CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

All championships are organised and administered by the British Automobile Racing Club (BARC) in accordance with the General Championship Prescriptions of Motorsport UK and these Championship Regulations unless otherwise stated. The organisers reserve the right to issue additional statements clarifying items in the rules and regulations and all such statements will be issued to all registered drivers by posting to the address details on the registration form.



We race into the darkness for our season finale, and with a maximum 60 points on offer for the double-header, it could be that the title remains in the balance right up to the flag falling on Saturday evening.

Currently, Cup Class protagonists Asha Silva and Bobby Trundley top the table in the Team BRIT BMW240i, 11 points ahead of the Challenge Class Amspeed Porsche 991 of Dom Malone and Adam Smalley, with Jamie and Christopher Hayes Seat, again in Cup Class, 20 points further adrift, but when a "dropped score" is considered, the Hayes' have less to lose, and the Team BRIT pair the most, plus the Amspeed duo, dominant of late, face the return of earlier race winners Johnny Mowlem and Bon Grimes in the FF Corse Ferrari 458, who could reinvigorate the Challenge order, and act in a king-making role.

Nothing is assured in the classes either, except for TCR, where Fynn Jones and Rob Ellick, in the TSR Cupra, are pretty much assured of the class crown, and in Challenge, where Malone/Smalley can't be beaten now. In the GT category, Martin Addison has been strong in his new Aston Martin, and could

take the fight to the Raceworks Ginetta G55 of Chris Bingham and Michael Lyons , while in Trophy, Chris Murphy's BMW E36, heads Woodrow stablemate Calum Bates' E46 by just 17 points once dropped scores are considered, both benefitting from the team's ace strategies.

Maurizio Sciglio and Marco Anastasia are top scorers in the Ginetta Class, but Datum stablemate Nick Casey can't be discounted, and Dave May/Mark Skeats, on a roll of late, could sneak the runner-up spot.

As always, the end-of-season bonanza attracts Invitation entries, not scoring points but claiming race positions – four Ginettas across various classes (two from Innovation Racing, plus Hills, Project 297), Richard Wheeler's Fox Motorsport McLaren, and in a points-scoring Challenge-class BMW, sharing with Mark Smith, veteran BTCC star Karl Jones. Night time will be right time for racing thrills!

There are still two drivers in the hunt for honours; Nathan Williams, debutant this year who has made an incredible statement in his inaugural car racing season, and Adam Jones, returnee to the Coupe Cup this year.

These two may not have it all their own way however; Ben Wilkinson broke the mould for the season with a fabulous win at Donington Park earlier in the season, and with rookie Hazem Zaki also fighting for the win in that race, the victories this weekend really are up for debate.

Brands Hatch has been a mainstay on the Coupe Cup calendar, and has seen many dramatic moments over the years – we do not think this weekend will differ much.

A healthy entry list for the final rounds of the season sees new faces to the Series; Jason Jesse makes his Coupe Cup debut with DCS Motorsport's hire car, while Bradley Trevett jumps into the Cursley Motorsport S3 hire car for his first race in the Series

We have David Wheadon returning to the grid after not getting his chance to drive at Donington; Paul Lawrie was involved in an incident which left his car heavily damaged, so David did not get his turn.

He will be looking to put that right this weekend. Kevin Sandord also returns to the grid after a hiatus.

So it should be a great weekend - let's see who comes out on top in the final two rounds of the Coupe Cup season!

Having already brought the curtain down on its main 2025 season at the Home of British Motor Racing, Silverstone, back in early October, a number of tin top competitors are poised to hit the track for one final time this year here in Kent.

Getting those last competitive miles in before the off-season arrives, Saturday's two races has attracted a bumper entry list that encompasses all of the series' different classes.

The Pre-66 Touring Cars will see Steven Dunne battling for honours while the trio CTCRC Chairman Stuart Caie, former Blue Oval Saloon champion James Dunkley and David Thomas represent the Pre-83 contingent.

lan Bower - who enjoyed a stellar 2025 by winning both the Pre-93 and Classic Thunder titles - will look to sign off the season in style. He's back behind the wheel of his BMW and gunning for more silverware.

Another newly crowned champion in the shape of David Cave features among the Pre-03 runners. Also in action there will be John Hillyer, James Wade, Chris Brown and Connor Lawson.

BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(**Double Waved**) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit



YELLOW/RED STRIPES Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
