1.0 - COMPETITOR INFORMATION:

All competitors are required to uphold the standards of the Motorsport UK Race with Respect code – please see the full code of conduct via this link [Race with Respect - Motorsport UK](#)

This event is organised by the BARC governed by the National Competition Rules of the Motorsport UK incorporating the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code, additional Supplementary regulations, and any written instructions that the organisers issue for the event.

1.2 - PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:

Please see the paddock plan in Section 5. It is important that teams only park in their designated area. Any competitor/team that parks in an area that is not assigned for them and refuses to move when asked by an official will be reported to the Clerk of the Course for penalty up to disqualification.

You are advised to arrive at the circuit in good time to allowing time to cross the track between sessions, as there is neither a bridge nor tunnel. This is also valid when exiting the paddock. Please note that when exiting the inner paddock on Sunday, although allowances will be made for vehicles to exit the paddock, keeping the event to timetable will take precedence over vehicles leaving the venue.

Paddock access for competitors testing on Friday will be from 18:00hrs on Thursday. Teams that are not testing but are racing from Saturday onwards will be allowed access to the paddock/garages from 17:00hrs on Friday. For the avoidance of doubt, testing is not a BARC activity and access to the paddock is controlled exclusively by Pembrey Circuit up to 17:00hrs on Friday.

For anyone who has not booked Friday testing, this can be booked via the [Pembrey Testing Website](#) whilst spaces are still available.

The paddock area should be vacated no later than 20:00hrs after the event finishes on Sunday.

Garages have been allocated to the Audi Cup Series. Please contact your co-ordinator directly for garage plan.

Teams using the Pit Garages are reminded that during any on-track session for the BTRC Trucks, all pit lane garage doors must be fully closed (i.e. 100% down). In addition, personnel access to the pit lane is strictly prohibited. It is every teams' responsibility to ensure that persons under the age of 16 years old are not allowed access to the pit lane at any times other than Junior licenced competitors between the ages of 14 – 16 years old who are entered into the meeting.

It is forbidden for personnel to climb on the pit wall and/or debris fences at any time. Any action by a competitor or team breaching this instruction will be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

Competitors should be aware all paddock areas are a working environment, and as such the playing of ball games is prohibited. Competitors should also be aware of their responsibilities to members of their team / family who are under the age of 16.

Competitor Camping will be in the campsite situated in the paddock just past and to the left of the scrutineering bay. This is a grass area; there is no electric hookup. Toilets & Showers are in the paddock area opposite the scrutineering bay. Please see the paddock plan in section 5 for the location of the campsite.

When travelling competitors, marshals and officials should think of the environmental footprint, and particularly their carbon footprint. Vehicles should not be left idling and those with lower emissions should be the preference.

1.3 - PASSES:

Personnel Passes will be sent to you direct via email from BARC/TicketCo.

2026 BARC Vehicle Passes will be required for this event, please ensure your pass is available for inspection when entering the paddock and at any other time during the meeting. Without this pass, your support vehicle will not be given access to the paddock.

1.4 - SIGNING-ON:

There will be no facility for Drivers to register or sign on at the event.

MINI CHALLENGE Trophy Drivers only must sign on electronically prior to the event using the [BARC MINI CHALLENGE Driver Sign on System](#).

MINI CHALLENGE Trophy Entrants only must sign on electronically prior to the event using the [BARC MINI CHALLENGE Entrant Sign on System](#).

All Other Competitors must sign on electronically prior to the event using the [BARC Alpha Sign on System](#).

Drivers who wish to have their upgrade card signed should bring them to race admin on the morning of the event. They can then be collected 30 minutes after the respective race has concluded.

Upgrade cards must be valid bearing a recent photograph and be signed by the driver. Cards without a photograph will not be signed for upgrade purposes.

1.5 - ENGINE/NOISE POLLUTION:

Engines must not be run before 08:45hrs and after 18:15hrs on either day. The noise limit at this event is 105dB (static). Noise checks will take place for all categories at the entrance to the assembly area, prior to qualifying as follows:

- Pickup Truck Racing Championship – 10:45hrs – Assembly Area (105dB)
- Civic Cup Championship – 11:10hrs – Assembly Area (105dB)
- Junior Saloon Car Championship – 11:35hrs – Assembly Area (105dB)

1.6 - SCRUTINEERING & ELIGIBILITY:

In accordance with NCR Ch.12 App.4 Art.4, Scrutineering will happen as follows:

British Truck Racing Championship, Pickup Truck Racing Championship & Junior Saloon Car Championship: All vehicles and racewear will be examined at the times indicated in the table below. These times are also included in the timetable in Section 4.

All Other Classes: You are not required to present your vehicle/driver PPE to the scrutineers unless you fall under any of the following 3 conditions:

- 1) At every event, all vehicles that have not raced with BARC previously in 2026 will be scrutineered

- 2) At **every** event, **any vehicles that required remedial work since its last event** must be scrutineered
- 3) At **every** event, **any driver PPE not previously scrutineered (new or changed)** must be scrutineered

If required, please present your vehicle and/or PPE equipment at the times prescribed. The Chief Scrutineer holds the right under NCR Ch.6 App.1 Art.2.2 to demand any random/ specific vehicle be scrutineered at any time during the event. Competitors who are not required to present a vehicle at this event are reminded that NCR Ch.6 App.1 Art.1.1(a-e) still apply even if no vehicle/PPE is required for presentation.

Video equipment may be fitted to a vehicle provided it is not intended to be used for commercial purposes. Any video equipment intended to be used whilst a vehicle is on track, must be fitted to that vehicle at the time that the vehicle is presented for scrutineering. Failure to do so may mean that the camera is removed.

The fitting of video cameras to helmets is strictly forbidden. The only exception is for FIA approved helmets with cameras specifically mounted in them. The Chief Scrutineers shall have the sole authority to accept or reject a helmet.

Competitors, please note that as per NCR Ch.12 App.4 Art.4.17, mobile phone or tablet devices are prohibited from being carried in the competing vehicle whilst on circuit. Anyone observed acting contrary to this rule may be subject to judicial action by the Clerk of the Course.

1.8 - CIRCUIT ACCESS/EGRESS:

British Truck Racing Championship: All trucks must go to the truck assembly area, enter the circuit via the truck paddock gate and follow the course car into the pit lane. Trucks will then be released from the pit lane in accordance with BTRC Regulation 2.3.3 on to the circuit for qualifying. At the end of qualifying, trucks will take the chequered flag, slow down and enter the pit lane, where they will come under parc fermè conditions. From the pit lane, all trucks will return together in convoy, via pit exit to the paddock gate, proceeding directly to the truck parc fermé area.

For races, once lined up and in accordance with BTRC Regulation 2.4.1, trucks will be released to follow the pace truck to the grid. After each race, trucks will take the chequered flag, slow down and enter the pit lane. All trucks will then via pit exit, proceed directly to the truck parc fermé area via the truck paddock gate into the truck paddock.

Within the paddock area, Banksmen must be used but they are not to be used when the trucks are in convoy.

Pickup Truck Racing Championship: All pickups must go to the truck assembly area, enter the circuit via the truck paddock gate and follow the course car into the pit lane. Pickups will then be released from the pit lane on to the circuit for qualifying. At the end of qualifying, pickups will take the chequered flag, slow down and enter the pit lane, where they will come under parc fermè conditions. From the pit lane, all pickups will return together in convoy, via pit exit to the paddock gate, proceeding directly to the truck parc fermé area.

For races, once lined up, pickups will be released to follow the pace truck to the grid. After each race, pickups will take the chequered flag, slow down and enter the pit lane. All pickups will then via pit exit, proceed directly to the truck parc fermé area via the truck paddock gate into the truck paddock.

All Other Classes: For qualifying, all vehicles will need to go to the assembly area where noise testing will be carried out before being released via the pit lane onto the circuit. Vehicles in the garages are to drive slowly down the pitlane, around the back of race control into the paddock to access assembly area. At the end of all car practice, qualifying and races, cars will exit the circuit via the pit lane, and enter parc fermé.

NB: Audi Cup Series Competitors will need to go to the assembly area prior to 09:00hrs as the pit garage doors need to be closed during the BTRC Qualifying session that precedes the Audi Qualifying session.

Competitors are reminded that they are under Parc Fermé conditions from the moment that they take the chequered flag.

BTRC Trucks – Rolling Start: Trucks will be led from the truck assembly area by the Pace Truck and will form up on the grid. After the countdown, they will undertake their green flag lap behind the Pace Truck prior to a rolling start.

Pickup Truck Racing Championship - Rolling Start: Pickups will be led from the truck assembly area by the Safety Car and will form up on the grid. After the countdown, they will undertake their green flag lap behind the Safety Car prior to a rolling start.

All Standing Starts: Vehicles will assemble in the assembly area; be released to form up on the grid and then undertake their green flag lap. They will form up on the grid again and then start.

All classes must undertake the green flag lap at an appropriate speed. The Organisers reserve the right to commence the race clock 3 minutes after the start of the green flag lap if competitors travel unnecessarily slowly.

1.11 - RESULTS & NOTICE BOARD:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial and technical actions.

1.12 - PODIUM/PRESENTATIONS:

The top 3 finishers only in the results of each race will be stopped in the pit lane in front of the 1st/2nd/3rd boards to be presented with winners' caps & bottles and interviewed on the live stream. All other cars are to proceed to the parc fermé area.

British Truck Racing Championship & Pickup Truck Racing Championship: The drivers who finish in the top 3 in class of each race will remain in the pit lane to be interviewed for the live stream. BTRC & Pickups will present trophies, caps and bottles in the paddock area after parc fermé.

1.13 - CIRCUIT & EVENT NOTES:

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track.

Pitlane Speed Limit:

40kph/24.8mph from the pit entry control line until the pit exit control line.

1.14 - LIGHT PANELS AND SIGNALLING:

At venues where light panels are operational, these light signals will take priority and may be supplemented with flags. For reasons of safety, in case of conflicting signals between the light panels and any flags displayed by marshals, drivers must comply with the requirements of the signal with the highest level of safety.

In order of precedence: Red Signal, Double Yellow Signal, Single Yellow Signal, Safety Car Signal, Green Signal, White Signal, Yellow & Red Signal, & Blue Signal.

Please see the light panel guide in Section 5.2 and light panel location map in Section 5.3 of these final instructions for a diagram of the different light panels that will be used and their location on the circuit.

For the rules regarding light panels & signalling, see NCR Ch.12 App.8 Art.1.

1.15 - TRACK LIMITS:

In qualifying sessions: Any breach of NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.6b as reported under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10a or under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10b will be penalised by the penalty prescribed in NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.11a.

In a Sprint race session: Any breach of NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.6b as reported under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10a or under NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.10b will be penalised by the penalties prescribed in NCR Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.11b.

Should the number of breaches or the timing of the receipt of the Judge of Fact reports in race control, prevent the above procedure from being implemented, the Clerk of the Course or the Stewards (where they are the designated authority to impose such a penalty), may, at their discretion and after the race, impose a post-race penalty.

1.16 - SAFETY CAR:

The Safety Car will be utilised in accordance with NCR Ch.12 App.8 Art.2 for all races.

1.17 - TIMING OF DECISIONS:

If the Clerk of the Course holds a formal inquiry into an incident and subsequently issues a formal decision to a competitor, the decision will be issued in writing either in the hearing, by electronic notification or posted on the Official Noticeboard. The Appeal period, where applicable, begins whichever is the earliest time of issue. NCR Ch.2 App.3 Art.1.16 & Ch.2, App.4, Art.1.16 applies.

1.18 - TRANSPONDER HIRE:

If you need to hire a transponder for this event, you must do so by the Wednesday prior to the event. This can be done by visiting the TSL-Timing shop:

Do not leave it until the race weekend as the timekeepers may not be able to supply you a transponder if you have not pre ordered one. This could lead to you being in breach of NCR Ch.12 App.6 Art.2.2.

Please remember you should not use mobile phones or cameras while on duty unless it is necessary to send a report to Race Control.

2.4 – TRUCK PROCEDURES:

When the BTRC are on circuit the normal marshalling posts are not used. See below for the revised marshalling positions:

POST	MARSHALS POINT	EVACUATION POINT
1	In middle of Hatchets Hairpin	Through gate and position behind safety fence on spectator bank
2	On outside of track	Move to safe location in Paddock 2
3	On inside of track adjacent to Crossing	Behind debris fence further along Senna Esses
4	On outside of track exit of Senna Esses	On top of spectator bank behind post and debris fence
5	On Brooklands Hairpin	Reposition to safety behind Safety Fence to outside of circuit
6	On outside of track	Through gate and safety fence
7	On outside of track	Through gate and safety fence
8	On outside of track at Honda Curve	Move to safe location near brick building
9	On gantry at end of pit lane	Move to Pit Lane in safe location

Please see the map in Section 5.1 which shows where each Truck Evacuation point is situated.

- 1) During Truck practice, qualifying and racing, the pit lane will be evacuated of all personnel, and garage doors will be closed. A minimum number of truck mechanics 'may' be positioned in the pit lane.
- 2) During Truck practice, qualifying and racing the following Marshals Posts will be fully evacuated into spectator areas / banking behind Post: 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, Radios will be allocated to the Post Chiefs.
- 3) During Truck practice, qualifying and racing post 9 to evacuate high gantry and move to a place of safety in pit lane
- 4) In the event of an incident during Truck practice, qualifying or racing, Marshals on remaining posts or on other duties are instructed that under no circumstances are they to attend the incident until such time as the Course Car arrives on the scene, whereupon duties will be directed by the Senior Official in charge. During all non-truck races, Marshals will reassemble on posts as indicated at sign on.

3.0 - GENERAL INFORMATION:

3.1 – LIVE SNATCH:

There is **NO** option to carry out a “Live Snatch” at the event.

3.2 – RED SIGNALS:

Should any session be stopped or suspended by the display of a red signal, the Clerk of the Course will use all reasonable endeavours to resume the session as soon as possible and for the remaining duration.

However, the Clerk of the Course reserves the right to cancel the remainder of the session, or to place it (or as much as can reasonably be run), toward the end of the overall event schedule, subject to time being available.

3.3 – JUDICIAL PROCEDURES:

The judicial procedures for this event remain unaltered except that paperwork will be dealt with electronically.

Any protest or appeal must to be lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting in the administration office or the Clerk of the Course by email.

Once a decision has been made the decision will be issued in writing either in the hearing, by electronic notification or posted on the Official Noticeboard. The Appeal period, where applicable, begins whichever is the earliest time of issue.

3.4 – RACE DAY INFORMATION:

The organisers will use all reasonable endeavours to run the programme as published however reserve the right to bring forward, delay or abandon sessions to suit the conditions.

3.7 – SAFEGUARDING:

Several officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention. Issues can be raised by contacting the senior clerk of the course at an event or contacting a safeguarding officer whose details can be found within the [BARC Safeguarding Guidelines \(v14.0 Feb 2026\)](#).

3.9 – GENERAL HEALTH & SAFETY:

Championship Co-ordinators and representatives are asked to visually check garages and working spaces for the following:

- 1) Fuel is stored in suitable containers sealed with lids away from sources of ignition.
- 2) Each competition car has one suitable fire extinguisher stored in a usable location (i.e., not in race transporter) and is both tested and in-date.
- 3) Floor/ground is kept clean & tidy.
- 4) Waste is disposed of in identified bins & containers provided by the circuit. Waste must not be mixed or waste left around the site. If the BARC are charged for such issues, then the charge will be passed on to the championship concerned if the individual cannot be identified.
- 5) Old tyres must be taken away by teams/competitors unless the championship has arrangements with the tyre company (there will be waste disposal charge levied to the championship for any items which are controlled/hazardous that BARC and or Circuit must dispose of).
- 6) No trailing electrical cables that can cause electric shock or tripping hazard.
- 7) Waste/grey water from motorhomes must be disposed of in line with circuit requirements.
- 8) Work at height without harnesses and fall restraints is not permitted.



9) The use of BBQs in the Pit Garages is strictly forbidden.

3.10 – SPECTATORS & CHILDREN:

Competitor tickets and public tickets will grant access to the paddock. To purchase extra tickets, please go to the [Pembrey Ticket Website](#). Children aged 12 and under get access for free but will need a 'free of charge' u12 ticket which you can get from the [Pembrey Ticket Website](#). Teens tickets(13-15 Years Old) can be bought at a discounted rate via the [Pembrey Ticket Website](#). Anyone aged 16 or over will require an adult ticket.

3.11 – NON-COMPETITION VEHICLE SAFETY:

Entrants, Teams, and Competitors must ensure that all vehicles are used in accordance with manufactures' instructions and under no circumstances should anyone be allowed to ride or hang on to buggies, tyre trolleys, roll bars, side pods and the like.

3.11.1 A maximum 5 mph speed limit will be in force in all public areas including the paddocks.

3.11.2 The use of pedal cycles and the like are strongly discouraged, particularly when ridden by children. All children should be always under the supervision of a responsible adult to try to ensure their safety.

3.11.3 The use of e-scooters is strictly forbidden.

3.12 – WIRES & CABLES:

Competitors must ensure that all trailing cables, hoses and other trip hazards are covered by trip mats at all times. In particular, cables, hoses or wires must not cross access routes unless they are covered by trip mats. Any power cables running from pit garages may only power vehicles immediately in front of the relevant garage, and not any other vehicle(s) outside the immediate vicinity of the pit garage.

3.13 – ROADWAYS & FIRELANES:

Competitors & all team members must ensure that the roadways, fire exits, fire lanes and gates in the paddock area are kept clear at all times. You must ensure that trailing cables, awnings and/or team equipment do not overlap the white lines that mark the roadways or fire lanes. Competitors must use their best efforts to ensure that private cars do not park in working paddock areas. Competitors / team members are always responsible for ensuring that any vehicle parked in any roadway, fire lane or causing congestion in and around the paddock areas or any other nominated areas is moved and parked in a safe place immediately. If any vehicle is found to be in breach of the above, it will be removed immediately in the interests of safety, by towing or otherwise. BARC shall not be liable to any third party in respect of damage to any vehicles or other property caused by the towing or removal of any vehicle or other object from these areas.

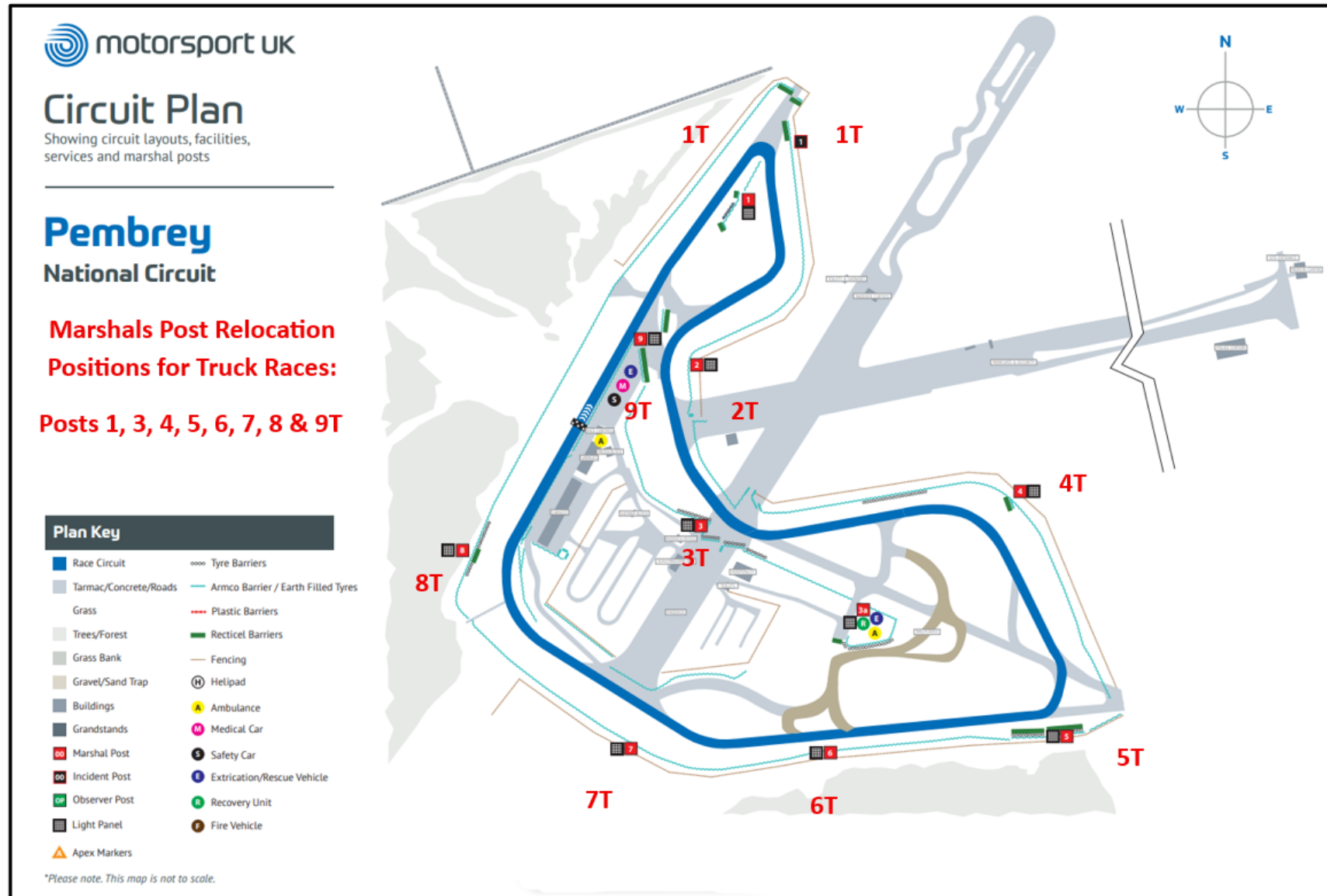

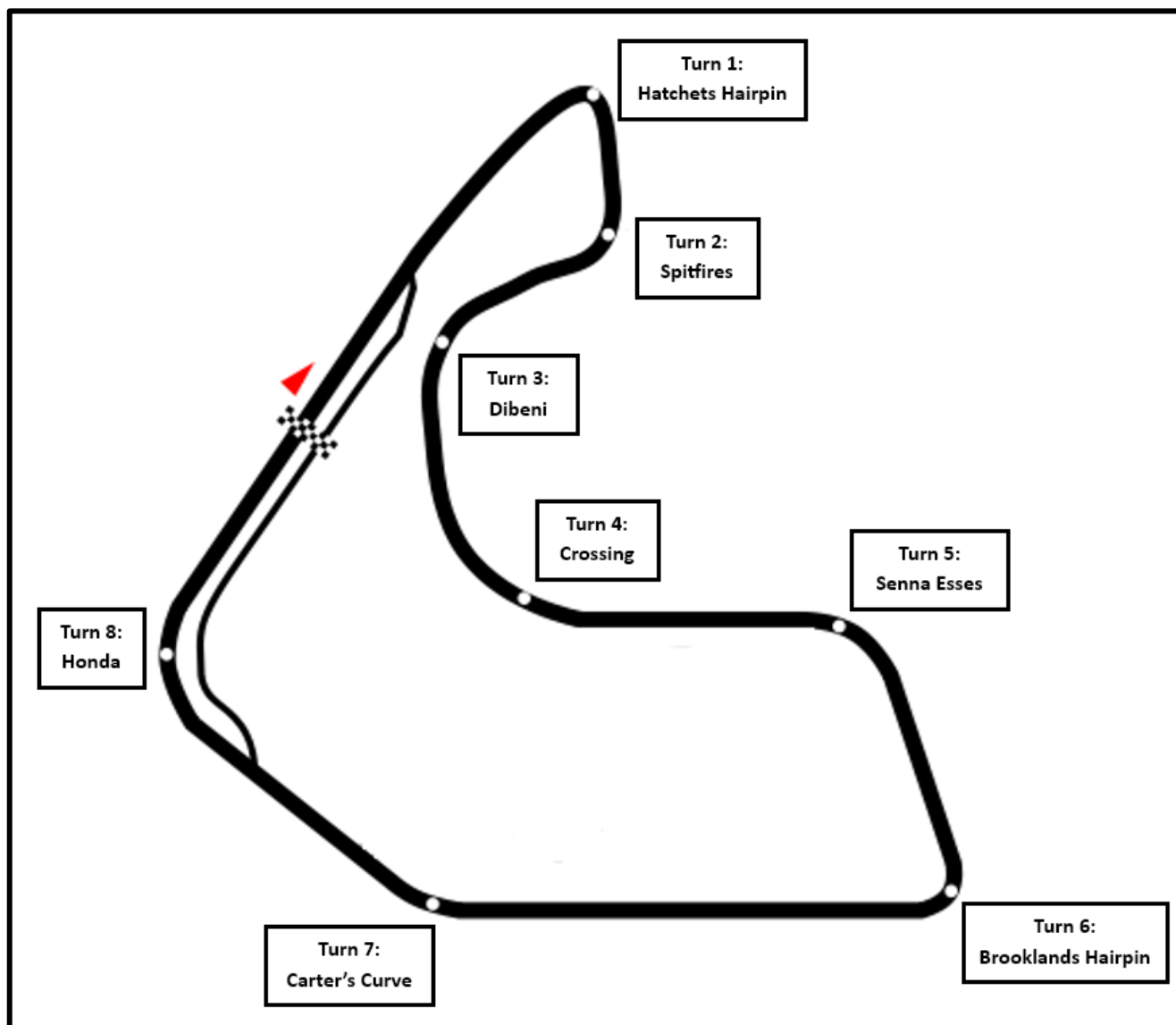


5.1 – CIRCUIT MAPS (TRACK LICENCE):



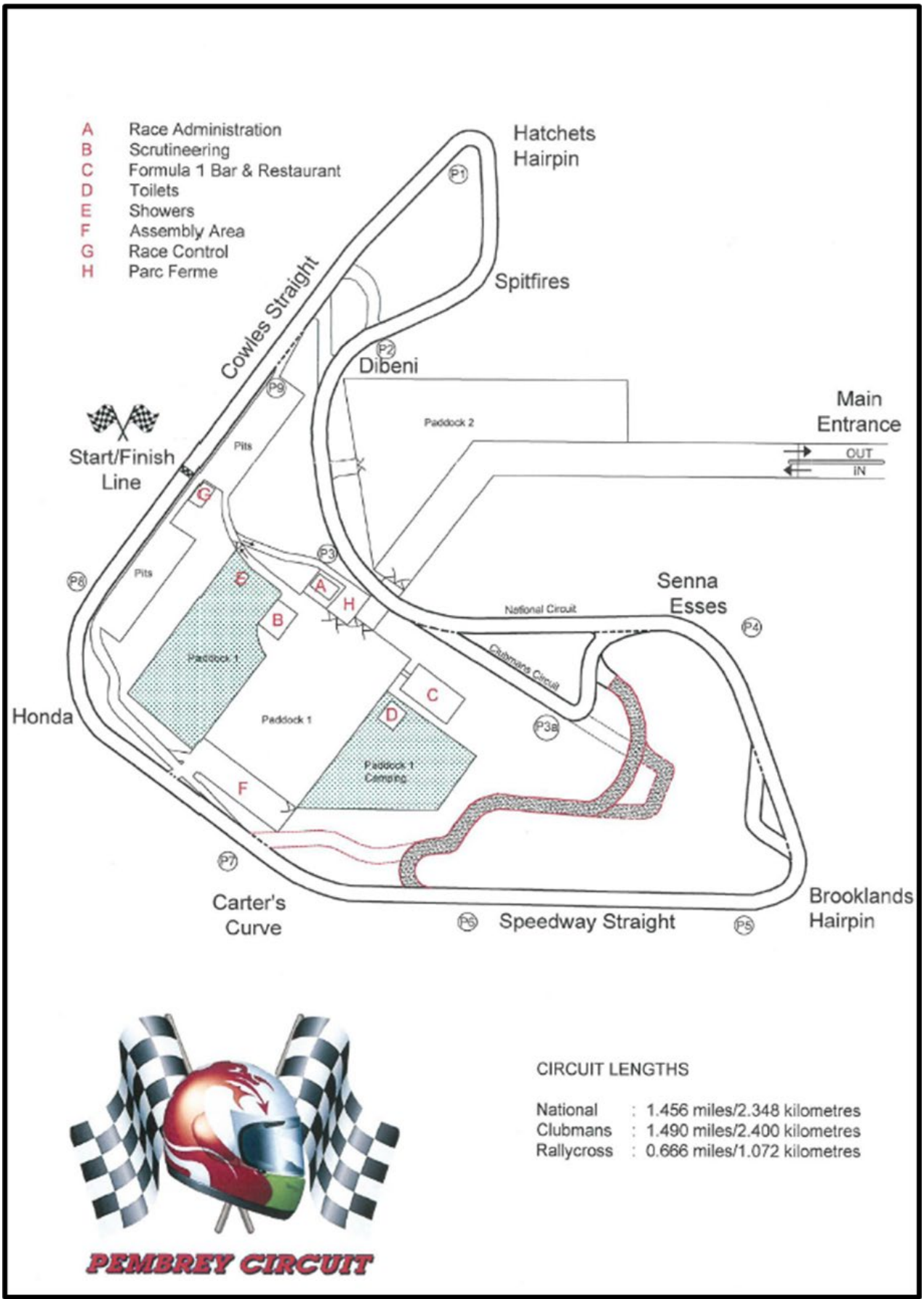


CIRCUIT MAPS (SPECIFIC CORNER NAMES & NUMBERS):
