



2CV 24h – Lunch Time Parade

Saturday 23rd August 2025

Parade Info Sheet

Parade Date & Time: Saturday 23rd August - 14:25hrs (First arrivals from 14:00hrs)

Cost: £10.00 per vehicle (**Cash Only**). This money is donated to the volunteer marshals raffle as additional prizes. You can either sign up electronically prior to the event via – [2CV Parade Sign Up](#) or you can sign on manually on paper when in the queue. We prefer electronic sign on as it saves time on the day.

Location: The access to the circuit is via a gate on the inside of Coram corner. This is accessible via the internal road on the left just after main bridge over the circuit. Please line up 1x1 with first vehicle going down the access road and parking as close to the circuit access gate as possible.

Once all of the parade vehicles have been lined up, they will be released onto the circuit behind a course car with flashing amber beacons on the roof. Please note that this lead vehicle is to be at the front of the precession at all times. At the rear of the precession will be another course car closing the chain.

Overtaking is not permitted unless another vehicle becomes immobile. If this happens, please give the greatest amount of space to the broken vehicle as possible.

If you break down, please pull over to the side of the circuit as quickly and as safely as possible. If you have an oil leak, please try to vacate the tarmac as soon as possible and park off the circuit on the grass/asphalt areas. If you have a fire onboard your vehicle, please stop as close as you can to any manned marshals' posts which will be stocked with fire extinguishers etc.

Maximum speed for this parade will be **40 mph**. Please drive within you own and your vehicle's capabilities, especially if you are carrying passengers.

Once the laps of the circuit have been completed, the precession will follow the lead car through the gate back into the paddock area. You are free to return to your normal parking area from this point onwards to enjoy the 24h race.
