This event will run under the new 2025 National Competition Regulations. Competitors are reminded to acquaint themselves of the new format and content of the NCRs.

1.0 - COMPETITOR INFORMATION:

1.2 - PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:

Please see the paddock plan in Section 5. It is important that teams only park in their designated area. Any competitor/team that parks in an area that is not assigned for them and refuses to move when asked by an official will be reported to the Clerk of the Course for penalty up to disqualification.

To ensure that space is used for racing activities, all competitor trailers are to be parked in the FOM Compound as marked on the paddock plan in Section 5.

All non-essential vehicles and competitors' private vehicles are to be parked in the private car park next to the Hilton Hotel outside of the circuit. Access to the paddock is via the bridge over the start/finish straight into the wing complex as marked on the Private Parking (Hilton Hotel) & Paddock Access map in Section 5.2.

Paul Abbot is helping with the paddock management; he can be contacted on 07919 427 458. He will be onsite from Friday afternoon until Saturday afternoon.

Paddock access for competitors testing on Friday will be from 05:00hrs on Friday morning. For the avoidance of doubt, testing is not a BARC activity and access to the paddock is controlled exclusively by Silverstone on Friday. Teams that are not testing but are racing on Saturday will be allowed access to the paddock from 19:00hrs on Friday.

For anyone who has not booked Friday testing, this can be booked via the <u>Silverstone Testing Website</u> whilst spaces are still available. It is advised if you are booking garage space for the Friday testing, you book in the garages you are in for the race event.

The paddock area should be vacated no later than 21:00hrs after the event finishes on Sunday.

Garages have been allocated as follows:

- Garages 4 7 MINI Challenge Clubsport
- Garages 8 25 CTCRC (All Classes)
- Garages 26 40 Caterham (7UK & Teams)
- Garages 41 Pit Lane Cut Through

It is forbidden for personnel to climb on the pit wall and/or debris fences at any time. Any action by a competitor or team breaching this instruction will be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

Competitors should be aware all paddock areas are a working environment, and as such the playing of ball games is prohibited. Competitors should also be aware of their responsibilities to members of their team / family who are under the age of 16.

Competitors should note that the use of electric scooters is prohibited in all areas of the venue. Anyone found using these may be removed from the venue.

When travelling competitors, marshals and officials should think of the environmental footprint, and particularly their carbon footprint. Vehicles should not be left idling and those with lower emissions should be the preference.

1.3 - PASSES:

Personnel Passes will be sent to you via the <u>Silverstone App</u> directly. <u>Click Here</u> for more information via Silverstone website.

2025 BARC Vehicle Passes (Green) will be required for this event, please ensure your pass is stuck in your support vehicle's windscreen. Without this pass, your support vehicle will not be given access to the paddock.

1.4 - SIGNING-ON:

All Competitors will not sign-on at the event having previously completed signing on electronically using the **BARC Alpha Sign on System**.

Drivers who wish to have their upgrade card signed should bring them to race admin on the morning of the event. They can then be collected 30 minutes after the respective race has concluded.

Upgrade cards must be valid bearing a recent photograph and be signed by the driver. Cards without a photograph will not be signed for upgrade purposes.

1.5 - ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION:

Engines must not be run before 08:45hrs or after 18:00hrs. Noise checks will take place for all categories prior, on Saturday as follows:

1.6 - SCRUTINEERING & ELIGIBILITY:

In accordance with NCR Ch.12 App.4 Art.4, Scrutineering will happen as follows:

Vertex Caterham 310R Championship, Burty Pre-03 Touring Cars, Racing Fords Blue Oval Saloons & Super Tourer Challenge: All vehicles and racewear will be examined at the times indicated in the table below. These times are also included in the timetable in Section 4.

All Other Championships: You are not required to present your vehicle/driver PPE to the scrutineers unless you fall under any of the following 3 conditions:

- 1) At every event, all vehicles that have not raced with BARC previously in 2025 will be scrutineered
- 2) At every event, any vehicles that required remedial work since its last event must be scrutineered
- 3) At every event, any driver PPE not previously scrutineered (new or changed) must be scrutineered

If required, please present your vehicle and/or PPE equipment at the times prescribed. The Chief Scrutineer holds the right under NCR Ch.6 App.1 Art.2.2 to demand any random/ specific vehicle be scrutineered at any time during the

event. Competitors who are not required to present a vehicle at this event are reminded that NCR Ch.6 App.1 Art.1.1(a-e) still apply even if no vehicle/PPE is required for presentation.

Video equipment may be fitted to a vehicle provided it is not intended to be used for commercial purposes. Any video equipment intended to be used whilst a vehicle is on track, must be fitted to that vehicle at the time that the vehicle is presented for scrutineering. Failure to do so may mean that the camera is removed.

The fitting of video cameras to helmets is strictly forbidden. The only exception is for FIA approved helmets with cameras specifically mounted in them. The Chief Scrutineers shall have the sole authority to accept or reject a helmet.

Competitors, please note that as per NCR Ch.12 App.4 Art.4.17, mobile phone or tablet devices are prohibited from being carried in the competing vehicle whilst on circuit. Anyone observed acting contrary to this rule may be subject to judicial action by the Clerk of the Course.

1.8 - CIRCUIT ACCESS/EGRESS:

CTCRC Super Tourers / Pre 93 / Pre 03: Super Tourers will assemble in the pit lane, and all Pre 93 & Pre 03 vehicles will assemble in the assembly area. For all practice, qualifying & races, Super Tourers will be release from the pitlane onto the circuit with the Pre 93 / Pre 03 released from the assembly area onto the circuit afterwards. For both race sessions, vehicles be released onto the circuit in grid order.

All other Championships: All sessions will start from the assembly area. For practice/qualifying, vehicles will be released from the assembly area directly onto the circuit at the start of their session. For race sessions, vehicles will assemble in the assembly area and be released onto the circuit in grid order.

At the end of each practice/qualifying or race session, vehicles will take the chequered flag, complete a slowing down lap, and leave the circuit via the pitlane and into Parc Fermé in the Scrutineering Bay (Garages 1-2).

NB: Competitors can access the race paddock by driving out the back of your garage or by driving down the slow lane in the pitlane and through Garage 41 into the paddock area. Please take notice of other pitlane users whilst going to assembly area if you are driving slowly down the pitlane. Please always leave the rear of Garage 41 clear.

Dutch Barn Vodka Caterham Seven Championship UK will qualify in their session. The number of cars to go through to SuperPole will be communicated at the Drivers' Briefing and/or via the Caterham Motorsport App.

Follow the instructions of officials as to where you are required to Parc Fermé. Competitors are reminded that they are under Parc Fermé conditions from the moment that they take the chequered flag.

1.9 - MAXIMUM STARTERS:

The maximum starters for each Championship will be:

- 38 Racing & Sports Cars up to 2000cc (All Caterham Championship)

Rolling Starts – BOSS / Classic Thunder / Historic Thunder: Vehicles will assemble in the assembly area before being released onto the circuit to complete a lap to form up on the grid. Once the 'countdown' has finished, vehicles will then undertake their green flag lap behind the safety car prior to a rolling start.

Rolling Starts – Super Tourers / Pre 93 / Pre 03: Super Tourers will assemble in the pit lane, and all Pre 93 & Pre 03 vehicles will assemble in the assembly area before being released onto the circuit to complete a lap to form up on the grid. Once the 'countdown' has finished, vehicles will then undertake their green flag lap behind the safety car prior to a rolling start.

Standing Start: Vehicles will assemble in the assembly area before being released onto the circuit to complete a lap to form up on the grid. Once the 'countdown' has finished, vehicles will then undertake their green flag lap. Once vehicles are formed up on the grid, they will be given the signal to start the race.

All classes must undertake the green flag lap at an appropriate speed. The Organisers reserve the right to commence the race clock 3 minutes after the start of the green flag lap if competitors travel unnecessarily slowly.

1.11 - RESULTS & NOTICE BOARD:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial and technical actions.

1.12 - PODIUM/PRESENTATIONS:

The overall top 3 finishers only in the results of each race will be stopped in parc fermé in front of the 1st/2nd/3rd boards to be presented with winners' caps & bottles. You will also be interviewed for the live stream and the circuit commentary.

1.13 - CIRCUIT & EVENT NOTES:

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track.

Pitlane Speed Limit:

60kph/37.2mph from the pit entry control until the pit-exit control line.

The circuit fuel station (Heritage Pits) will be open during the event. Fuel can be purchased using a credit card on the self-service system.

Food will be available in the Hall 5 Restaurant on both days from 07:30hrs – 15:00hrs. Entry access to Hall 5 is next to Garage 1.

1.14 - LIGHT PANELS AND SIGNALLING:

At venues where light panels are operational, these light signals will take priority and may be supplemented with flags. For reasons of safety, in case of conflicting signals between the light panels and any flags displayed by marshals, drivers must comply with the requirements of the signal with the highest level of safety.

In order of precedence: Red Signal, Double Yellow Signal, Single Yellow Signal, Safety Car Signal, Green Signal.

Please see the light panel guide in Section 5.2 and light panel location map in Section 5.3 of these final instructions for a diagram of the different light panels that will be used and their location on the circuit.

For the rules regarding light panels & signalling, see NCR Ch.12 App.8 Art.1.

1.15 - TRACK LIMITS:

In qualifying sessions: Any breach of NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.6b as reported under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10a or under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10b will be penalised by the penalty prescribed in NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.11a.

In a Sprint race session: Any breach of NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.6b as reported under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10a or under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10b will be penalised by the penalties prescribed in NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.11b.

In an Endurance race session: Any breach of NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.6b as reported under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10a or under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10b will be penalised by the penalties prescribed in NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.11.1.

Should the number of breaches or the timing of the receipt of the Judge of Fact reports in race control, prevent the above procedure from being implemented, the Clerk of the Course or the Stewards (where they are the designated authority to impose such a penalty), may, at their discretion and after the race, impose a post-race penalty.

1.16 - SAFETY CAR:

The Safety Car will be utilised in accordance with NCR Ch.12 App.8 Art.2 for all races.

1.17 - TIMING OF DECISIONS:

If the Clerk of the Course holds a formal inquiry into an incident and subsequently issues a formal decision to a competitor, the decision will be issued in writing either in the hearing, by electronic notification or posted on the Official Noticeboard. The Appeal period, where applicable, begins whichever is the earliest time of issue. NCR Ch.2 App.3 Art.1.16 & Ch.2, App.4, Art.1.16 applies.

1.18 - TRANSPONDER HIRE:

If you need to hire a transponder for this event, you must do so by the Wednesday prior to the event. This can be done by visiting the TSL-Timing shop:

3.1 - LIVE SNATCH:

There is the option to carry out a "Live Snatch." These will be positioned to cover Becketts & Stowe corners.

3.2 - RED SIGNALS:

Should any session be stopped or suspended by the display of a red signal, the Clerk of the Course will use all reasonable endeavours to resume the session as soon as possible and for the remaining duration.

However, the Clerk of the Course reserves the right to cancel the remainder of the session, or to place it (or as much as can reasonably be run), toward the end of the overall event schedule, subject to time being available.

3.3 - JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this event remain unaltered except that paperwork will be dealt with electronically.

Any protest or appeal must to be lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting in the administration office or the Clerk of the Course by email.

3.6 - SOCIAL MEDIA:

Both officials and competitors are reminded that they should not make comments upon social media sites which may in any way be deemed derogatory, defamatory, obscene, or libellous. You should remember that comments made are in a public arena and can be seen by more than your intended audience. Please read the BARC Social Media Guidelines (v3.0 Feb 2025).

3.7 - SAFEGUARDING:

Several officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention. Issues can be raised by contacting the senior clerk of the course at an event or contacting a safeguarding officer whose details can be found within the <u>BARC Safeguarding Guidelines (v12.0 Feb 2025)</u>.

3.8 – LIVE STREAM:

This event will be live streamed on the **BARC YouTube channel** & the **BARC Facebook page**.

3.9 - GENERAL HEALTH & SAFETY:

Championship Co-ordinators and representatives are asked to visually check garages and working spaces for the following:

- 1) Fuel is stored in suitable containers sealed with lids away from sources of ignition;
- 2) Each competition car has one suitable fire extinguisher stored in a usable location (i.e., not in race transporter) and is both tested and in-date;
- 3) Floor/ground is kept clean & tidy;

- 4) Waste is disposed of in identified bins & containers provided by the circuit. Waste must not be mixed or waste left around the site. If the BARC are charged for such issues, then the charge will be passed on to the championship concerned if the individual cannot be identified.
- 5) Old tyres must be taken away by teams/competitors unless the championship has arrangements with the tyre company (there will be waste disposal charge levied to the championship for any items which are controlled/hazardous that BARC and or Circuit must dispose of);
- 6) No trailing electrical cables that can cause electric shock or tripping hazard.
- 7) Waste/grey water from motorhomes must be disposed of in line with circuit requirements.
- 8) Work at height without harnesses and fall restraints is not permitted.
- 9) The use of BBQs in the Pit Garages is strictly forbidden.

3.10 - SPECTATORS & CHILDREN:

Competitor tickets and public tickets will grant access to the paddock. Additional accompanied children under 16 years of age will be admitted free of charge but they will each require a ticket available for free via the <u>Silverstone</u> <u>Ticket Website</u>.

3.11 - NON-COMPETITION VEHICLE SAFETY:

Entrants, Teams, and Competitors must ensure that all vehicles are used in accordance with manufactures' instructions and under no circumstances should anyone be allowed to ride or hang on to buggies, tyre trolleys, roll bars, side pods and the like.

- 3.11.1 A maximum 20 mph speed limit will be in force in all public areas except in the paddocks where it is 5 mph.
- 3.11.2 The use of pedal cycles and the like are strongly discouraged, particularly when ridden by children. All children should be always under the supervision of a responsible adult to try to ensure their safety.
- 3.11.3 The use of e-scooters is strictly forbidden.

3.12 - SILVERSTONE CIRCUIT VENUE SITE INTRODUCTION VIDEO:

If you are working within the venue on Thursday 2nd October or Friday 3rd October, you will be required to provide 'site access accreditation' which can be obtained by completing the <u>SCL Introduction Video</u> which can be viewed by <u>Clicking Here</u>. Your 'site access accreditation' will be emailed directly to you on completion of the introduction video.

This is specifically about 'out of permit' event build and derigging and is not specific to any motorsport actions like marshalling, driving on track etc. All health and safety matters, and governance regarding trackside activities and in permitted areas is cover by Motorsport UK and the NCRs.

3.13 - SAFETY BULLETIN:







2025 SAFETY BULLETIN

This safety bulletin supports the BARC 2025 Health and Safety Guidance, Supplementary Regulations and Final Instructions

1. VEHICLES, SCOOTERS, BUGGIES & QUADS

- The use of quad bikes and buggies must be covered by 3rd party insurance when driven within the confines of the venue.
- No mini-bikes, scooters or 2-wheeled transport allowed.
- Observe venue speed limit at all times.
- · Absolutely NO electric stand-on scooters.







2. SAFE BUGGY & QUAD USE

- · Only drive if you hold a valid licence
- Do not leave keys in ignition
- Observe maximum speed limits at all times
- Observe one-way systems at all times
- · No carrying of unsecured loads
- No riding on equipment trolleys
- All passengers must be seated



3. WORKING AT HEIGHT - ESPECIALLY ON TRAILOR UNIT:

NEVER STAND ON A ROOF WITHOUT PROTECTION FROM FALLING

- · Put up secure side barriers
- Use clipped on full safety harness
- Use a secured ladder / steps
- All ladders must be "footed"
- Only use ladders and steps to EN 131
- Ensure equipment is not damaged





4. SPECTATING

- Do not spectate from tail lifts / trailer roofs
- Only spectate from truck roofs if appropriate safe access and barriers are in place.
- . Do not climb on / spectate from venue infrastructure e.g. waste bins, fencing or generators



5. HOT WORKS AND FUEL

- · Keep fuel storage to a minimum and in a safe location
- Keep extinguisher suitable for fuel fire close by
- · Comply with all refuelling regulations
- Refuel when engine is turned off and cooled
- Keep fuel away from ignition sources





6. CABLES AND TAIL-LIFTS

- · Securely cover hoses and cables.
- Tail lifts should not be left unattended at halfway point.
- Consider using "Tensabarriers" to avoid pedestrians walking under lifts
- · Use harnesses or guardrails where possible or appropriate






Trailer Compound: Trailer Parking is in the FOM TV Compound, please turn left at the roundabout and drive through the gates into the fenced compound.





5.1 - CIRCUIT & VENUE MAP:









All vehicles are to follow the green arrows from either direction to access the venue via the 'South' entrance, this is just off the Dadford Road roundabout. There will be security staff on this entrance gate checking for vehicle passes & tickets.

- If your vehicle **does have** a green or red 2025 BARC paddock pass, please follow the blue arrows to the access road around the bottom of the circuit, go over the 'Hangar Straight' bridge next to the Porsche Centre and into the paddock from the access road.
- If your vehicle **does not have** a 2025 BARC paddock pass, please follow the yellow arrows and park in the specific car park marked on the map above.
