CATERHAM ROADSPORT CHAMPIONSHIP

TITLE **CONTENDERS** READY FOR A BLAST IN THE PARK

The Bilstein Caterham Roadsport Championship is effectively year two of the Academy with nearly every driver on the grid having competed in the Academy last year.

Continuing a theme this year, it's another brand new circuit for the Academy class of 2024. Scott Helme arrives in Cheshire at the top of the championship table, but having had his post-drop scores total advantage (Roadsport drivers drop their two lowest scores) overturned, and it's now his young rival, Will Harris, who is effectively the frontrunner having had a significantly better time in the sand dunes of Zandvoort last month. However, after the relative disappointment in the Netherlands, Helme was a star at the recent Caterham Grand Prix – a two hour semi-enduro – winning the Roadsport class and finishing third overall.

As we close on the end of the season, it is far from the two-horse race it perhaps threatened to be, with several other drivers finding their speed as experience continues

to ramp up steeply. Craig Evans has only been off the podium once (and then just for fourth) since winning his first ever race at Anglesey earlier in the year. His consistency has rewarded him with third in the table (whichever way you look at it) and makes him a very credible threat for the top, especially as the lead battle heats up.

At Zandvoort, Charles Harris, older brother of Will, finally made it back to the podium that has eluded him since his impressive opening round at Snetterton. Harris Snr is fourth after drop scores, overtaking Brian Thornton, who sits ahead of him in the table.

Race Commentator Thornton was ready to throw in the towel in the middle of the year, only to suddenly take a leap in performance, winning both races at Croft and turning in a strong performance at Zandvoort, propelling him to the position of championship podium contender. He currently has a nine-point penalty on his score, but through the atonement process permitted in Roadsport, this should be removed after this weekend.

CATERHAM SEVEN 270R CHAMPIONSHIP

WHEATLEY THE DRIVER TO BEAT AS 270R RACES TOWARDS FINALE

The EDGE Caterham Seven 270R Championship marks the third rung on the ladder for drivers moving up from Academy and Roadsport. And for the first time, they will be joined by experienced drivers coming in from other series or staying in Seven 270R for a second, third or even more years.

The commanding lead of Caterham Graduates champion Ben Wheatley (CTS Motorsport) is very gradually being eroded by the black car of Louis Darling (Williams Motorsport). It was two wins to one in favour of 18 year-old Darling at Zandvoort as the pair edged yet further away from any of their rivals. However, he remains 20 points behind Wheatley after the three drop scores and even with a stellar performance, he will need a little bad luck to befall his rival if he wants a shot at the title in the Silverstone finale next month.

Whilst the orange #31 car of Andrew Bailey (CTS Motorsport) currently sits in third position, it falls several positions after drop scores are considered. Henry Speeks (Williams Motorsport) has the advantage,

but the smart money is on the red car of Nick Sampson (Matt Blyth Motorsport) to move up the table. Sampson missed the Anglesey weekend, so has to make every score count. He was runner-up in all three races at Zandvoort and is now consistently finishing ahead of his rivals – only the lead two drivers have scored more points in the last five races.

Equal with Bailey after drop scores is 23 year-old Harrison Cavers (LFP Motorsport). Cavers has had mixed results this year, but when he is on form the third-placed driver from last year's Academy can mix it at the very front and he comes to Cheshire on the back of an overall win at last month's first ever Caterham Grand Prix at Snetterton, winning £1,000 for the WWF in the process.

Speeks may be third after drop scores, but in terms of cross-the-line results, Nick Highton (DW Motorsport) has actually scored more, but it suffering from a whopping 21 point penalty from a single weekend at Thruxton. Obviously Wheatley's experience and pace will make him a force to be reckoned with this weekend, but perhaps Highton, a winner here is '23 on his way to the Academy title and at his home circuit, might be the surprise package for his first Seven 270R win.



CATERHAM SEVEN 310R CHAMPIONSHIP

FLAWLESS O'FLANAGAN EYES MORE SUCCESS AT OULTON PARK

The final evolution of the Academy car, the Seven 310R looks identical to the Seven 270R, but the change in name reflects the increase in power to weight ratio, as the power is pushed up to >150bhp and a limited-slip differential is added to allow it to be exploited to the full.

It may be a small grid, but it is a case of quality over quantity in the Vertex Caterham Seven 310R Championship and it has fast become a pure battle for supremacy between two of the finest drivers in Caterham Motorsport in recent years; both multiple champions, both having shared all this season's wins between them.

Since a relatively frustrating opening weekend of the year, Taylor O'Flanagan has rarely put a wheel wrong and is currently riding a wave of seven consecutive wins as he edges ever closer to a historic fourth Caterham championship title, which would

see him become only the second driver to achieve the titles in all four levels from Seven 310R down.

O'Flanagan's yellow car received a boost in points from the final Zandvoort race, when his three closest rivals where all victims of a moment at the front of the pack early in the race, that saw Ben Lopez-Appleton sideways and everyone taking (mostly) avoiding action. This opened the door for James Emson to collect his first Seven 310R trophy, coming home second to O'Flanagan.

The Zandvoort incident demonstrated how quickly fortunes can change when racing is this close and with six races still left to decide the championship, there's plenty of time for Lars Hoffman to catch back up, having led the championship for the first half of the year. Meanwhile, former Academy champion Charlie Lower and Phil Bianchi continue their battle over what is likely to be third-placed in the championship.

In the Am category, Harvey Lawrence is proving all but unbeatable, 49 points ahead of nearest rival Peter Mott.

CATERHAM SEVEN CHAMPIONSHIP UK

ARMSTRONG AND SENIOR SET TO RENEW BATTLE IN CHESHIRE

The Dutch Barn Vodka Caterham Seven Championship UK is the pinnacle of both Caterham racing and club racing in the UK.

Former Porsche racing ace, Matt Armstong (Team Parker Racing) continues to eke out the lead from the red car of this chief rival, Harry Senior (PT Sportscars), although he has yet to achieve the clean sweep of three wins from three races so far this season.

Armstrong and Senior have pulled clear of the field on points (and have taken 13 of the 15 available wins this year), but neither were the fastest car on track at Zandvoort. Twice that honour went to reigning Seven 310R champion Harry Cook (Williams Motorsport). The 27 year-old has finished over half of this year's races in third place and has never looked closer to winning than he did at Zandvoort in July, where he was rewarded with his one and only second-place of the year, but victory still eludes him.

Cook isn't so far away from the lead pair that a late bid for a higher championship podium position isn't out of the question, but as a minimum, third looks increasingly to be his. Paul Donkin (DPR Motorsport) is his only real rival for this, but the County Durham driver has not had luck on his side,

DNF'ing the opening races in both last two weekends, resulting in a back-of -the-grid start for race two. However, this does make the fifth and fourth he scored at Croft, then two fourth place finishes at Zandvoort, look all the more impressive. Third time lucky here at Oulton perhaps, in which case, the red #24 car should be mixing it at the front and is a viable contender for a second win this year.

Fifth overall in the Am championship and leading the Am class with room to spare is father of leading driver, Matt, Justin Armstrong (Team Parker Racing).

Another strong performance at Zandvoort, resulting in a best finish of fifth, makes the 53 year-old a factor in the battle for the overall lead of this weekend's racing, though the return of last year's Am Class champion, Carl Jones, could make for a tantalising battle for the Am podium.

Jones still holds the record for oldest ever Caterham race winner; back in 2021, winning at Brands Hatch in a Seven 270R at the age of 59 years and 7 months.

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close

YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(Double Waved) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit



YELLOW/RED STRIPES Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL
