TCR UK RACES INTO CROFT FOR SECOND EVENT OF THE SEASON

Welcome to the 2026 TCR UK Touring Car Championship. It's a pleasure to have you join us trackside as we embark on our continue our latest season of competition, heading to Croft in North Yorkshire for rounds four and five.

We've already been treated to an exciting start to the season with the opening three races of the year at Brands Hatch last month seeing three different winners: Jac Constable, Jenson O'Neill-Going and Callum Newsham taking the spoils.

With one of the strongest grids in talent that TCR UK has seen for several years, its record breaking Jenson O'Neill-Going who leads the points standings, as both the youngest ever TCR UK race winner and the youngest winner of a Touring Race in the UK.

2026 runner up Callum Newsham is nine points behind the youngster having shown the pace that he has with pole position and the race three win from Brands Hatch.

A race winning return for Jac Constable puts him in third place in the standings,

ahead of Brad Hutchison in the Capture Motorsport by MPHR CUPRA Leon VZ TCR who has his first trip to home turf with the top step in mind.

Completing the top five is TCR Superstar Max Hart who endured a difficult start to his campaign, with race wins on his job list this weekend.

Elsewhere, other drivers to keep an eye on include rapid youngster Max Hall, former double champion Carl Boardley, Rob McGovern, Harry Bloor and Jenson Mason.

Other leading lights that will be hoping to make their mark at Croft is Rick Kerry, Jeff Alden, Barry-John McHenry, Mark Smith and Luke Allen.

ROADSPORT CONTENDERS REVVED UP FOR CROFT CRACKER

The Bilstein Caterham Roadsport Championship returns to action this weekend and if last month's season-opener is anything to go by, Croft is set to play host to some incredible wheel-to-wheel battles and close finishes.

Effectively year two of the Caterham Academy Championship, the Roadsport category is the second step on the Caterham Motorsport and as such, much of this year's grid know each other well having competed against each other last year.

Simple developments to the car - including track-focused Nova ZS tyres and a rear anti-roll bar - offers driver progression in what is relatively similar machinery to that of last year; all while now in a double-header race format.

Cadwell Park provided the setting for the opening round of the season a few weeks ago and it was Richard Davies that reigned supreme as he charged to a pair of commanding race wins.

He will undoubtedly be the driver to beat in North Yorkshire however Kyle Townend will be worth keeping an eye on, having been his nearest challenger and snaring a brace of second place finishes.

Matt Fox has turned plenty of heads since he started his Caterham journey and he, along with the trio of Mitchell Fasanya, Oliver Smith and John Bond, will no doubt be in that lead gaggle of cars that are contending for outright honours.

Further down the grid expect Rob Hicks to star while Richard Northridge, Steven Vischer and Richard Watson also tallied top ten finishes last time out.

Other drivers that will look to rally some momentum includes James French, Ben Oliver, Georgie Tuffin, Sam Emission, Luke Wilson and Heinrich Watson-Miller.

Completing the entry list is Jason Spencer, Jo Oliver, Archie Kennedy-Dyson, Mark Hensler and Aleksandr Dobrynin.

The FanDrive Caterham Seven 270R Championship has been a haven for thrilling wheel-to-wheel races down the years and the 2026 edition of the one-make series looks to be no different, especially if the opening rounds at Cadwell Park are anything to go on.

Marking the third rung on the Caterham Motorsport ladder, the series features drivers that have competed in both the Academy and Roadsport, while the addition of a third race and support from professional teams ups the ante further.

The Seven 270R car progresses the Roadsport race car too by switching from road to track suspension, plus the removal of the windscreen and lights to make it look and feel like the racing machine that it is.

Cadwell Park lifted the curtain on the new campaign with Brian Thornton and Paul Oggelsby enjoying a share of the spoils; with Thornton winning twice before Oggelsby opened his account for the season in race three.

Boasting a wealth of experience in Caterham machinery, both drivers are expected to be front-runners throughout the season - and impressively they aren't the only ones either.

Brune van Dyke, Scott Hele and Aaron Oliver have showcased what they're capable of down the years while Oliver White, Sebastian Tholet and Henry Speeks are no strangers to picking up silverware either.

In-keeping with the depth of talent that runs throughout the 270R field, the list of challengers continues with Alistair Morton, Jasmine Shaw, Luciano Caruso, Craig Evans and Andrew Davison.

Also worthy of being thrown into the melting pot of drivers to keep an eye on is Ryan Tholet, Shane Forster, Jimmy Way, Steve Lorriman and Andrew Bailey.

Rounding out the list of drivers that starred at the season opener is James Platt, Christian Bond, Andrew Palmer, Chris Morling, Charles Chapman, Sean Murphy, Gary Cross and Eduardo Pontes.

The Motul Caterham Seven Championship UK has had to wait patiently to commence its 2026 campaign but the long off-season comes to an end this weekend as Croft Circuit provides the setting for the opening three races of the year.

Operating as the only nationally recognised top-tier Caterham racing series in Britain, the championship offers one of the most competitive and exhilarating competitions going; and to keep the playing field level, every car on the grid is identical.

Last season saw a thrilling back-and-forth battle between eventual champion Matt Armstrong and runner-up Harry Senior play out. The two were without doubt the cream of the crop and this season they're back for more.

Donning the mantle of defending champion, Armstrong will look to go back-to-back but he's know full that Senior, who is hoping to

wrestle the crown away from him, will push him to the very end.

Of course they aren't the only two drivers that will be mixing it for wins and podiums. Taylor O'Flanagan has won every Caterham title he's contended - now its just the Seven Championship UK that is needed to complete his collection.

Charlie Lower has shown plenty of pedigree at multiple levels whilst Harry Heaton is expected to be battling for outright honours too.

As can be expected, the depth of talent continues in Caterham's premier class and others to look out for include Dale Head, Chris Fraser, Gary Curtis and Justin Armstrong.

Rounding out the grid for this weekend's triple-header in North Yorkshire is Mark Kendle, Craig Storey, Tom Eden, Chris Welch and Monty Hinde.

JUNIOR SALOON CAR CHAMPIONSHIP

SUBLIME SMITH LEADS THE WAY AS JSCC SPEEDS INTO NORTH YORKSHIRE

The Junior Saloon Car Championship continues to gather momentum at Croft this weekend, with the biggest question being whether anybody can reign in early pace-setter Ollie Smith.

Events at Donington Park and Cadwell Park has seen the competitive one-make series for 14 to 17-year-olds serve up feast of thrills and spills so far; and the expectation is that more are on the way in North Yorkshire.

Having lifted the coveted Rookie Cup title last year, Smith entered his second season as one to watch and so far he has duly lived up to all expectations. Five wins from six races has been the backbone of his early title charge and he arrives at Croft holding a 30-point lead.

Undoubtedly the driver to beat, the talented teenager will be confident of adding to his silverware collection over the course of the weekend; however he will need to be wary of the chasing pack that are snapping at his heels.

Max Scharfegg leads the charge and after scoring a maiden win last time out at

Cadwell Park, he'll be eager to challenge for honours once more. The same can be said for the likes of Jake Wardle, Matthew Swatton and Leon Holly.

Elsewhere, former Scholarship winner Martin Wright has shown plenty of pace and potential so far while there has been very little to separate Timothy Leonard and Zain Kwekha.

The depth in talent amongst this year's grid continues further down the order too with William Omar, Ben Ward, George Allen this year's Scholarship victor Ralphie-Joe Branscombe and Lachlan Homer all more than capable of making their mark at front of the field.

Three races are timetabled for the Junior Saloon Car Championship this weekend and with every point proving crucial in the battle for supremacy, expect door-to-door entertainment from the get-go.

Events have been coming thick and fast for the Track Action Racing Club in recent weeks and this weekend's visit to Croft marks the third meeting of the campaign already.

Organised by the same team behind the Junior Saloon Car Championship, the Track Action category attracts an eclectic mix of machines from front-wheel-drive hot-hatch Renault Clios and Peugeot 206s to rear-wheel-drive Mazda MX5s and Nissan 370Zs.

Running a multitude of different categories including the Deutsche Marques Cup, Tricolore Trophy and the Peugeot 206 GTi Cup; variety is very much the spice of life when it comes to the Track Action contingent.

It should be as no surprise that the grid has a strong representation of French built cars with Noah Checkley, Jake Richardson, Matt Anderson, Paul Rice, Mervyn Beckett and Chris Vann having all contended for honours in Peugeots so far.

Lee Bull meanwhile has been a regular fixture towards the front of the field in his Renault Clio, so expect to see him in the mix once more.

Elsewhere, Marshall Groves showcased his Vauxhall Vectra Challenge to great effect at Cadwell Park by winning both races while Dan Earl has been another Vauxhall combatant - albeit he has been behind the wheel of an Astra.

Recent rounds has also seen Thomas Frankland hustle his Renault 5 GT Turbo while Nick Tasker and Glyn Pocklington have driven their Volkswagen Scirocco and BMW Compact respectively.

Two races feature on the billing this weekend at Croft and it promises to be a feast for the eyes as these popular tin tops do battle once more.

SCOTTISH MINI COOPER CUP

The Scottish Mini Cooper Cup is recognised as one of the best single-make racing series in the UK.

It has been a proving ground for many top drivers including British Touring Car Championship stars Rory Butcher, Aiden Moffat and Chris Smiley.

Close, hard and competitive racing is guaranteed in this championship, which provides an ideal stepping stone for drivers looking to move up the motorsport ladder.

The Race 1 grid is set by qualifying position while Race 2 is the wildcard - drawn by ballot with anywhere between the top 5 and 8 cars reversed. This format has proven to be highly effective in creating action packed and unpredictable races.

Only the 1.6 Mini Cooper 'R50' model built between 2001-2006 are eligible. The championship regulations are designed to ensure that cars are built to the same specification; the cars use identical Yokohama treaded tyres and run the same ECU.

This puts more emphasis on a driver's skill by keeping the cars performance as equal

as possible.

Reigning Champion Chad Little heads the points table with a win and a second place during the season opening race meeting last month at Cadwell Park.

Eight points adrift is Jack Irvine while Scottish C1 Cup convert James Hitchen is a further eight points back in third, James managing to record a runner-up finish during Race 2 at Cadwell Park on his Mini debut in challenging conditions.

In the Newcomers Cup for drivers in their first two seasons of car circuit racing, three drivers are in the mix, with Presley Barrett taking an early lead following a strong performance at Cadwell Park with two class wins.

The annual visit to Croft is a firm favourite amongst the Mini drivers, who will be looking to put on a good show and maximise their points haul this weekend.

FLAG SIGNALS



BLUE

(Steady) Another competitor is close.

(Waved) Another competitor is trying to pass.



YELLOW

(Waved) Danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

(Double Waved) Great danger ahead; no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.



WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.



YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.



GREEN

Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.



RED

Stop Racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by a marshal (at startline and individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.



BLACK/ORANGE DISC

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to the driver; call into pits immediately.



BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

Warning to drivers that his/her behaviour (e.g corner cutting) is suspect and he/she may be black flagged.



BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.



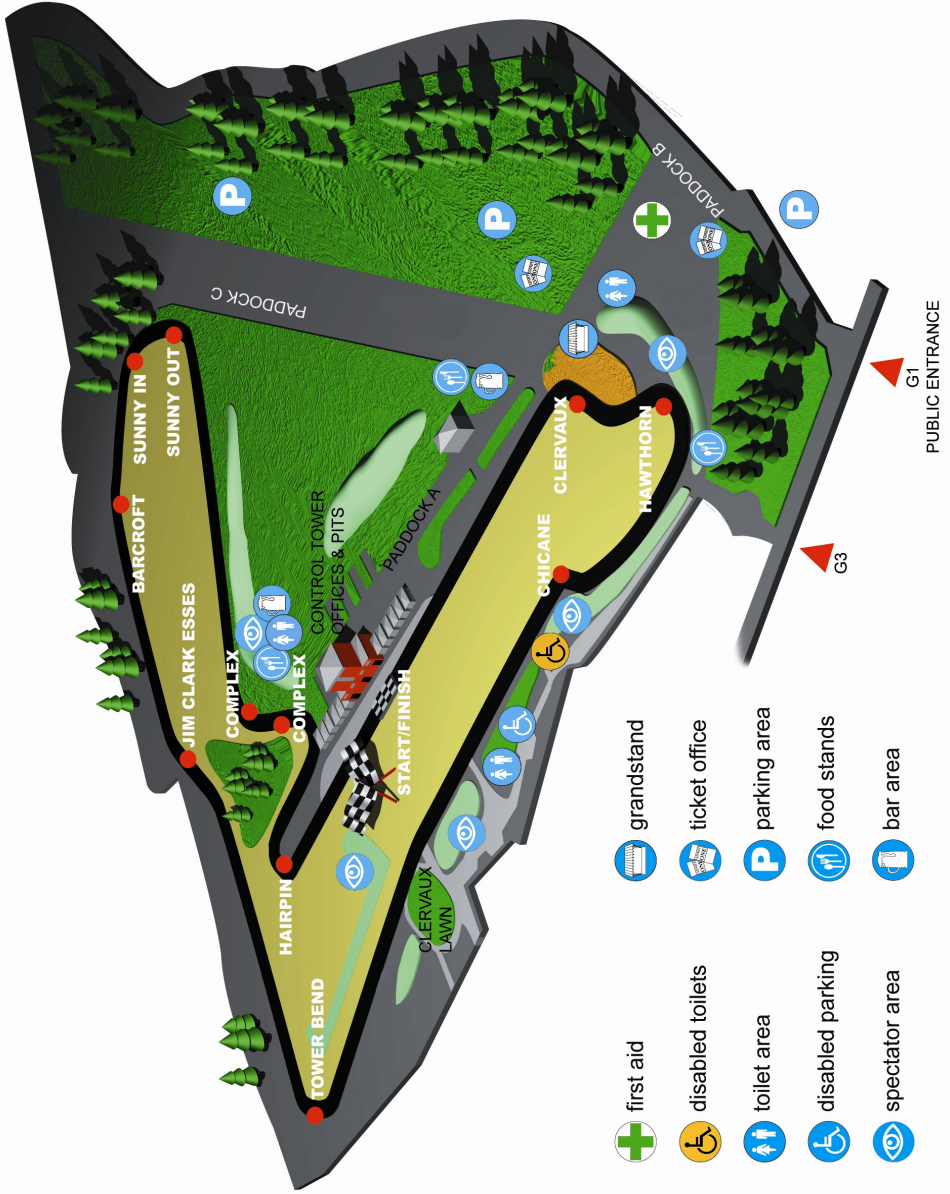
