Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s)

Ch.2 App.1, Art.1.14, Ch.12 App.8 Art.1.7.p, Safety Car Infringement, Ch.12 App.8 Art.2.6 - Failure to comply with signals during safety car period

Brief Details:

It was reported via a Post Chief Report that Car 3 overtook several cars under Safety Car conditions. That Safety Car had not yet been deployed on track, but the light signals and boards were shown. The other cars around slowed down having seen the yellow light signals at turn 1 (Redgate) but Car 3 after this point overtook 2 cars (Car 96 & Car 25) before slowing down. After interviewing Car 3, he claimed to not have seen the first signal due to it being blocked by the car in front. It should be noted that Car 3 attempted to give the places back when he realised his error, but was unable to do so successfully.

Evidence Relied Upon:

Marshal Post chief report, Circuit CCTV, Onboard from Car 3 and Car 96

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5A App.5 Art.2.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Be penalised by the addition of 2 positions to your race finishing position (Ch.2, Ann. A, Art. 1.3)
Number of Licence Penalty Points: **3**

You are reminded of your right of appeal.

Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with NCR Ch.2 App.12 Art.1.1 (2.12.1.1).
