As the Clerk of the Course, I became aware of an incident and as a result held a hearing to determine if there was any breach of either Championship regulations or the National Competition Rules. I reviewed video evidence which was available from ITV and car 88 and in addition heard from driver Gordon Shedden and team representatives Jack Coker (Laser Tools Racing). Also present in the hearing were Dave White (Clerk of the Course).

As a result of the hearing, I determine the following:

**Car No / Driver** 52 / Gordon Shedden

**Entrant** Laser Tools Racing

**Session** Qualifying race

**Facts** Car 52 weaved after the safety car lights went out

**Offence** CR 3.13.10

**Decision** Under NCR 2.2.2 and CR 4.2, I order that you should be penalised
