengers must be seated



3. WORKING AT HEIGHT – **ESPECIALLY ON TRAILOR UNITS**

NEVER STAND ON A ROOF WITHOUT PROTECTION FROM FALLING

- Put up secure side barriers
- Use clipped on full safety harness
- Use a secured ladder / steps
- All ladders must be "footed"
- Only use ladders and steps to EN 131
- Ensure equipment is not damaged



4. SPECTATING

- Do not spectate from tail lifts / trailer roofs
- Only spectate from truck roofs if appropriate safe access and barriers are in place.
- Do not climb on / spectate from venue infrastructure e.g. waste bins, fencing or generators



5. HOT WORKS AND FUEL

- Keep fuel storage to a minimum and in a safe location
- Keep extinguisher suitable for fuel fire close by
- Comply with all refuelling regulations
- Refuel when engine is turned off and cooled
- Keep fuel away from ignition sources



6. CABLES AND TAIL-LIFTS

- Securely cover hoses and cables.
- Tail lifts should not be left unattended at halfway point.
- Consider using "Tensabarriers" to avoid pedestrians walking under lifts
- Use harnesses or guardrails where possible or appropriate
