Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s)

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 - Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car concerned

Brief Details:

During the start of the Race, Car 11 gets a poor start and Car 41 moves to drivers left to go in between Car 272 (to drivers left) and Car 11 (to drivers right), contact is made between Car 272 and Car 41, with further contact between Car 41 and Car 11 causing Car 41 to half spin and continue.

Car 272 had room to move to the left and give Car 41 more room, which i deem to be the cause for the contact therefore find 272 wholly and predomintley to blame for the contact.

Evidence Relied Upon:

Onboard footage from Car 41, Car 272, Car 93 (evidence car)
Live stream footage

Onboard from Car 11 did not work.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5A App.5 Art.2.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:
