F4 BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIP CERTIFIED BY FIA

BRITISH F4 PRIMED FOR ALL-ACTION VISIT TO ZANDVOORT

The second half of the 2025 Wera Tools F4 British Championship certified by FIA season commences this weekend with three blockbuster races poised to play out around Zandvoort.

Coming off the back of a history-making event at the Formula 1 British Grand Prix, the UK's premier single-seater series returns to the Netherlands for a second successive year with two home-grown heroes looking to make their mark.

Hitech TGR's Nina Gademan has been cutting her teeth in F1 Academy this year but a guest appearance earlier this month has led to her returning once more. JHR Developments' Esmee Kosterman is another Dutch wonder that will hope to make home advantage count.

Up at the top of the standings, Fionn McLaughlin heads overseas as the driver to beat however he will need to be at his brilliant best to stay there as Martin Molnár is hot on his heels and ready to strike.

Also in the mix is the race-winning quartet of James Piszcyk, August Raber, Thomas Bearman and Adam Al Azhari, whilst the duo of Henry Joslyn and Tommy Harfield have shown they can challenge for outright honours too.

Further down the entry list and well worth looking out for is Mercedes F1 Junior Ethan Jeff-Hall, JHR Developments' Rowan Campbell-Pilling and the Xcel Motorsport duo of Chase Fernandez and Theo Palmer.

Elsewhere, Henry Mercier will be eager to build on his maiden F4 podium while Fortec Motorsport's Ary Bansal and Thomas Ingram Hill, Xcel Motorsport's Cole Hewetson and Yuhao Fu, and the Chris Dittmann Racing pairing of Alba Larsen and Charlie Edge will star. Also not to be discounted is Xavier Avramides, Ella Lloyd and Chloe Chong,

The 27-car grid is completed by Virtuosi Racing's Emma Felbermayr and Oleksandr Savinkov, and German ace Arjen Kraling, who will celebrate his 15th birthday the day prior to the event.

ROADSPORT RACERS READY TO PUT ON A SHOW IN THE NETHERLANDS

The Bilstein Caterham Roadsport Championship is effectively year two of the Academy with nearly every driver on the grid having competed in the Academy last year.

The Roadsport car is a simple development of the previous year's Academy car, with track-focussed Toyo R888R tyres and a rear anti-roll bar, giving drivers progression in the machine as well as in the double-header race format.

After promising much in qualifying, but failing to deliver in the racing, Irishman Brian Thornton finally came good at Croft last month, taking his first ever win on the Saturday, immediately followed that up with a win in Sunday's race as well. The #33 car sits fourth in the table, but now is the time when focus shifts to the 'drop score' totals.

And after drop scores, pre-season favourite Scott Helme has a slim, two-point advantage over Will Harris. They have been the pair to beat all year. Helme has taken three wins, whilst Harris has three fastest laps and on average is actually finishing better than Helme. In fact, if you only consider a single drop score at the moment,

the pair are level pegging...

This weekend is likely to define whether it will be a two-horse race to the finish of the year, but the black and white car of Craig Evans has been quietly racking up the points behind them in a strong third place, ready to step up if anything goes South for the lead drivers. Which is exactly the sort of thing that happened at Croft, when a coming together at the hairpin amongst the lead group resulted in a concertina behind, taking out a number of contenders; including Will Harris and his older brother Charles, along with Oli White and Alastair Morton. All four drivers are left with a zero score to drop, giving them just the one lifeline to fall back on.

With the exception of being a victim of the Croft shunt, Morton's results have consistently been no lower than sixth and no higher than fourth. However, Zandvoort has a record of producing racing closer than any other circuit, so this may the chance for him to finally step onto the podium.



CATERHAM SEVEN 270R CHAMPIONSHIP

DARLING ON THE HUNT FOR DUTCH DELIGHT

The EDGE Caterham Seven 270R Championship marks the third rung on the ladder for drivers moving up from Academy and Roadsport. And for the first time, they will be joined by experienced drivers coming in from other series or staying in Seven 270R for a second, third or even more years.

With seven wins from twelve races, Caterham Graduates champion Ben Wheatley, has a commanding lead over nearest rival Louis Darling. The second placed driver currently lags some 23 points behind Wheatley after drop scores, but Zandvoort's speed is possibly more reflective of Thruxton where Darling scored both of his two wins this year.

Whilst it looks increasingly like the lead pair have locked out the top steps of championship podium, third place could not be more open, with eight or more drivers all in with a strong chance.

At this time of the year, focus switches to the scores after drivers have dropped their three worst rounds and whilst the orange car of Andrew Bailey may be in third overall, it's currently fifth placed driver, Henry Speeks who has the advantage, despite just a single visit to the podium this year. His nearest rival, Monty Hinde looks set to sit out this weekend following significant damage to his car at Croft, making it a little easier to close the points gap.

However, if we are predicting who will challenge the top two drivers the most, it's like to come in the form of one of the Nicks: Either Highton or Sampson, who picked up his first ever win at the last race of the Croft weekend. Meanwhile, Highton should be the lead challenger for third overall, but is battling back from a whopping 21-point penalty, after racking up several offences in a single weekend earlier in the year. Finally, Paul Oggelsby may be some way down the table, but he was the only other race winner at Thruxton.

Following in the wheel-tracks of Megan Bruce, the regular Seven 270R grid is joined by a guest drive for GB4 Caitlyn McDaniel. CATERHAM SEVEN 310R CHAMPIONSHIP

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY WHEN IT COMES TO 310R RANKS

It may be a small grid, but it is a case of quality over quantity in the Vertex Caterham Seven 310R Championship and it has fast become a pure battle for supremacy between two of the finest drivers in Caterham Motorsport in recent years; both multiple champions, both having shared all this season's wins between them.

A clean sweep of wins at Croft by triple-champion Taylor O'Flanagan meant that, Lars Hoffman, left a weekend without at least one winner's trophy for the first time this year. As a result, O'Flanagan has finally overtaken his German rival in the title hunt, with a six-point advantage and ever-so-slightly more after drop scores.

Between them, the pair have lockedout the top step of the podium this year, O'Flanagan with eight wins to Hoffman's four. However, nowhere is the racing closer than at Zandvoort and this might be chance for those that have given them a good run for their money and taken a decent number of runner-up trophies home, to finally usurp them for first.

Who that will be is too close to call. Both Charlie Lower and Phil Bianchi have had three second place finishes this year. Lower may have a single-point advantage after drop scores, but Bianchi has racked up three fastest laps to Lower's two. Place your bets!

This season has seen the introduction of a new challenge for these experienced drivers. The grids for the first two races are set by the first and second fastest times in qualifying. For race 3, the result of the previous race is taken, but with up to the first 10 places, chosen at random. reversed. As the race two winner at all three weekend's so far, Hoffmann has had the dubious honour of drawing the numbered ball out of the bag to find out how many places he will be back on the grid. It was ten at Snetterton, only to spectacularly fight through to a win and fastest lap demonstrating that this initiative lets the cream rise to the top.



CATERHAM SEVEN CHAMPIONSHIP UK

LATEST CHAPTER OF ARMSTRONG VERSUS SENIOR SET TO CONTINUE

The Dutch Barn Vodka Caterham Seven Championship UK is the pinnacle of both Caterham racing and club racing in the UK.

After arriving at the last round with just a point between himself and leader Matt Armstrong; startline disaster befell polesitter Harry Senior with a failed driveshaft in the first race of the weekend. The PT Sportscars driver recovered well from the back of the grid in race two to finish fourth and made it into second for the weekend's final encounter. However, Armstrong was able to make hay and took home three wins from three races, putting clear air on the points table between himself and Senior. Things close up a little after drop scores, but he still has an advantage, so Senior will be hoping for better (or less bad) luck this weekend.

Behind the lead pair, and after drop scores are considered, just a single point separates the battle for third position between Paul Donkin and Harry Cook. With Henry 'Harry' Heaton sitting out this weekend, the red car of Donkin represents this year's only other race winner on the grid, but a mixed

bag of results and luck have seen him fall from contention for the lead, despite being the championship runner-up last year. Meanwhile, reigning Seven 310R champion Cook in the distinctive black and gold car has been a frequent visitor to the podium, though never higher than third. Cook's battle to his Seven 310R crown last year could not have been tougher, so it is surely a matter of time before he moves up a step or two.

However, Zandvoort sees the welcome return of one of Caterham's Superstar drivers; Aaron Head. Head is a quadruple Caterham champion (one of only two); three times at this level. Whilst it's been some time since he has competed, he joined the series as a guest at last year's Zandvoort round – and won all three races...

In the Am Championship, father of leading driver, Matt, Justin Armstrong continues to hold the lead in his grasp. Some superb drives from the 53 year-old have seen him only narrowly miss the overall podium.

The P4 Emergency Lighting CGRC Championship drivers have descended on the seaside town of Zandvoort for round 6 of the 2025 season at the home of the Dutch Grand Prix.

Its mix of fast sweeping corners, long straights and the steep banking of Arie Luyendijkbocht (try saying that 3 times fast!) provide a unique challenge for the combined grid of Sigma 150 and 135 drivers to overcome and a fitting stage for some top-drawer racing.

Tom McEwing continues to head up the Sigma 135 Championship, extending his lead with wins and fastest laps at Croft; Giles Derry and Neil Warnock also scored highly in our last round and are sitting in 2nd and 3rd currently.

Meanwhile in the Sigma 150's Harry Cramer is sitting in 1st with Rob Warner, our title sponsor, sitting in 2nd; Andy Whitton is sitting in 3rd whilst Paul Goldstein (last year's 135 champion) is currently in 4th after suffering from technical issues in the last race.

Rounding out our combined Sigma 135/

Sigma 150 grid will be the CGRC Trophy drivers (our 3 self-selected round minichampionship), plus several guest drivers from other series looking to test the mettle.

The stage is set for another cracking pair of races as this season continues to deliver the best in fair, close and competitive Caterham racing - with more smiles per mile than ever before.

One of the largest single-make championships in the UK, the P4 Emergency Lighting CGRC Championship is a series that has proven to be a smash-hit with the emphasis firmly on cost-effective racing.

Open to 1600cc Caterham cars, as originally raced in the Caterham Academy and followon series, the championship boasts a twoclass system to allow various versions of the sports car icon to compete on an even footing.

Whilst the racing is often awe-inspiring, the aim of the Caterham Graduates Racing Club is to provide fair, close and competitive motorsport in a fun and friendly environment.



GINETTA JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

HOME TURF BECKONS FOR GINETTA JUNIOR LEADER CORONEL

Dutch rising star Rocco Coronel will head into his home event as Ginetta Junior Championship points leader as the series prepares to compete at Circuit Zandvoort for the first time, writes Simon Paice.

A landmark weekend in the 20th anniversary season of the Ginetta Junior Championship sees the series compete overseas for the first time since 2006, and race on an international Formula 1 circuit for the first time ever at the home of the Dutch Grand Prix.

Red Bull Junior Team ace Coronel has firmly established himself as the driver to beat in the Juniors this season, with a stunning start to his rookie campaign seeing him win nine of the opening 12 races. Those successes, plus a couple of second place finishes, have built him a lead of over 100 points.

Coronel is part of a formidable entry from reigning champions R Racing that includes Donington Park race-winner Alfie Slater, podium finishers Max Cuthbert and Red Bull-backed Scott Kin Lindblom, and another Dutch talent preparing for their home round, Felipe Reijs.

Ginetta Junior Scholarship winner Fred Green has regularly been Coronel's closest challenger through the season so far. After scoring his maiden win at Oulton Park by the smallest margin in Junior history, only 0.003s, he added a second victory to his tally last time out at Snetterton.

Joining Green in Elite Motorsport's challenge for success this season has been regular podium finisher and leading rookie talent Joseph Smith, 2024 race-winner Colin Cronin, plus fellow second-year contender Ethan Carney who scored his maiden top three finish back at Silverstone.

A record-breaking grid for 2025 has seen a number of other drivers battle it out at the sharp end of the field, including podium-finishers Torrin Byrne and George Proudford-Nalder, and the likes of Ethan Lennon, Felix Livesey, Harry Bartle, Raul Zunzarren and Noah Young.
