For those without permanent passes, electronic tickets will be sent to you; those under the age of 13 are admitted free of charge. Marshals will receive a vehicle pass which will allow access to the areas specified in section 1.14. Under no circumstances will marshals cars be permitted in the paddock at any time during the event.

#### 1.4 SIGNING-ON:

- a) Officials will not sign-on at the Event having previously completed signing on electronically using the Alpha system.
- b) There will be race day programmes produced for the event however entry lists will also be available on the BARC website Donington Park GP
- c) All marshals must see the chief marshal between the times below to confirm their attendance.
  - i) Marshals travelling to the circuit for the event Follow the road signs for hospitality parking. This should take you to Melbourne Road and entry into the circuit this way in parking is in the Heritage loop and you must walk from there to the launch pad. This is only a short distance, just head towards the launch pad building. The chief marshals for this meeting will be there to check you in.
  - ii) Marshals travelling from the campsite

If you cannot walk to the launch pad area for check-in please drive and park your car on the infield at Redgate and cross the track. Do not bring your car across the track at Redgate to the launch pad.

Briefings will be held at the launch pad and after the briefing marshals will be able to move to park up from the launch pad once we are ready. We have a small window of time to move you safely across to the designated areas of Craner curves for parking. This will be manned by race control and command and control. For pits and assembly marshals and marshals allocated posts on the loop, you may leave your cars at the hospitality parking area and walk to where you need to be, so for post numbers (old) 23,25,26,27,29,33,38,39. All other marshals parking is at Craner and you will need to walk to your post from there except for posts 17 and 19, who may park on the grass area not near the disability parking and post 21, who may park as far back from the circuit as possible. If you have disability issues and need support getting to post please let the chief marshal know before the day. At the end of each day all cars are to leave the circuit via the Williamson tunnel.

## 1.5 **ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION:**

Engines must not be run before 09:00 or after 20:00 on both days. Noise checks will take place at the entrance to the assembly area for all support race categories.

# 1.6 CIRCUIT ACCESS/PRACTICE AND QUALIFYING PROCEDURE

BTCC - Competitors should follow the instructions within the Championship Regulations.

Support Races – These competitors need to go to the Assembly Area located adjacent to the Donington Park Circuit Offices, opposite the Melbourne Hairpin. They will then follow the Safety Car across the driveway and on to the circuit and proceed to the pit lane for qualifying and directly to the grid for races. All support buggies and personnel must proceed to the pit gate between garage 38 and the pits café to enter the pit lane. All passes will be checked at this point prior to admission in to the pit lane, please respect the marshals and show your pass. Any rude or aggressive behaviour will be reported to the Clerk of the Course. At the end of the session exit the Pit Lane via the scrutineering bay gate.

At the end of qualifying and races support competitors will take the chequered flag and complete a "slowing down" lap pulling in to the pit lane and proceeding direct to Parc Fermé without stopping, except those required for ITV interviews.

## 1.7 LIVE SNATCH:

There is provision for "live snatch" at this Event but only under local yellow signals.

#### 1.8 RED SIGNALS:

Any category which generates a "red" may be placed toward the end of the schedule subject to time being available.

## 1.9 JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this Event are as per the NCR with all paperwork being dealt with electronically. Any protest or appeal needs to be lodged with the Event Secretary or the Clerk of the Course using the email addresses provided. The time limits for any protest or appeal remain unaltered.

#### 1.13 SAFEGUARDING:

A number of officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention. Issues can be raised by contacting the senior clerk of the course at the event or contacting a safeguarding officer whose details can be found within the <u>BARC Safeguarding Guidelines</u> and the contact details below.

## 1.14 MARSHALS MATTERS:

Marshals' camping will be on the infield and security will provide you with wristbands to gain access. The camping area is accessed is via the Williamson Tunnel and proceed to the designated/signposted campsite for marshals only please camp in this space, where there will be electric hook up available. Please pitch sensibly allowing space between each pitch and access for cars to manoeuvre off site. You may wish to leave your car at the campsite and walk to sign on, then to post.

No private cars are allowed in the paddock under any circumstances and any private cars found in the paddock will be towed away. Please also remember you should not use mobile phones or cameras while on duty unless it is necessary to send a report to Race Control.

If you are unable to attend, please contact the Competitions Department and return any passes to BARC (See below), if after 17:00 Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> August, please also contact the Chief Marshal.

## 1.15 SPECIAL NOTES:

- a) For 2025 Motorsport UK has introduced the National Competition Rules to replace the General Regulations.
- b) You are reminded that Light Signals are installed at Donington and they must be the priority signal used at all marshals' posts rather than flags. It is imperative that the circuit light panels are operated quickly to signal to competitors as this will also trigger the in-car display to each driver. There will be set of flags on each post and these can be used in the case of a system failure or to supplement the light signals or to display additional signals should the panel be displaying a higher-grade signal. Signals for the Safety Car and for Stopping a session will be initiated and controlled by Race Control.
- c) Scrutineering will be in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 12.4.4 which means that a minimum of 25% of the competitors in each championship will be selected for full physical scrutineering and all competitors will also completing a self-declaration form.

# 2025 SAFETY BULLETIN

This safety bulletin supports TOCA and BARC 2025 Health and Safety Guidance, Supplementary Regulations and Final Instructions

#### 1. VEHICLES, SCOOTERS, BUGGIES & QUADS

- The use of quad bikes and buggies must be covered by 3rd party insurance when driven within the confines of the venue.
- No mini-bikes, scooters or 2-wheeled transport allowed.
- Observe venue speed limit at all times.
- Absolutely NO electric stand-on scooters.







#### 2. SAFE BUGGY AND QUAD USE

- Only drive if you hold a valid licence
- · Do not leave keys in ignition
- Observe maximum speed limits at all times
- · Observe one-way systems at all times

- No carrying of unsecured loads
- · No riding on equipment trolleys
- · All passengers must be seated



## 3. WORKING AT HEIGHT

## **NEVER STAND ON A ROOF WITHOUT PROTECTION FROM FALLING**

- · Put up secure side barriers
- · Use clipped on full safety harness
- · Use a secured ladder / steps
- · All ladders must be "footed"
- · Only use ladders and steps to EN 131
- · Ensure equipment is not damaged







#### 4. SPECTATING

- · Do not spectate from tail lifts / trailer roofs
- · Only spectate from truck roofs if appropriate safe access and barriers are in place.
- Do not climb on / spectate from venue infrastructure e.g. Pit Wall / Fence, waste bins, fencing or generators



# 5. HOT WORKS AND FUEL

- · Keep fuel storage to a minimum and in a safe location
- · Keep extinguisher suitable for fuel fire close by
- · Comply with all refuelling regulations
- Refuel when engine is turned off and cooled
- Keep fuel away from ignition sources





## 6. CABLES AND TAIL-LIFTS

- Securely cover hoses and cables.
- · Tail lifts should not be left unattended at halfway point.
- · Consider using "Tensabarriers" to avoid pedestrians walking under lifts
- Use harnesses or guardrails where possible or appropriate
